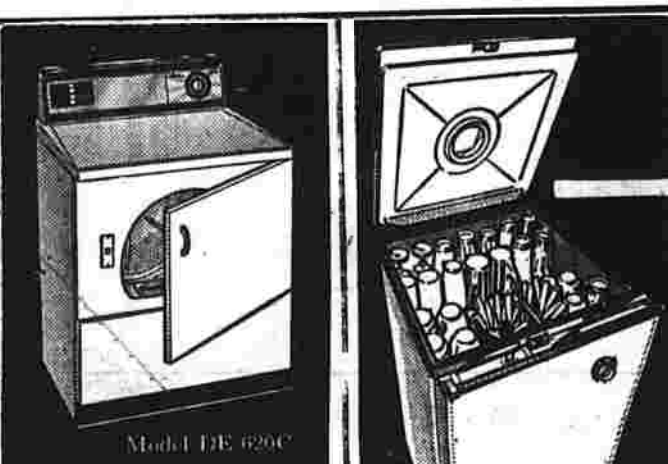

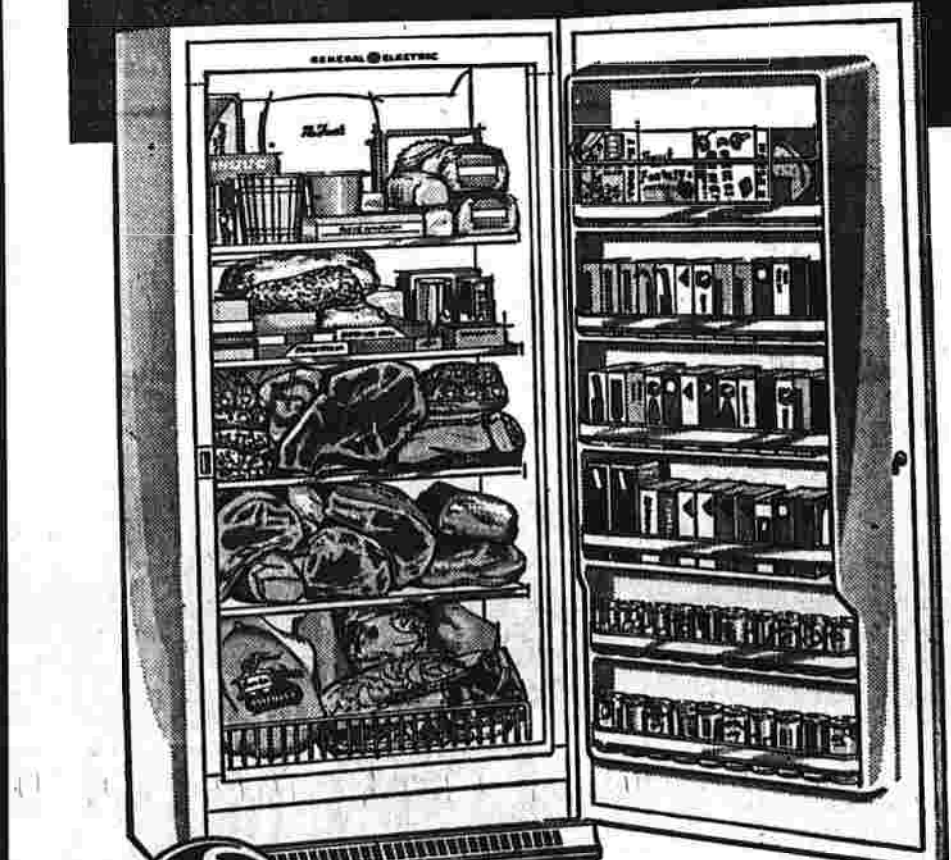

Gen. Foulois, Crime Dips in Philadelphia Sky Blazer, Following Gun Sale Curbs Is Dead at 87

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — Gen. Benjamin Delahunt Foulois, 87, who retired 25 years ago from a military career lasting 47 years — was the first person to fly as an observer on a cross-country airplane last because of the decline in the sale of guns and allied products.

The law's supporters generally take the view of E. J. Connelley, executive vice president of the Philadelphia Commission on Crime, a private, non-profit organization which has been a consistent supporter of gun control as a crime deterrent.

