The ancient ports of Lerael are the basis for designs on a set of new Israeli stamps. Scenes of Akko, Caesarea and Yafa appear on the adhesive, reports the Israel Philatelic Agency in New York.

Akko, seen on the 15 agorot, was one of the key harbors linking the Holy Land with other Mediterranean countries in the first century. Caesarea, on the 40 agorot, was the site of the invasion of the conquering Romans and later rebuilt by King Herod in honor of Augustus Caesar. Yafa, appearing on the 20 agorot, is one of the oldest ports in the world, dating back to biblical times when it was the gateway to Jerusalem.

Also issued by Israel is a 40 agorot multicolor stamp commemorating the scholarly "Shulhan Arukh," the traditional code of Jewish law composed by Joseph Caro and printed in 1565.

Canadian Trade To Favor U.S. By \$2 Billion

OTTAWA — For every ton of newspaper Canada sells in Florida at 7 cents a pound, Canada buys a ton of oranges at 11 cents a pound. Over-all, for every \$3 worth of newspaper and other products Canada sells in the United States, Canada buys more than \$5 worth of American goods.

The Federal Department of Trade and Commerce also figures that the U.S. balance-of-payments profit for 1967 on its trade with Canada will be about \$2 billion.

The department estimates that Canada netted about \$817 million from newspaper sales to American newspapers last year.

### Reds Lose 8 Players In Europe Spy Game

LONDON (AP) — Eight men from Communist countries have been ordered out of Western Europe in the past six months, according to a report by the State Department.

Five of them were diplomats or trade officials. Two were representatives of Aeroflot, the Soviet airline. One represented the East German news agency.

At least four of the men are believed to have been involved in spying against bases of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization.

In the same period one West European — a Belgian airline official — was expelled from the Soviet Union.

The first expulsions were announced in Rome and Athens Nov. 2.

The Italian Foreign Ministry ordered the expulsions of the Soviet trade delegation, to leave the country "for acts against the security of the state." The expulsion order said he was engaged in "certain illicit activities."

It was the first time in memory that a Soviet citizen had been expelled from Italy and it came when relations between Italy and the Soviet Union were growing more cordial.

Lemashov's activities were uncovered in Naples, site of NATO's southern European headquarters.

The same day in the Greek capital, a Bulgarian naval attaché was declared persona non grata and told to leave the country. Greek intelligence agents said they caught Col. Zolnar Christanov as he was receiving "certain data from an unnamed Greek citizen near the Greek military command's headquarters."

On Feb. 8, an incident at a roadside eating place prompted Belgian authorities to expel Vladimir Chirvinski, 26, both of Baltimore, command of the Aeroflot office in Brussels. Security police arrested him with a man whose identity was never divulged and held him for a day.

The Soviet government retaliated in March, expelling M. Thomas, the Moscow manager of Belgium's Sabena Airlines. The expulsions were described as "hostile conduct" toward the Soviet Union.

In Turin, three Italians were charged March 22 with spying on NATO military installations in Italy and Spain for the Soviet Union. The Italians were Giorgio Rinaldi, 39, a former European parachute jump champion, his wife Angela, 31, and their chauffeur, Armando Girard.

Rinaldi was reported to have given Italian security men the names of 300 persons working for NATO who were involved in a Communist spy ring. The Italian government and NATO headquarters in Paris denied this, but other sources said the list was being carefully checked in Norway, Belgium, the Netherlands, Austria, the United States, Switzerland, Spain, Cyprus, Greece, France and Morocco.

Immediately after the arrest of the Rinaldis, Yuri Pavlenko, an attaché at the Soviet Embassy in Rome, was ordered out of the country. He was said to have received information through a complicated system of secret post office addresses.

On March 27, the spotlight switched again to Athens, where Albert Zharov, second secretary at the Soviet Embassy, and Igor Odunkov, member of a Soviet trade mission, were declared persona non grata. The Greek Foreign Ministry said they engaged in activities "incompatible with their status" but gave no details. It was generally assumed they were connected with the Rinaldi case.

On April 15, Amsterdam was the scene of confusion when Dutch security agents seized Vladimir A. Glushkov, chief of Dutch operations of Aeroflot. Prosecutor General E. J. Beiler said, "There is reasonable suspicion of guilt in an effort to deliver state secrets to a foreign country." He rejected a Soviet protest against the arrest.

