(Continued from Page One) gan under Mr. Clinton, 87 per cent of the voters had recorded their choice. The outcome was expected to be known by noon Thursday — 11 p.m. EDT Wednesday.

Political forecasters predicted Park would be returned for another four-year term by 600,000 votes.

Seoul was calm during early voting. National police guarded each polling place.

The election campaign was described as the most peaceful since Korea gained its independence from Japan 22 years ago.

President Park campaigned on a promise to carry on economic programs he launched under a second five-year program this year. He told the voters South Korea is enjoying political and economic stability such as never before.

Yun accused the government of corruption and promised cleaner government. He also proposed early withdrawal of South Korean troops from Vietnam.

Park has headed the Korean government since 1961 when he came to power in a military coup that put Yun out of the presidency. In the 1963 election Park defeated Yun by a slim margin of 100,000 votes.

### Greek Regime Bars Soccer, Horse Racing

ATHENS, Greece. (AP) — Greece's military government made an about-face today and banned soccer games and horse racing until further notice.

Government-censored newspapers announced Tuesday that the National Soccer League season, which was suspended by the April 21 coup, would be resumed Sunday with eight games in four cities.

Today's newspapers carried a terse announcement by the Ministry of Public Order saying soccer matches "are not yet allowed."

The exact date for the holding of such games will be announced as soon as such a decision is made," the ministry said.

It added that the ban also applied to track and field meets and horse racing.

The reversal appeared to indicate that the military regime had finally concluded gatherings of sports fans would not get out of hand and then changed its mind for reasons that were not made public.

Gatherings of more than five persons are banned under the stage law involved during the coup but the prohibition is not strictly enforced.

DETROIT (AP) — Five years ago as the crowd gaped in horror, a human pyramid collapsed on the high wire in Detroit's State Fair Coliseum and two members of the Great Wallenda circus troupe plunged to their death.

Another lightrope specialist, Marie Wallenda, was paralyzed at the time.

The tragedy drove Karl Wallenda, senior member of the troupe and the greatest of the Great Wallendas, into retirement for a while.

### Events In Capital Cities To Be Chosen

WASHINGTON (AP) — The applications for the "United States" federal money are in and now comes the job of deciding which will be approved, which rejected.

Approvals on applications for planning funds will be announced in about six weeks. H. Keith Taylor, assistant secretary of the Department of Housing and Urban Development, said Tuesday.

Applications had to be mailed prior to midnight Monday. At that time about 100 cities and urban counties had met in their requests but "it is not a final count," Taylor said.

Cities from every state except Delaware and Louisiana have been heard from, he said. "Eleven million dollars is available for planning grants and Congress has been asked by the administration to put up another \$12 million for planning \$40 million in supplementary grants and \$200 million for grants to qualifying urban renewal projects.

### Mechanics Under Fire Special Copter Classes Ready Men for Vietnam

MILLINGTON, Tenn. (AP) — The men who built and the men who fly them are the focus of a new wave of criticism. Below, a busy Marine sergeant wipes his forehead, watches and soaps the men tug at the machine rotor.

"Put your back into it and you'll be a pilot," the sergeant barks. "You're not going to get it. Put pressure on the rotor blade. Pull it, now! Pull!"

The blade slips loose and the men strain to get it back to work. The blade came out, but the time lag must be cut.

There aren't any bullets ping-ping into the side of the copter. The men are not in danger of a hot side mortar round crumping in. Just 17 miles south along the four-lane highway in Memphis, there is no need for bars on windows to keep out students or search and snafu teams to stalk snipers.

### Lynd Seeks Leave from Yale Duties

NEW HAVEN (AP) — Yale Professor Lynd has requested and received a year's leave from his duties at the university to work without pay for the Chicago Organizing School, described as a recently formed activist training center.

Lynd, who attracted international attention when he made an unauthorized trip to North Vietnam in December 1965, had been told by Yale's History Department that his chances for return were "diminishing" according to the Yale Daily News.

The professor is now on a one-year leave of absence. The newspaper said that Lynd was told by History Department Chairman John M. Blum that a second consecutive year away from Yale would force the department to "consider your case on the basis of less evidence about your teaching and your involvement in Yale affairs which the members of the department would otherwise have."

Lynd's passport was revoked for his trip to North Vietnam in defiance of State Department regulations.

He and his wife Alice have refused to pay part of his federal income tax as a protest against the United States war effort.

**Old Days? These Days Are the Best**

NEW YORK (AP) — Confused and dismayed by the hazards and hurries of now, many a human heart likes an occasion to retreat into yesterday.

Memory throws a glamour over the past, softening its harsh edges and omitting its pitfalls.

"Remember the good old days?" one oldtimer wistfully asks another. And each instantly recalls the golden days. Each forgets that yesterday had a harshness as well as a luster—just as every time in history has had "including now."

What was so terribly, terribly good about those so-called "good old days?"

Looked at honestly, they presented quite an ordeal of survival. The big wonder is that anyone lived to tell their tale.

The good old days were really better for germs than for people. Tuberculosis and pneumonia and the infectious diseases of childhood cut short the journey of life more effectively than heart attacks and cancer do now.

Was life really more stirring in any previous generation? In those good old days when?

The farm vote controlled the politics of the nation.

Everything had to be done by hand. Rugs were beaten by hand. Cars and telephones were created by hand. Lenses were cut by the power of the two-hand pump.

Kids spent most of their time between November and April scratching the itchiness caused by wearing long woolen underwear.