"If only one serious crime was averted by the ordinance, the law is justified," says Connelley. He cites police statistics which show that in 1966 the department denied weapons permits to 144 of the more than 6,000 applicants.

Among the 144, according to police, were 20 convicted burglars, 10 robbers, 13 convicted of aggravated assault and battery, a narcotics addict, three rapists, and 13 persons convicted of assault with intent to kill.

Widespread local interest in gun control came in the ground swell of reaction to the assassination of President John F. Kennedy. It took, however, the death of a policeman to provide enough public support for City Council to pass the measure.

It was enacted April 18, 1966, seven months after Detective Lt. Daniel J. McChane was shot to death by a woman who obtained a permit for a pistol under her married name despite the fact she had a criminal record under her maiden name.

Tolland Young Republicans to Hear Fiscal Board Role Outlined

The role of a board of finance in town government will be explained at Thursday night's annual meeting of the Tolland Young Republican Club. Tolland is investigating the advantages and disadvantages of establishing a board of finance.

Richard Northrup, advisor to the Ellington board of finance, will be the speaker. The YGOP has invited members of the board of finance study committee to attend. A question and answer period will follow.

A board of finance controls preparation of a town's budget, including the board of education budget. It can recommend cuts.

A public hearing on a budget usually is conducted by a finance board, after which the board again reviews the budget. It then is presented to a town meeting.

Tolland's general town budget now is drawn up by the board of selectmen and the education budget is compiled by the board of education. The budget is then presented directly to the annual town meeting for consideration.

Some advocates of the board of finance contend that the town's budget, now in excess of \$1.7 million, has reached a point where a finance board is necessary to handle it. They contend town finances are becoming too complex for present procedures.

Opponents feel the board is capable of preparing their own budgets as they have done in the past. They express confidence in the decisions of town residents at the annual meeting.

If the state grant is authorized, as expected, the appropriation for the contingency fee will return to the town's general fund.

A sewer study of the area, including Tolland, would be useful to the town in the future when it begins to consider installation of sewers or treatment plants, officials point out.

Respect For Their Own Court

Down in New York City last Sunday night a leader of a West Side Manhattan Democratic Club, a businessman named Alex J. Rosenberg, took President Johnson to political task for the war in Vietnam.

"We helped to elect this administration because it promised peace," the speaker said, "and the President has done nothing to keep that promise."

"We did not intentionally elect a Vice President to walk arm in arm with either Marshall Ky or Lester Maddox."

"Nor will we remain responsible for a Secretary of State who repeatedly informs us that he will not allow public opinion to alter that course of foreign policy he deems best for our country."

The report of this meeting and this speech in the New York Times reinforced the information that other "reform Democratic clubs" in New York are also restive about the war, and that "many of them" endorsed the peace demonstration that took place.

All this, which took place as the annual dinner of an organization called the "America Independent" Democrats, we read without disapproval. There are all kinds of Democrats, and some of them have a right to question the perfect wisdom of the President. And this whole country is a city of fighting the war in Vietnam as the President has chosen to fight it.

What we object to about this occasion down in New York was the presence, on the platform during these speeches, and as a speaker himself later in the program, of Associate Justice William O. Douglas of the United States Supreme Court. The speech he himself delivered when the program got around to him was probably a good speech. At least it argued for the war, and that is what we find some way to substitute law for war.

But here, in a meeting of a political club, in an atmosphere where many elements of national policy were discussed, was sitting, and participating, a distinguished gentleman who, as a member of the highest court in the land, has already been called upon to help decide questions which are related to this same national policy.

We make a very flat statement about such things. No member of the nation's highest court—no member of any court for that matter—should ever attend a meeting of any kind of political club.

The higher the court, the greater the offense to taste and to the prestige of the office, and the more the speaker should apply without any regard to the particular politics of the club in question, and no matter how good or how bad a political speech the judge may deliver on such an occasion.

There is one elemental duty and responsibility which ought not to need stating to any recipient of high judicial appointment: honor the office, respect your own court.