### Combat Surgeon Adds Elephant To His Practice

BANGOR (AP) — Quick doctor, bring your bag. My elephant has been shot.

Such was the message that came to Maj. Charles Lea of Columbia, Mo. The elephant, named Khon, belonged to a mounted tribesman named Hia.

At last report the patient was doing well.

The surgeon treats combat casualties of the Screaming Eagles, the men of the 101st Airborne Division's 1st Brigade. The 30th's civil affairs officer, Maj. Thomas Fligh of Douglas, N.Y., thought he ought to treat the elephant, too.

Lea and Fligh found the elephant lying beneath a tree, a bullet in his left front leg. The mounted Khon, and the elephant reluctantly rose. Lea approached "with great poise," a dispatch account reported, while Fligh supervised from a distance of several feet, beyond the waving of the elephant's trunk.

The feasting wound was on the inside of the leg. Probing somewhat gingerly, Lea found the bullet embedded two inches beneath the elephant's hide in the general area of what he would call the upper arm on his other patients.

He plucked out the slug, cleaned the wound and applied what he hopes was enough antibiotic to kill elephant germs. Khon began wailing, the doctor left off the bandage.

At last report the patient was doing well.

### Pope Blasts Extremists On Reform

VATICAN CITY (AP) — Pope Paul VI made a scathing attack today on extreme liberals and extreme conservatives in the Roman Catholic Church.

The Pope vented his displeasure at a meeting of the commission to carry out the Vatican Ecumenical Council's changes in liturgy.

It was one of the harshest denunciations the pontiff has ever made against trends in the church that he considers go too far in the quest for modernization or fight too hard against the council's plans to bring the Church up to date.

Pope Paul told the commission he could not "leave silent our bitterness over some facts and some tendencies that certainly do not favor the good results that the Church expects from the diligent work of this commission."

He defended the commission's president, Giacomo Cardinal Lercaro, the liberal archbishop of Bologna, who has been accused by conservative Italian clerics of undermining the Church.

Then the Pope denounced what he called "episodes of indiscipline" and "wittily arbitrary" practices in some liturgical services. This reflected his expressed fears that some Catholics are modifying liturgical practices too rapidly and doing it without authority.

He emphasized that changes in worship can be done only with the permission of the Church. He expressed confidence that the various national and regional bishops conferences around the world would keep a close watch on changes and see that they are acceptable.

He defended the commission's president, Giacomo Cardinal Lercaro, the liberal archbishop of Bologna, who has been accused by conservative Italian clerics of undermining the Church.

### Hospital Offers 'Active' Teens Birth Capsules

BALTIMORE, Md. (AP) — A Baltimore hospital provides birth control pills for the high school girl who is sexually involved with a number of boys or the girl who is often intimate with her steady boyfriend.

The providing of pills is a part of a program at Sinai Hospital which offers treatment of adolescent problems from acne to and through pregnancy.

The hospital describes the recipients of the birth control pills as "sexually active." Dr. Leonard G. Gordin, a pediatrician at Sinai, said Tuesday about 80 girls have been referred to the program in the past four months.

"Essentially the experience of the adolescent center," said Gordin, "has shown that sexual activity is increasingly common and accepted among adolescents."

"Since the rate of teen-age pregnancy is so high and the consequences are so tragic, the new service was added to the center," he said.

Girls accepted into the program at the hospital's adolescent center may come from any part of the city and receive the pills only after intensive individual and group counseling and only with parental consent.

### Policeman, Teen Shot in Gunfight At Bus Terminal

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind. (AP) — A police lieutenant asked, "How is the kid I shot?" after he and a 17-year-old Minneapolis youth fell in a gun battle outside a crowded bus terminal in downtown Indianapolis.

Both Lt. Paul T. Pearsey, 31, and James Heywood of St. Paul were listed in critical condition in Marion County General Hospital.

Pearsey and Heywood were shot Tuesday as police were taking Heywood and a companion from the bus station for questioning about a credit card.

The youths had bought tickets to Florida on the credit card. Jim Gagnac, manager of the Trailways Bus Lines terminal, who called police, said the card was reported stolen from St. Paul man.

Police said Heywood's companion, Jeffrey Thompson, 17, St. Paul, drew a pistol but was disarmed. They said Heywood broke away in the scuffle and started shooting at Pearsey.

