Romney Vows: GOP in White House Won't Yield to Reds

HARTFORD (AP) — Michigan Gov. George Romney vows a Republican White House would not yield to Communist terms in Vietnam.

For Romney, moving forward a bit for nomination to challenge President Johnson at the Democratic convention in 1968, Friday night's speech was a crucial preannouncement.

"It is unthinkable that the United States withdraw from Vietnam," Romney said.

"Our military effort must succeed, I believe that we must use military force as necessary to reduce or cut off the flow of men and supplies from North Vietnam, to knock out enemy main force units, and to provide a military shield for the south."

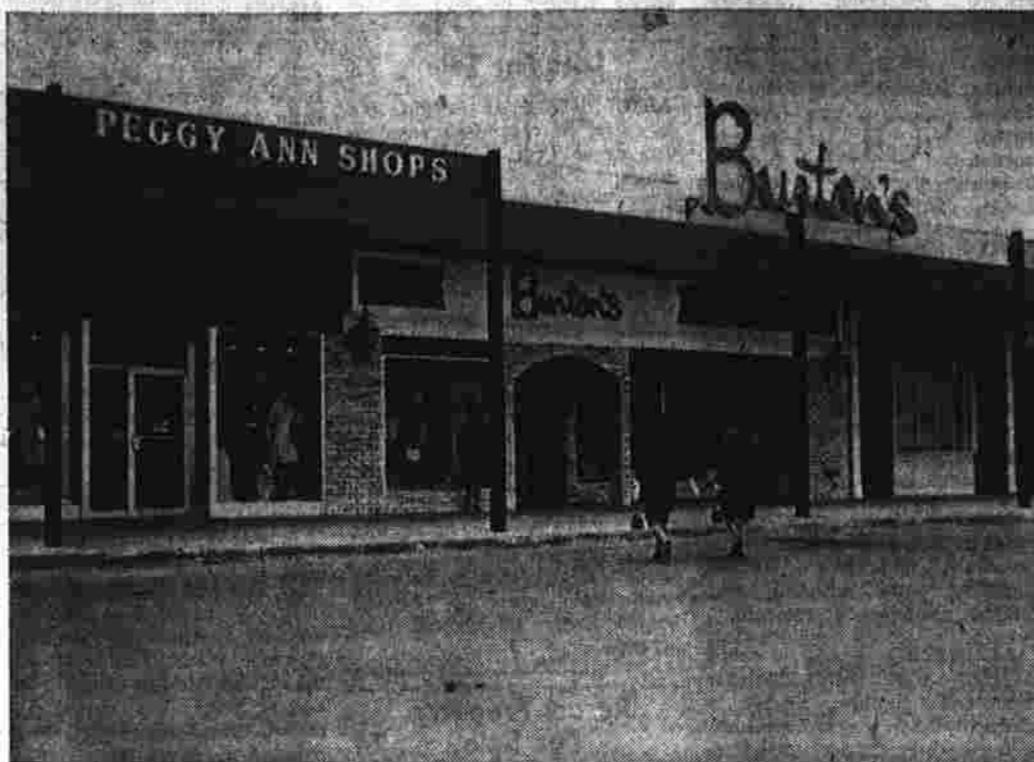

Actress Suzanne Pleshette was then interviewed by hostess Joanna Barnes on her attitudes toward life and success. Miss Pleshette thought women should be a little aggressive, was against equality for the sexes and believed the theory that a woman is washed up at 21 is "an American fallacy."

There was some excited speculation whether Dick and Liz would grace the Oscar awards in person next week. Then Robert Colp came along to plug his television series and to describe the perils of ptomaine encountered by actors working in distant locations.

Ratings Show Tarzan Still a Swinger

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — This television season has proved at least one thing: Tarzan is still a swinger.

The evidence is in the ratings. Although the critics were generally cool to hostile toward the ape man's advent on the home screen, the new series established a solid viewership. The NBC demographers are quick to say the audience is not entirely small fry. They say they can cite samplings that indicate "Tarzan" is the second most popular show with women aged

18-34. Such a record made "Tarzan" a clinch renewal for 1967-68, and not many new series enjoy such a fate.

All this makes a happy man of Sy Weintraub, who has sunk several of his own millions into an investment he says can't pay off until three years hence.