Perhaps the most important part of the answer—the psychological part—was suggested by a statement General Westmoreland made during his question and answer period before the nation's publishers Monday. "I was delighted," he said, "to learn that the MIG aircraft had been bombed at least two of them today. This was a military target on which was based aircraft that had been used offensively against our fighters or bombers."

This was, we think, the first time in United States history or in United States rhetoric that an American military or diplomatic leader ever resorted to the claim that to attack bombers over one's own territory constituted an "offensive" action. 'GOOD OLD DAYS'

Old timers in Manchester will like to recall the "good old days" in baseball when the series between Manchester and Rockville teams caused a general shutdown of business affairs in each community in the early 1920s.

With major league baseball outlawed in Boston on Sundays, numerous big league players picked up some loose money on the Sabbath by playing with "local" teams, many winding up in Rockville or Manchester uniforms.

When Manchester and Rockville teams met, the rivalry was always intense.

Lou Breckenridge was the playing manager of the Sun-Town entry which provided most of the fireworks.

Three members of Connie Mack's famous "Flamingo Field" played here, first baseman Stuffy McInnis and shortstop Jack Barry with Manchester, and second baseman Eddie Collins with Rockville. Denny Murphy, the first infielder with Mack's great Philadelphia Athletics teams that era, was also a veteran of Manchester colors.

The greatest name pitcher to ever work for either side was the immortal Christy Mathewson with Rockville. It was strictly a big money game, staged in Rockville, and the great New York Giant right-hander was up for the occasion and completely stuffed the Manchester batters.

Jimmy O'Rourke, leading off for Manchester, tried to get into the first inning against the important star, Manchester, but which drew in the game's short lived, Matty bore down, retired the side and didn't permit another hit all afternoon.

Batting Hero

It was Mathewson, too, who was the batting hero. Coming up in the bottom of the ninth inning with a runner on base, Mathewson lashed out a base hit which drove in the game's only run.

Manchesterites like to recall the feat of Chubby Joe Casey, a great catcher. One afternoon, he threw out seven base runners in a game, a feat which no mean feat. Casey later went up to the American League with the Detroit Tigers.

Barry and Collins played here while attending Holy Cross and Columbia respectively. Both played under assumed names, their eligibility being played weekends in "mill towns" like Rockville and Manchester. Barry was able to pick up some money to help into their education. Barry, after his major league career, coached at Holy Cross for better than 20 years. He played third base in Manchester.

No longer a ball park in Manchester now was the Flower St. diamond, completely enclosed. Bleachers and a grandstand helped make up the spacious park which could accommodate crowds of 5,000 and more, and was never non-specter.

It was while playing with Rockville that Bill Lash, manager of Manchester, mentioned him to Connie Mack. McInnis played but one game for Manchester. He was imported with Joe Casey for the weekend series. Following the Saturday game, a major fire broke out in town that night. Two men were badly burned, one died and McInnis, having witnessed the blaze, took sick and vanished from the scene.