A night watchman, Pearsey's right hand, and another struck him in the chest and lodged near his right kidney. Pearsey, who is left-handed, drew his pistol and fired five times as he fled.

Heywood was wounded in the abdomen, in the back and in the buttocks.

### Crash Kills Yale's Famed Flying Prof

CORTRAND, N.Y. (AP) — Norwood H. Hanson, Yale's "Flying Professor," was killed Tuesday when his plane slammed into a hillside about 18 miles from Cortland.

Hanson, 41, a professor of philosophy at Yale and a resident of Hamden, Conn., was an accomplished pilot who performed in aerial-acrobatic shows and wrote articles for aviation magazines.

Hanson was enroute to Ithaca from Meriden, Conn., to lecture at Cornell University, where he was to speak on "Flight Theory Within The History of Ideas."

He was piloting a Grumman Bearcat converted for personal use. Authorities said the plane plunged into Ripley Hill at about 4 p.m.

The professor rose to the rank of major in the Corps.

George Scharder, chairman of the philosophy department at Yale, said Hanson's death "was a real blow" to the university.

Hanson's special field of study was in the history and philosophy of science.

He leaves his widow, Trevor, 31, and their two children, Trevor, 11, and Leslie, 9.

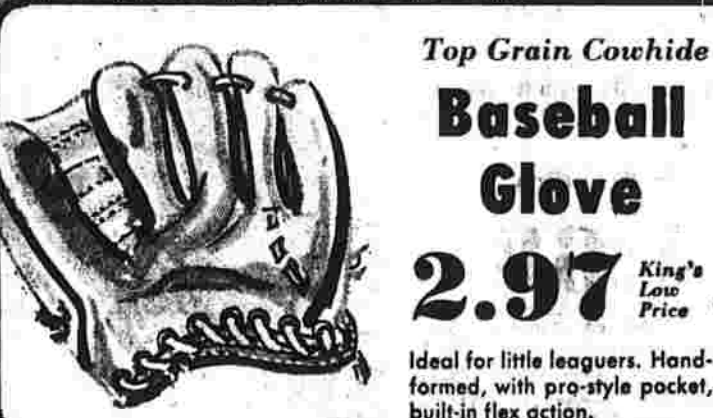

"I'd like to buy a subway train," the caller said.

And a Health Department official kept his composure when a man insisted upon permission to keep a goat in his Manhattan apartment because he preferred goat's milk to cow's milk.

The health code only permits dogs and cats, the department employee told him. "However, there are a number of stores that sell goat's milk and, if you'll give me your name and address, I'll be glad to send you a list of the stores in your neighborhood."

Lindsay's surprise at his campaign's successes might be due to the fact that in the early days of his administration, he was apt to call a city department and say: "This is the mayor. How are things going?"

Dubious city employees were reported to have answered: "Sure you're the mayor. I'm George Washington. It's nice talking to you."

Or "Get lost you nut!" "They've learned not to do that any more," Lindsay said.

