## Dozen Dead, Over 100 Hurt

# 2 Minnesota Towns Hit by Tornadoes

WASECA, Minn. (AP) — Searchers probed, through splintered rubble of homes smashed by tornadoes at Waseca and Albert Lea today grimly looking for more bodies in the aftermath of a night of storm terror which left a dozen dead, over 100 injured and property damage in the millions at eight communities and numerous farms.

A band of possibly a half-dozen tornadoes smashed across a 50-mile wide area of southern Minnesota around the dinner hour Sunday night.

"It was horrible," exclaimed Mrs. Archie Drahelm of Waseca. "We were sitting at the dinner table eating when the picture window hit me and my hus-

band right in the face. There was no warning. There was this terrible rain falling and all of a sudden I was diving along the floor with glass all around me."

She and her husband were treated for cuts at a hospital and released.

Countless others were similarly taken by surprise, even though a tornado which had been issued by the Weather Bureau for the area.

The tornadoes roared upon them in the midst of heavy rains and nearing dusk, which apparently prevented them from watching the skies closely. Witnesses said the Waseca warning siren began blaring a couple of minutes after the tornado had passed.

## Third Party 'Futile': Romney's Prediction

ATLANTA, Ga. (AP) — Gov. George Romney of Michigan said today a third party move in the 1968 presidential election would be both tragic and futile. He predicted voters of the South will reject the move.

"I don't think the states of the South should hook themselves to a fallen star," Romney, a Republican, said at a news conference, opening a whirlwind campaign-like speaking tour in Atlanta.

Romney said a third party campaign, which former Gov. George C. Wallace of Alabama has indicated he will head, would have less effect if the people of the South understand what is involved.

"Once they see that this effort is futile and self-defeating, they will not support it," said Rom-

ney, who did not mention Wallace by name.

"I think it will hurt the Democrats more than it will hurt the Republicans," he said.

Romney said federal legislation was not the primary need in civil rights. In response to repeated questions, Romney refused to say if he supports the open housing bill now in Congress or whether he supports the principle. But he said legislation had created false hopes.

Romney said efforts in this area should be concentrated on state, local and private levels rather than trying to solve the problem by one approach such as federal law.

## Senate Consensus

# Long's Support of Dodd Is Politically Dangerous

WASHINGTON (AP) — The consensus around the Senate is that in opposing the censure of Sen. Thomas J. Dodd, Sen. Russell B. Long is following a lonely road with dangerous political crossings ahead.

No other senator, Democrat or Republican, has stepped up yet to say that Dodd, D-Conn., should not be censured for misconduct as recommended unanimously by a special ethics committee of six.

In his Spartan stand for his beleaguered colleague, Long, D-La., has slashed out with a broad sword at members whose support he is likely to need in the future in his varied and often complicated enterprises as the Senate's assistant Democratic leader and chairman of its Finance Committee.

Long's offhand observation that half the senators couldn't stand the kind of inquiry that

was made of Dodd was generally regarded as an example of how to make political enemies without even trying.

He left unidentified the half he was indicting and the half he was absolving, thus clouding every individual member except possibly himself. He explained that his daddy, the late Huey Long, had left him enough money so he didn't have to worry about outside financial monkeyshines.

He could afford, he said, to take the Senate in stride as "my favorite charity."

Long said the six special committee members were afraid that if they didn't bring out a censure resolution against Dodd they would be subject to "the same kind of calumny and smears" to which he said columnist had subjected the Connecticut senator.

# Gets Advice, Then Leaps From Bridge

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — A 21-year-old San Francisco youth is the third person known to have survived a leap from Golden Gate Bridge — duplicating a plunge taken by a friend who also lived to tell about it.

Gene Robens, a runner for the Pacific Coast Stock Exchange, was conscious when picked up from the water by a sailboat crew 246 feet below the bridge. Doctors at Letterman General Hospital said X-rays showed no serious injury or broken bones.

The only apparent effect, internally, was pneumonia in the lower left lobe of the lung, most likely due to inhaling sea water.

