Church Converted into Home

Many enterprising home owners in this area convert barns into attracive dwellings, but Mr. and Mrs. Leo R. Cloutier of Washington St., Vernon, believe there are few families who can, as they do, boast that their nome was once a house of worship. Contemporary furniture is in the family room, which has one wall covered with built-in shelves and cabinished with a mixture of traditional and colonial pieces, all bought, Mrs. Cloutier said, with "comfort in mind." The vast counter space in the mod ern, functional kitchen should delight the average housewife. It is covered in turquoise, and the cabinets are in natural birch. The refrigerator, builtin oven and range top are in stainless

He never fails to marvel, the Cloutiers said, at the transformation of the interior from a sanctuary where he once celebrated Mass and performed other religious ceremonies, to a place where he now found sanctuary as an honored guest.