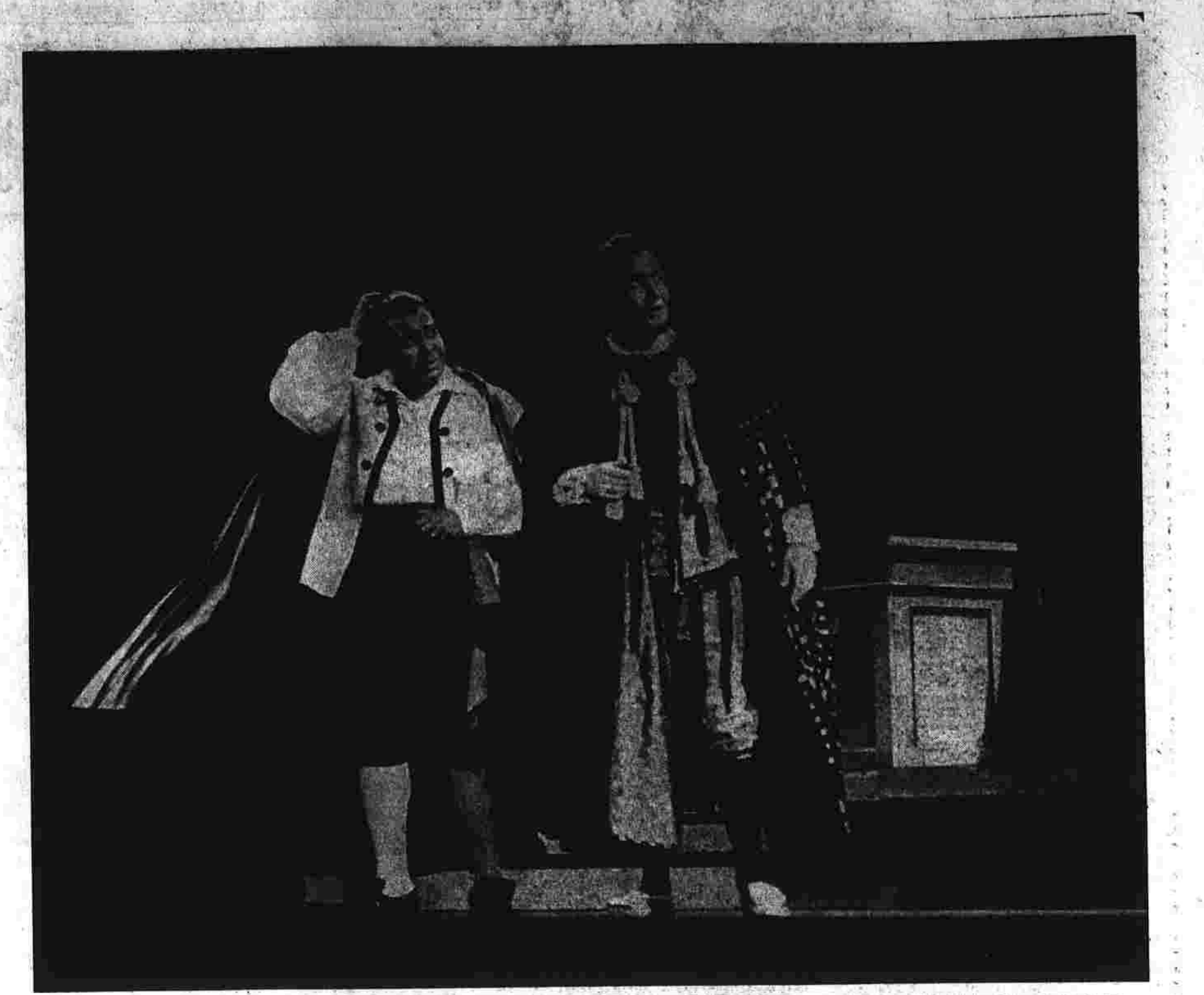

too much tacit agreement that they want to keep the United Nations from infringing on their own nationalistic privileges. They were once sobered enough, following World War II, to wish to create the instrument for the future survival of mankind in the nuclear age. They have now come to a dismal mutual instinct to keep that instrument from developing the law, the financing, the prestige and the ability to judge and discipline even themselves the instrument must have if it is to have a chance of fulfilling its original purpose.

