Senate's Ethics Committee Recommends Dodd Censure

WASHINGTON (AP) - The Senate Ethics Committee today recommended that Sen. Thomas J. Dodd be censured for conduct it said "is contrary to accepted morals, degrades the high public trust expected of a senator, and tends to bring the Senate into dishonor and discredit." The bipartisan committee's report said it unanimously directed Chairman John Stennis D-Miss., to propose Senate adoption of the resolution of censure. Stennis, in formally presenting the report, asked the Senate to consider it with "a reasonable time." No date was fixed, and Senate Democrats would likely try to bring the resolution to a vote on Monday. Dodd told newsmen he did not intend to try to recruit support to oppose the resolution. Adoption of the censure resolution would deprive Dodd of any rights or privileges as a senator. The only penalty Stennis said he would like to see attached to the Senate's action. The proposed resolution, summing up the committee's findings in its investigation of misconduct by Dodd, said: "The committee has determined that Senator Dodd has obtained and used for his personal benefit certain information from the public through political connections. It also said that Senator Dodd has accepted reimbursement for expenses from both the Senate and private organizations for the same travel. Shells Pound Viet Hill; Last Raid Cost 4 Planes

SAIGON (AP) - U.S. planes and artillery pounded a stubborn Communist hill in the northwest corner of South Vietnam today as Marines killed and wounded 84 in an unsuccessful, three-day attempt to take the hill. In the air war against North Vietnam, the U.S. command announced four American planes were shot down in Wednesday's raids against the Hanoi-Hai Phong area. Curtis was participating in "Operation Junction City," the largest military operation in Vietnam so far. The son of Mrs. Mary M. The first was Army Spec. 4 David Quoy, son of Mr. and Mrs. Adolph Quoy of 65 Spruce St. Quoy died from enemy fire during a combat mission last week.

Some Opposition Town Urges State To Buy Case Mt.

"It would be to the advantage of all the people of Connecticut if Manchester's Case Mt. were purchased by the state rather than the town," General Manager Robert Weiss told the General Assembly's State Development Committee yesterday.

Weiss was one of five Manchester officials who appeared at a public hearing on Committee Bill 1967, an act concerning state acquisition of Case Mt. for recreational purposes.

The bill would permit the State Park and Forest Commission to purchase, develop and maintain the 273-acre property. It carries a recommended \$425,000 state appropriation.

Those who urged a favorable report on the measure were, in addition to Weiss, Town Planning Commissioner James W. Starnitsky, State Sen. David Barry, and State Reps. Robert Starnitsky and Henry Becker. Jane Webster, a staff member of the Capitol Region Planning Agency, also spoke in favor of the bill. She stressed the high priority need for the acquisition, rather than the destruction of by whom it should be acquired.

Dr. A. B. Moran spoke in opposition to the acquisition. He said the money needed for the purchase at the \$425,000 mentioned figure, but not at a much lower figure of about \$107,000.

Weiss told the committee that the town of Manchester is in a position to negotiate for the purchase of the privately owned Manchester Water Co. and that federal funds under the Open Space Acquisition Act could be used here.

He explained that Manchester's application is for federal funds for Case Mt. purchase and, since the federal government is not likely to approve two applications for open spaces, he places priority on the water company purchase.

"Case Mt. is now in private hands and we feel that it will not remain so much longer," he said. He was referring to a possibility that the land may be sold to developers, eventually, if not by the town or state.

CRPA Takes No Stand On Community Act

The Capitol Region Planning Agency took no stand in support or opposition to the proposed Community Development Act at its meeting last night.

A proposal, made by Robert Burns of East Hartford calling for CRPA's opposition to the act was defeated 25-12. No further actions were taken. Many representatives attending voted against opposing the act because of a lack of knowledge of what is included in the package.

The Community Development Act as described by Milo Wilcox, chief of the community development division of the State Development Commission, would place the responsibility of administering a broad program aimed at the physical, economic and human resource development of all state municipalities under one state agency.

Effects of the program would likely be felt in almost every city and town in the state.

The act would provide the "mechanism and opportunities to attack social and economic problems of the state in a comprehensive effort," according to Wilcox.

Seymour Lavitt of Vernon, chairman of the Legislative Committee expressed reservations about the portion of the act which requests Regional Planning Agencies to make recommendations on applications of municipalities. "This would place a heavy burden on the participation of planning agencies," he noted.

The CRPA legislative committee is "not in any strong support of the proposed act," Lavitt stated.

Burns gave a detailed 20-minute presentation opposing the act, referring to various documents and reports, including a legislative study compiled by the James Scully, attorney for the Connecticut Association of Housing and Development officials, who opposed the act.

The American Planning Officials report contains recommendations for legislation to be undertaken in the 1969 biennium, according to Burns. He charged that passage of the Connecticut Development Act this session would be inopportune.

Wilcox denied any connection between the APO report and the Development act now before the Legislature.

Wilcox presented an outline of the proposed act to the CRPA members, adding that some amendments and adjustments may be made.

The Community Development Acts and Fund with their subsequent sub-duties would probably fall under the jurisdiction of the Connecticut Development Commission. Wilcox did say, however, that this might be changed, due to comments that have been made at the legislative hearings on the proposal. The sub-duties of the Development Act would include research programs, in fields such as housing construction, rehabilitation techniques and mortgage financing.

Also included under the act would be the funding of various programs by state grants. These grants would amount to either one-half of the federal share or two-thirds of the net cost if federal funds are not available. This section would include physical and economic development activities, such as existing urban renewal assistance and industrial development programs. Also included in this category are such programs as extended low rental housing, housing site development and capital improvement grants.

An additional state fund sub-program was referred to as Human Resource Supplemental grants, by Wilcox. This would include projects involved with the Office of Economic Opportunity, legal aid, and socially oriented poverty programs. State grants would be awarded on the same basis as the Program Grants.

To qualify for continued state aid for the instituted programs under the Program Grant category, municipalities would be required to complete a Community Development Action Plan, within two years. The municipality would be required to undertake a survey and inventory of the town, its needed resources, and planning studies; an analysis and evaluation of CDC problems now and in the future, such as housing and economic and industrial development; followed by formulation of a Community Development and Improvement program.

"This program would give the First Selectman or Mayor a look ahead at the community problems," Wilcox maintained. It would also serve as "a way and means to meet the problems and to program future actions," he added.

Wilcox declined to comment after the meeting on CRPA's position relating to the proposed Community Development Act.

The CRPA also presented its refuse study for the towns of Enfield, Somers and Suffield. The report recommends the sanitary landfill method of disposal. The possibility of incineration was not considered in the report due to the population factor and fi-

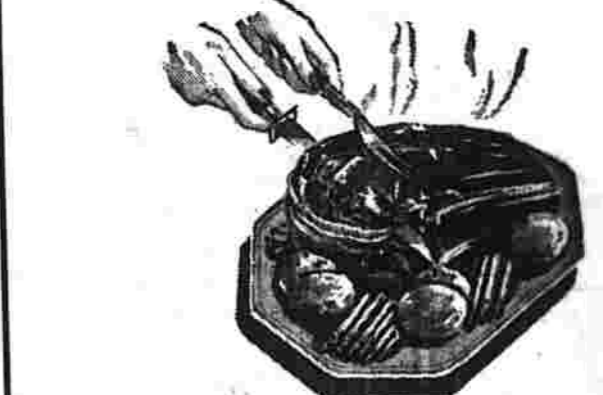