"That's right," said the fast-running producer. "With the cost of television production nowadays, no series can make a profit in the first three years. It's simply impossible, especially with a show like ours, which is the only one shot totally on location."

"But if a show goes four years — then the values are enormous. You can virtually name your own figure."

Weintraub delights in toying with such notions today, but earlier in the series he almost saw the whole venture washed away.

"We were washed out twice in

Brazil," he said. "Our whole location was lost in the worst rain that Brazil had known for 20 years. We rebuilt and six weeks later we were wiped out by the second worst flood in 80 years."

"Not only that. Our sets were carried down the river and ruined a bridge. And now we're being sued because of it."

The producer figures he lost \$80,000 in the double disaster. Deciding the Brazilian location was hexed, he shifted the operation to Mexico City. Production began to move along, but it was tough and go with the network schedule.

"It took us five months to make the first five shows," said Weintraub. "We started getting faster in Mexico, but most of the time we were delivering the finished film just before air time."

The schedule wasn't aided by the bravery of Tarzan XV, Ron Ely, the big athlete from Here-

ford, Tex.

"If anything, Ron has too much courage," remarked Weintraub. "He insists on doing all his own stunts, and that can lead to trouble. He has fractured his ribs and has been bitten by a lion. Once he was out six days when he fell from a vine and separated his shoulder."

"Still, he refuses to use a double. While I admire his bravery, I wish he would be a little more careful."

Perhaps in response to the critical potshots at the jungle hero, Weintraub said he is injecting quality into the show.

"We started with production values of the truly original backgrounds, the animals and other visual aspects," he said. "Now we're striving for more quality in stories and performances. We've been able to attract performers like Helen Hayes, Julie Harris, Maurice Evans, Ethel Merman and Martin Gabel."

'Stage 67' Off and On

NEW YORK (AP) — A one-character drama, "The Human Voice," starring Ingrid Bergman will be the ABC "Stage 67" program May 4, producer Hubbell Robinson said Monday.

Next season, however, the series will have no regular spot in the schedule. Robinson said he is negotiating for various properties, but could not say whether there would be 3 or 16 shows next season.

ABC, now plans to lace its Sunday and Wednesday night movie reruns next season with occasional taped dramatic shows.

On April 20, ABC plans to shift "That Girl," Mario Thomas' comedy series, into a Thursday night spot following "Bewitched" where it will remain through next season. "Love on a Rooftop," which is not renewed, will follow it through summer reruns.

Barbra Streisand will tape a one-hour program in April for presentation on CBS next season.

The Arness Boys Are Happy

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — It was a bad week for the Arness boys.

Last month, Jim Arness' long-running series, "Gunsmoke," was shot down by CBS while it was still enjoying the healthy glow of good ratings. Then his little-6-foot-2-brother Peter Graves learned that his new series, "Call to Danger," had been erased from the fall schedule after having been virtually assured of a position.

But all turned out happily for the Minneapolis brothers—real name: Arness.

CBS had second thoughts about executing "Gunsmoke" and restored it to the schedule—now on Monday night. And the same network hired Graves to replace Steven Hill as star of "Mission: Impossible."

For Peter Graves—he adopted the family name of Graves

early in his career to avoid conflict with his more famous brother—the assignment marks a breakthrough. Although he has made a good living from acting and has starred in three previous television series, he has never quite ascended to the top ranks—until now.

"My first big picture was 'Stalag 17' and it could have made me a star," he recalls. "But the movie business was so rotten at that time—1953—that Paramount couldn't give me the films to follow up."

"Then I had a big break in 'Beyond the 12 Mile Reef' at Fox. Darryl Zanuck said he wanted to star me in films but he was only making one picture the following year."

Graves' career didn't languish. He spent five years making "Fury"—rerun title: "Black

Stallion"—which played on CBS Saturday mornings. It was a good living but didn't make him rich. The horse did much better, having a 5 per cent interest in the series which is now in its 12th rerun.

The actor took his wife and three daughters to live in Australia for a year and a half while he made "Whiplash," which was released in syndication. Then he went to England for a year to film another series, "Court Martial."

"That show went on in ABC's 'third season' last year, and it didn't have a chance," said Graves.

Small wonder that he is happy to be joining "Mission: Impossible." Another advance to his career was his recent co-starring with Doris Day in a comedy Western, "Josie."