**Lightning Superstitions True**  
 Consider the title of the governmental organization involved. It is: Environmental Science Services Administration.  
 When a government agency of such scientific-sounding title and prestige tells us what to do about lightning, we are impressed.  
 We are not only impressed, but pleased.  
 We are pleased because it turns out, by these government scientists at least, that most of the old wives' precautions about lightning are being rechecked. The thing we mankind always took for granted is not to be afraid to do because the supposed danger involved was merely nonsense — that same thing is something the federal scientists now advise all of us not to do.  
 It is a relief to have it all settled, authoritatively, at last.  
 According to the federal scientists do not, while lightning is playing about the house, go near radios, television sets, lamps, refrigerators.  
 Do not, say the federal men, use the telephone during a thunder shower.  
 Don't, say the federal men, use hair driers, electric tooth brushes, or electric razors during thunder. And don't be touching golf clubs, or fishing rods, or open cans of gasoline in your hand. Don't sit in windows, or doorways, or next to a voluntary contribution to the United Nations financing which will be an indirect, roundabout way of making up for its previous failure to pay its share of peacekeeping operations in the Congo. But Russia still stands fast against any reconstitution of peacekeeping power and procedure which was in existence in those instances.  
 In those instances, the General Assembly of the United Nations represented the center of UN power and action. Subsequently both Russia and the United States began fighting with the idea that it was to their big power interest to revise actual UN procedures to restore the Security Council, with its veto power, to dominance as the source of UN decisions.  
 The Canadian resolution seeks to reaffirm the responsibility of the General Assembly to act when the Security Council proves unable to do so, and asks various members of the United Nations to designate in advance the kind of force or service they would be willing to provide for any peacekeeping mission voted by the General Assembly.  
 Russia bitterly opposes this, going back to the claim that it threatens to offend the original basic principles of the UN Charter.  
 Russia, then, is the spectacular villain on the issue.  
 But it is a part of the UN problem, and therefore part of the world's problem of survival, that the United States, which regards itself as the principal founder and supporter of the United Nations, and which, in 1951, itself authored and piloted through the resolution under which the General Assembly took to itself the power to act, is now in a position which is unclear in some instances and unsatisfactory in others.  
 We may like the privilege of criticizing Russia for its opposition to any strengthening of the UN peacekeeping machinery, but there is some question how directly devoted to those proposals we ourselves actually are. Under two Presidents, now, we have begun to do have more and more like a big power which could take or leave the United Nations rather than, as under Truman and Eisenhower, a nation which considered it an honorable destiny to be the number one servant of the United Nations.  
 And we, in our current behavior in Asia, have dealt to the prestige of the United Nations as heavy a blow as any Russia ever dealt, because we have refused to submit our own military conduct in Vietnam to the jurisdiction, investigation and judgment of the world organization. We have repeatedly invited it to make our cause its own, and to help us, but never to judge us or apply the law to us.  
 Both we and Russia, at the historical moment, seem to be standing for something close to big power anarchy, although each of us in explaining our position to ourselves, will argue that we are merely following the unreplicable laws of big nation power and responsibility. Each of us is willing to try to run the world our way; each of us, for that matter, has some willingness to try to run the world in a sort of cool comorbation with the other; neither of us has any present intention to get the mere majority of nations or people take over the task.  
 The sad, tragic situation is, then, that the two great powers who had to agree in the first place to create a United Nations are now a subordinate

## Inside Report

**WASHINGTON**—What happened in a secret meeting during last month's Young Republican training conference here shows how far away the Republican party still is from solving the chronic and serious problem of its youth auxiliary.

The unscheduled meeting took place at the Sheraton-Park Hotel suite of Kansas State Senator Tom R. Van Sickle, National Chairman of the Young Republicans (YRs). Present were several prominent YR leaders including the two leading candidates to succeed Van Sickle at this summer's national convention in Omaha: Tennessee's Jack McDonald, candidate of the dominant and conservative "syndicate" faction, and Ohio's James Betts, representing a more moderate opposition faction.

Most important was the presence there of one not-yet-young Republican: Nebraska's active Republican national committee man, Don Ross, who is National chairman of the YRs and is dealing with the fractious YRs.

In that role, Ross informed the meeting that Betts wanted all candidates for national chairman to adhere in advance to a watered-down version of recommendations made several years ago by former National Chairman Madeo Alcorn at a time when the YRs were embarrassing the national party.

The Prairie Farmer, in its endorsement, requested the recommendations would merely give the National Committee some small element of control over the policy and finances of the YRs. Yet, Ross's proposal caused a storm of protest.

A group of Southern members of the "syndicate" faction, headed by Miss Terry Gautier of Mississippi, was particularly incensed. Syndicate candidate McDonald made it clear he could not and would not make any commitment. His moderate opponent, Betts, was in a bind. If he had gone along, he would have destroyed his own message chance he has of winning a convention delegates from McDonald.

That leaves the next move up to Betts. But Ross stressed that Betts was leaving no ultimatum. And anybody familiar with the cautious political style of Ray Betts can safely predict that he will take no frontal action to discipline the YRs.

Thus, the YR situation now looks like this: the syndicate forces, which dominated the last two national conventions, will be even stronger at Omaha after having taken over YR organizations in California, Connecticut, and the District of Columbia. McDonald will be an easy winner over Betts, and not important, he will probably take office without making any commitments that might reduce the autonomy of the YRs.

## School Pay Outlined At Public Hearing

The proposed 1967-68 board of education budget was discussed at a public hearing at the school board hearing last night. Generally larger crowds and longer hearings are the hallmarks of school board budget hearings, but this year the hearing was reversed with 100 people attending the hearing on the school board budget Monday night.

The school board hearing took three hours, while Monday night's hearing lasted close to four hours.

As is usually the case with the school budget, nearly every item was questioned closely. The proposal is for a \$1,214,400 appropriation, a 14 per cent increase over the current figure.

