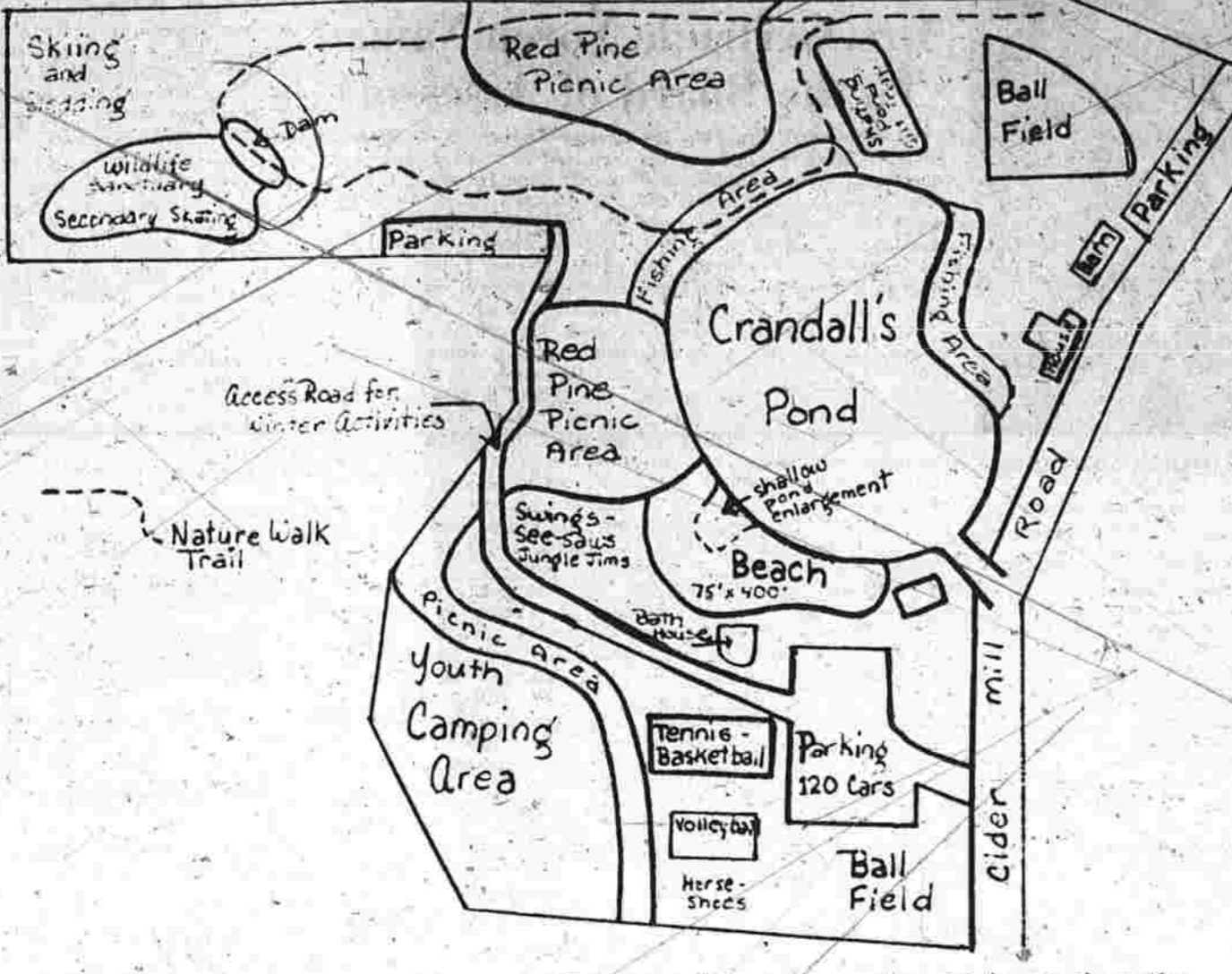

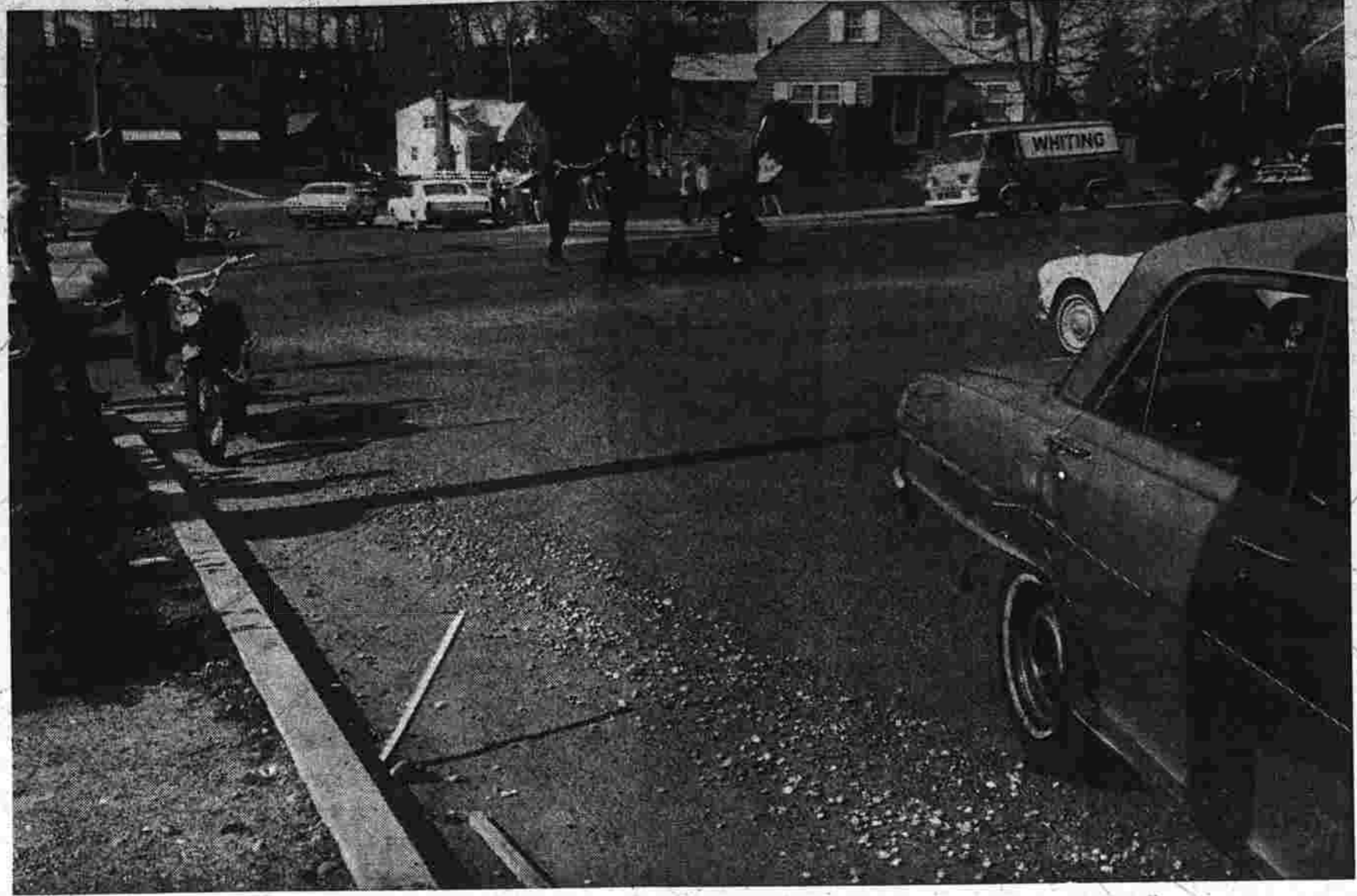

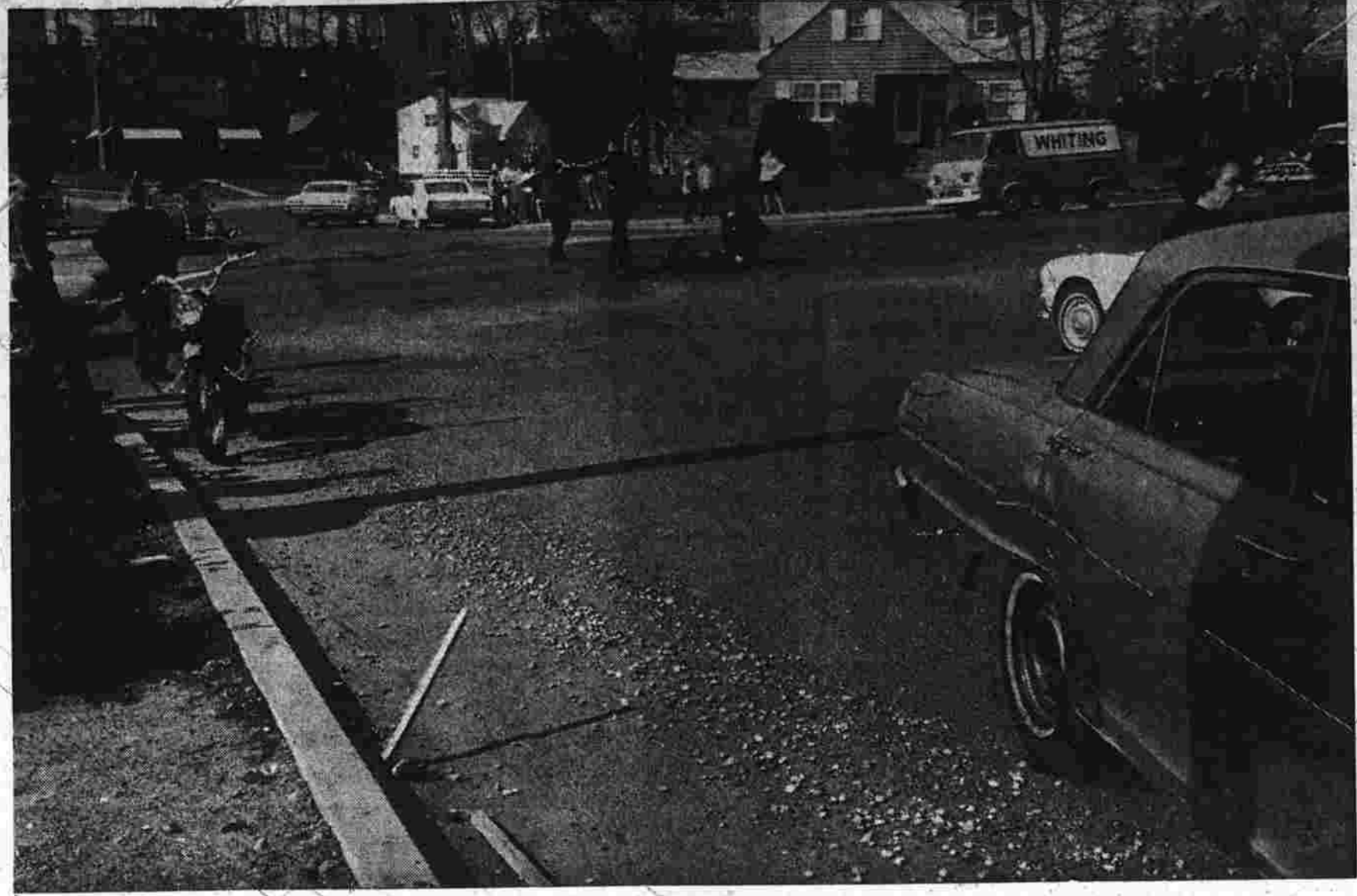

35,000 U.S. Troops To Quit West Germany



WASHINGTON (AP)—The United States, in agreement with Britain and West Germany, announced today plans to withdraw up to 35,000 of its armed forces and four squadrons of combat planes from West Germany.

Johnson administration officials estimated the transfer of soldiers and Air Force personnel together with thousands of dependents, to bases in the United States would mean saving of around \$100 million in the next year.

The total U.S. troop commitment in Europe now is about 280,000 men, including 22,000 ground forces.

Although administration officials said the troop cut would ease the balance of payments burden, they noted the actual savings would be cut by the cost of housing the redeployed forces here and ferrying it between the United States and West Germany each year for rotation and maintenance.

The troops and planes are part of the U.S. commitment to the North Atlantic Treaty Organization. The agreement now must go to the NATO Defense Planning Committee.

To try to balance out other costs West Germany has agreed to invest \$500 million in medium-term government securities between July 7, 1967, and June 1968.

In addition West Germany will spend an estimated \$300 million in U.S. military equipment.

Under the mine three-way plan, Britain would withdraw one brigade of 5,000 men and the funds raised can be used by him to do with as he pleases.

A town should be managed like a home, said Republican Wayne G. Mantz, serving his first term on the town's Board of Directors.

"You have to spend what you can afford. If you can't afford it, that's it."

The father of three, a supervisor in the Agency Dept. of Acta Life & Casualty in Hartford, maintained that just because items in a budget can be justified it does not mean the money should be spent.

"I believe in pay as you go, but I don't believe in bonuses. I guess in that way I'm a conservative," said the crew-cutting College graduate.