Outwardly, Robens had only some abrasions on his left leg. Robens' mother, Bessie Robens, said her son had a history of psychiatric problems and had been under care of a psychiatrist.

# London Thieves Get \$2 Million in Gold



## 140 Ingots Stolen from Armored Car

LONDON (AP) — Bandits overpowered the crew of an armored car in London today and got away with gold bullion estimated to be worth \$2.1 million, a Scotland Yard spokesman said. He said the gold was in 140 ingots.

The armored vehicle was hijacked in the Islington district of North London.

Police said the truck's crew of three men was overpowered by the gang, who then drove it away.

The vehicle was found abandoned in Kentish Town, about four miles away, with the crew tied up in the back.

The daring robbery was one of the biggest in Britain since the \$7-million great train robbery in 1963.

One member of the truck's crew was taken to London's Middlesex Hospital with head and chest injuries.

The other two were taken to Moorfields Eye Hospital in London.

Police said the gang attacked with ammonia and beat up one of the men.

Police said the gold belonged to London banking firm of N. M. Rothschild and Sons.

Although full details were still not available, the crime appeared to have all the hallmarks of the smoothly run great train robbery.

The gang was reckoned to have full knowledge of the movement of such a large consignment of bullion, and to have carried out the operation so effectively that it was not discovered until they were well away.

The robbery was the biggest in London since a gang broke into a jewelry store and stole \$700,000 worth of gold and gems last Jan. 30.

The blue-colored truck was found a few yards from the home of Margaret Phipps, 55, a housewife.

"After the men in the van were freed, one of them came into my house to use the telephone," she told newsmen. "I gave him a glass of water. There was blood streaming from his forehead and the side of his head. The other two men could not open their eyes. They looked badly hurt."

## 3 More MIGs Shot Down; Marines Fight for Hill

SAIGON (AP) — U. S. pilots shot down three more Communist MIGs over North Vietnam today while just south of the demilitarized zone. U. S. Marines suffered and inflicted heavy casualties, battling North Vietnamese soldiers for a strategic hill.

A Marine spokesman said 48

Marines were killed and 156 wounded as they fought foot by foot Sunday up the slopes of twin-peaked Hill 881. The Marines have had 86 men killed and 240 wounded in the past week in the area.

The spokesman said the Marines killed 180 Communists. Elements of two Marine battalions clung to their positions overnight and moved forward today in a new attempt to take the summit for use as an outpost for checking North Vietnamese movements. There are reported to be 35,000 North Vietnamese regulars in and around the demilitarized zone, possibly poised for a major assault.

As the Marines halted their advance late Sunday, tactical bombers and B52s dumped tons of explosives on the North Vietnamese positions.

The air war flared to a new intensity with 133 missions over North Vietnam and a record 577 strikes over the south.

Two U. S. Army helicopters collided over the Bien Hoa Air base, 15 miles northwest of Saigon, late today and all eight crewmen in the two craft were killed, a U. S. military spokesman said.

## Usual Attacks on U.S. Mark Soviet May Day

MOSCOW (AP) — Marshal Andrei A. Grechko, the new Soviet defense minister, opened May Day ceremonies in Red Square today with standard Soviet attacks on the United States, West Germany and Red China.

No new weapons were among the 330 that rumbled through the square in the annual parade. Observers believe the armed forces are saving up surprise weapons for a splash display on Nov. 7, the 50th anniversary of the Bolshevik revolution.

Workers throughout the Eastern Hemisphere and in parts of Latin America celebrated labor's traditional day. Although

Labor Day is celebrated in September in the United States, American groups held loyalty marches Saturday in cities from Newport, Ore., to New York.

The Moscow parade displayed anti-aircraft rockets of the kind used in North Vietnam against American planes, antiballistic missiles and 110-foot intercontinental ballistic missiles.

Among those on the reviewing stand were Communist party Secretary General Leonid I. Brezhnev and Premier Alexei N. Kosygin.