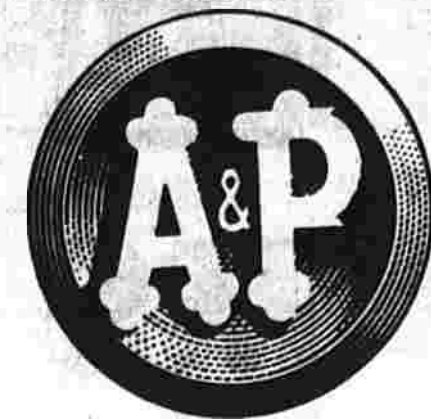

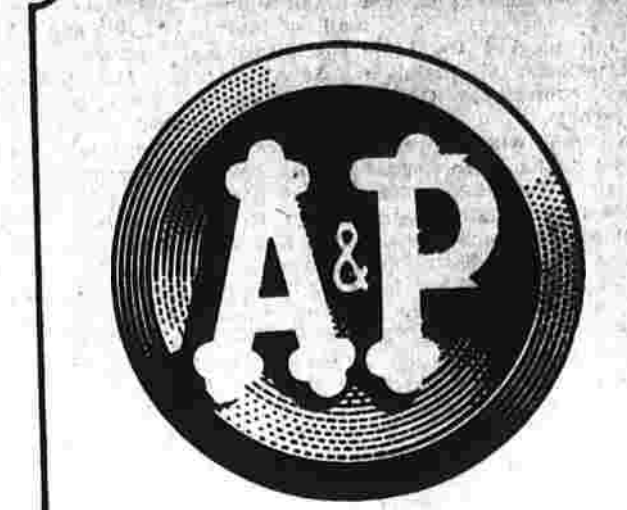

Elder Citizens' Group Gains Independence

WASHINGTON (AP) — don't know what to do — 14 Grandpa and Grandpa see get grandchildren and three great-grandchildren. She loves them all, of course, but still and all she likes living independently.

There's a marked trend for older Americans to maintain their own homes, the Census Bureau reports.

Take a look at what happened in a 15-year span. The Census people say "about 9.5 million households in the United States in 1955 consisted of a household head living alone or sharing his home with persons not related to him. In two-thirds of these households, the head was 65 years old or over.

"The number of households of this type in 1965 was double the number for 1950."

The vast migration from rural areas to cities has had much to do with this trend, in the view of Don Hummel, assistant secretary of the Department of Housing and Urban Development.

"Down on the farm in the old days," he says, "Grandpa and Grandma often lived with the younger generations, and were an economic asset to them. They could help raise the grandchildren, do the cooking and chores. But there's not much room or role for the senior citizens when the younger folks live in a small apartment."

Homes for senior citizens are proliferating the nation over. And HUD has many a role in this trend — from FHA-insured mortgages for luxury cooperatives to subsidizing 30-a-month apartments for the poor.

Meet a couple of oldsters who enjoy such housing in the nation's capital:

—Mrs. John H. Knapp, great-granddaughter of Chief Justice John Marshall and cousin of Gen. George C. Marshall. She's a Navy widow and at 78 she's full of vim and means life with a merry chuckle.

—Guy Stokes, retired plasterer, 62, is tall, Stokes says he was too busy on straight and full of humor. His proud boast is that in the last two years he has learned to read and write.

Mrs. Knapp's home for her mellow years is the old Roosevelt Hotel which has been rehabilitated under FHA mortgage insurance.

Here, the prices, including the rent, breakfast and dinner, range from \$18 a month for a small room with private bath to \$600 a month quarters for two people — living room, bedroom, dining area, kitchen and bath. There is weekly maid service and linen is supplied.

Many retired, semiretired, or in some cases still-working teachers, writers, artists, musicians and government workers live at the Roosevelt, and it's a sort of quiet bohemian. Things going on range from a millinery class to a travel club from checkers to shuffleboard.

"Do I like it?" says Mrs. Knapp. "You bet, or I wouldn't stay."

It is not for lack of relatives that Mrs. Knapp lives on her own. With a laugh, she says: "I've got so much posterity I going rate."

Collegians' Travel Increases Annually

NEW YORK (AP) — Nearly 800,000 college students will pack their phrase books, binoculars and guitars for trips abroad this summer. Even little brothers and sisters will join the academic and strollers who are making their "it's just snowballing," said James E. A. Glendinning, director of the National Student Association's tour program.

He predicted that student travel would be up 15 to 20 percent over last year.

The State Department issued passports for 294,180 persons aged 16 to 26 last year, up from 247,140 in 1966, and 48,970 youngsters aged 10 to 14 obtained passports, up from 41,600.

The number of younger travelers has increased so much that America's largest student travel organization, now splits its group into teen-agers (15-17), college-age (18-21) and young adults (22-28).

Hundreds of other travel agencies, colleges and airlines are setting up tours and seminars for young people. They may study political science in Czechoslovakia or chamber music in Germany.

Most first-timers will go to Europe, but the number traveling to the Far East, particularly Japan, has been increasing, the council on student travel reports.

The council has chartered a ship to make 10 all-student transatlantic crossings this summer, with open-air language classes, panel discussions on civil rights, jazz sessions and all-night parties. They will depart about shipboard restaurants.

The National Student Association has lined up tours and study programs that cost from \$18 for three weeks in Europe to \$1,218 for more than seven weeks.