The hearing began with a lengthy explanation of teacher salary payments, this being a large portion of the budget. There was some confusion due to the fact that salaries are not paid until Sept. 1 to Aug. 31 of any given year, but the fiscal year runs from July 1 to June 30.

Teachers are by their own request being paid bi-weekly. This means that part of the current fiscal year's salary is being paid in the current fiscal year, and a carry-over of two months into the next fiscal year.

Salaries Unsettled  
 Teacher salaries are further complicated since they are not yet settled. The proposed budget carries figures contained in the board salary proposal, but depending on the outcome of mediation later this week, these could be subject change.

Board member Donald Averill explained that administrative salaries are also not definite, since they are on a ratio basis determined by teacher salaries. Total difference between teacher and board proposals however, are \$28,000.

Considerable discussion also centered on a meeting proposal that the school board hire this August to prepare for the opening of the new intermediate school in September of 1968. The board budget includes an appropriation of \$11,225 for this position.

Several citizens questioned the need for such a position. It is the privilege of the religious person to "think God's thoughts after him" but this is not the business of the school board, Averill explained. He said that the school board must be filled in August.

There were several alternate proposals and suggestions from the audience.

Some suggested waiting until summer 1968, and others thought hiring six months in advance would be sufficient.

Questions were also raised regarding the hiring of a vocational coordinator at \$13,000. Averill pointed out that this is a fully reimbursable item, and would add the student who chooses not to go to college.

Don-Year Aft  
 Stephen Loykin of Goose Lane pointed out that federal funds may not be available for this position for more than one year.

### Barry Hits Housing Bill

State Sen. David M. Barry spoke out yesterday in opposition to a bill which would establish a Capitol Region Housing Authority with Hartford as the mainstay.

Although the proposal, House Bill 4855, does not include Manchester, it does include Glastonbury, one of the towns which Barry represents as senator from the 41st Senatorial District.

Barry claimed that the bill "erodes local autonomy" because it would require acceptance or rejection by an aggregate referendum vote in all towns of the proposed district.

He said that, "Even if the people of Glastonbury vote 'no' the town would be required to join if the aggregate result is 'yes'."

The bill was introduced by State Rep. Norris L. O'Neill, Dem., of Hartford.

Representation on the authority would be based on the number of state representatives from the member towns.

The bill was opposed by all of the legislators from those towns with the exception of O'Neill.

The only other backing came from the State Civil Rights Commission, the Glastonbury Civil Rights Council and one Glastonbury resident, Joseph Kennedy, Sr. School.

Maps and illustrations will be used in the presentation, and a question period will conclude the program.

Their appearance has been arranged by Lloyd Berry, council vice president and legislative committee chairman.

The speakers will present supporting views on Lincoln held by the Board of Education and the Town Planning Commission.

The commission for several months has been opposing the bill's recommendation to replace the existing Lincoln School with a new building in Center Springs Park.

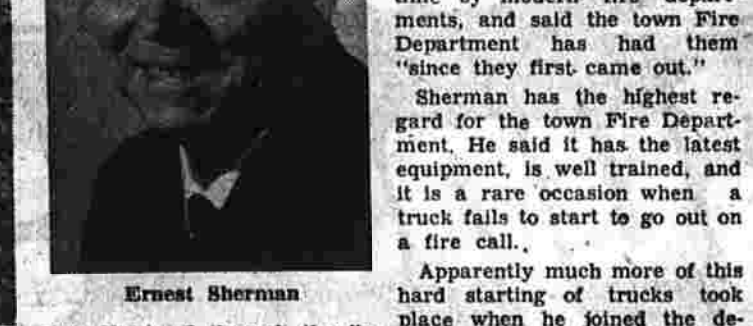

Football is ours entirely. It was invented by Dr. James Naismith at Springfield College in the 1890's. It belongs to us so we watch it more so than any other sport.

So sure are we that the winner of our big basketball game, the NFL-AFL playoff winner and the NBA playoff winner are also the world champion. None of them play anybody outside the United States.

Soccer's Job

It is the job of soccer's public relations men to convince us that somebody else has a good idea. That's what I'm afraid will take time, and in this TV-hungry country, time is money. Soccer did draw well Sunday when the season opened. It remains to be seen if it continues to do so. A Spanish newspaper has stated, "If America takes this on in earnest, they must give the World Cup by 1974."