## Bingo Espionage Due in New York

NEW YORK (AP) — Bingo cheaters beware! The city is set to hire housewives as spies and if they spot skulduggery, your number will be up.

Licenses Commissioner Joel J. Tyler, announcing the plan Sunday, said the women would be undercover agents.

"I'm going to send teams to particular games in each of the boroughs," he said. "It isn't that we suspect any widespread cheating, but some bingo fans become real experts in playing this game. So expert that they win all the time, and they win because they've learned how to cheat."

As for the female spy squad, Tyler commented, "I'm not going to say publicly how many we're going to hire."

The commissioner said the city realized \$800,000 in fees from bingo games last year and quipped a report saying New York State bingo buffs spent \$30.8 million in 1964.

The state gets a \$12.50 fee and the city \$10 for each "occasion" at which the game is played. Bingo games are conducted by many religious organizations and clubs, with volunteers running the games.

Tyler told of his bingo spy plans on the WFN radio program "New York Speaks Out."

### Tollard Tax Rate for the New Year Seen Between 52-56 Mills

The mill rate to be set on this year's proposed budget may be lower than originally expected, according to a study released by the town's finance committee. A 52 to 56 mill rate is now being predicted on the proposed budget.

The prediction is based in part on the proposed sale of bonds for the first phase of the high school and the first year notes. This sale would decrease the proposed 1967-68 budget by about \$100,000, or 5.7 mills.

Also included in the application of surplus town funds, which First Selectman Carmelo Zanghi has promised to announce at tomorrow night's Annual Town Budget Meeting.

Previous estimates had predicted a 60-mill rate, on the proposed \$1,793,138 budget. The budget is offset by \$481,340 in total estimated income, leaving \$1,311,798 to be raised by taxation. The town's gross tax presently stands at \$2,458,945.

The present budget stands at \$1,847,262, with \$983,736 to be raised by taxation. The lion's share of the town's income is due to payments and interest on several new notes. These include \$500,000 first time payment on the high school notes; \$300,000 interest on the second bonded high school (first time) and a first time payment of \$400,000 on the Fleet, Year Notes.

The total school budget stands at \$1,509,292, compared to \$1,050,468 presently, which includes the cost of beginning a kindergarten in September.

The education budget is up 20 per cent including kindergarten, while the total school population will increase by 17 per cent in September.

The Board of Selectmen's budget stands at \$483,416, or 62 per cent over the present \$298,394. This is primarily due to the payments on notes and bonds.

The budget has prompted unprecedented local interest this year, and tomorrow night's meeting to be held at 8 p. m. in the Hicks Memorial School gym, promises a record turnout.

Football Meeting, Postponed: Tomorrow night's meeting of the Men's Football League has been postponed until Thursday at 8 p. m. at the VFW Hall because of the town meeting. All team members have been urged to attend the league meeting, at which the final organization of teams will be made.

### Lone Plane Crash Survivor Is Ready to Return to Job

OTIS AIR FORCE BASE, Mass. (AP) - The lone survivor of the Air Force radar picket plane which crashed off Nantucket Island says he is ready to return to his job.

"I don't know if the aircraft exploded or not," Guest said. "I'm told it did. If it did I don't know how I survived."

"I knew I was in shock when I was in the water," he said, "because I remember being very angry at all boat centers because no boat would come out and pick me up."

"I could see antennae and lights on Nantucket but no boat. And I saw planes overhead, but they weren't doing me any good. I know it was ridiculous to think that way. But the most important thing was when that sling came down from the helicopter."

He said he was in the water, protected by a rubber exposure suit, for about 85 minutes before a Navy helicopter dropped a life and sling to him.

"The water's into a dive and then I leveled off and then we hit something hard," he said.

"The first thing I knew after that I was under water and swimming up toward it. When I broke the surface there was fire all around me. I could hear the sound of the flames and the waves. There wasn't anyone."

Guest said he was at his post in the center of the plane as it prepared to ditch and would tell if the pilot, Col. James P. Lyle, 47, maneuvered the burning craft away from Nantucket toward the open sea.