If a youngster got caught in an innocent fib or said a bad word out loud, he was immediately grabbed by the ear and had his mouth washed out with yellow laundry soap. This custom was so prevalent that, if you look closely at any man over 60 today, the odds are that you will find one of his earlobes is longer than the other.

Orange juice was never taken for its flavor or vitamin value. It most generally served as a camouflage for the unpalatable taste of castor oil.

There were more miles than motor cars in America, and the roads were built for mules, not wheels — dusty in summer, mud-rutted in spring and autumn, snow-covered in winter.

Everybody talked about the weather then but did little about it, because air-conditioning was only a dream.

People seemed to spit indoors as often as they did outdoors. Saloons and banks prided themselves on their massive and brightly polished cuspidors. By most desks in most offices there also was a smaller, less grandly cuspidor, sometimes but not always replaced on a rubber mat that was put there to catch the errors.

Life for a woman was one long struggle against insects — mites in her children's hair, moths in her closets, flies laying eggs in any particle of food that she left uncovered.

The best that the federal government could think of to do for the average citizen was to mail him a free packet of seeds now and then.

Everything cost less, but no matter how cheap it was most Americans didn't have the money to buy it.

The good old days? Nonsense. Today is still the best of all times to live — if for no other reason than that, after all, it is here to be enjoyed, and a day thurs pms

The listeners leaned forward. You knew something was up just by watching them. All eyes were on Africa and Russia.

"Of course, we know so much about Russia now," said Africa.

"What with the cultural exchange and all. It is a shame we don't have a cultural exchange with Africa. We know so little about the dark and mysterious culture there. Unless, of course, you've been there."

It was a beautiful message about Africa.

"Truly, it would be helpful," said Russia. "But Africa is a simple continent it would seem, compared to the complexities of the U.S.A., and, of course, the enormous power of the Soviets to influence world affairs, and even our lives. But Africa must have a primitive beauty all of its own — lions and tigers and such."

"There are no tigers in Africa," said Africa in mild disgust. "Tigers are native to India."

The point went to Russia. Africa had let emotions rule judgment, and had not exercised propriety.

The score was still tied when I went to the kitchen to mix another drink. When I came back, the only seat open was an old dining room chair at the opposite end of the room. I had to walk between the spectators and the contestants, turned and sat down abruptly.

"Too abruptly for the old dining room chair. Without so much as a pause at least I've it plunged on toward the floor with arms and legs — mine and the chair's — flying."

It took about five minutes to mop up debris. When I had made the 5th apology, I looked around. The man at the music and the pretty lady were talking about the time he had demonstrated a chair at the Open House. A man at the other end recalled with laughter how he had gotten stuck once in a sofa.

And three people were saying my prefall was the most marvelous they had ever seen in their lives.

Africa and Russia were staring intently at each other, alone on the couch. I heard Africa say, "Between us, we've traveled 20,000 miles for strange places and seen strange things. I fail to see what's so amusing about a clown and a broken chair. I'll tell you what's wrong with the world today: People have lost their sense of humor."

My wife says there's moral in this somewhere.

### Agencies in Dispute On Renewal Housing

Two agencies, the Manchester Housing Authority and the MISAC Corporation have come to grips over the availability of a parcel of land in the North End Redevelopment area. Both want the land for the building of apartments.

The matter came up at the MISAC meeting and the meeting of the Board of Directors, both held last night.

The piece of land in question is a tract of about five acres at the northwest corner of N. Main and N. School Sts. (Resigned). The MHA wants to put up apartments for the elderly there; the newly formed chartered MISAC Corporation wants the land for the building of units to accommodate moderate-income families. The land is owned by the federal government and is under direct control of the Manchester Redevelopment Agency.

The MHA apartments, which are tentatively scheduled for start of construction in late summer, would be of the garden-type, similar to the units off Bluefield Dr. About 70 units are planned.

Theodore Brindamour, chairman of the MHA, at a meeting of the Board of Directors last night that "a letter of intent" reached the MHA yesterday from the redevelopment agency. He said this was the first official commitment offered.

Brindamour said the letter of intent stipulates that the town of Manchester must approve the sale, and also the Town Planning Commission. At the North End Apts. Town Board of Directors meeting May 4, Arnold Klau, executive secretary of MISAC, accused the Manchester Redevelopment Agency (MRA) of "running a private business, without concern for the public's opinion of their decisions."

He appeared to protest the MRA decision to sell the North End Redevelopment parcel to the Manchester Housing Authority without first giving MISAC a chance to negotiate for the same parcel.

Klau presented a time table of MISAC activities from March 22, 1966 to May 1, 1967, the day on which the MRA made its decision.

He protested the alleged treatment given to MISAC by the MRA and said that it wasn't fair to the church bodies of the seven participating churches.

MISAC, a non-profit, non-stock corporation, plans to construct moderate-income housing in the \$100 per month rental bracket.

Klau charged that the MRA has conducted no public hearings on proposals for North End housing and for a shopping center.

He said, "If it is the MRA policy to make land available to whom they wish—it is not right."

He asked the board to determine whether North End Redevelopment is for the benefit of the people of Manchester or for the benefit of the members of the Manchester Redevelopment Agency.

The board last night set May 16 as the date for a joint meeting with the MRA and the Town Planning Commission to discuss progress of North End Redevelopment.

The MRA came in for criticism from several other sources last night at the board meeting.

Dr. A. B. Moran nudged the directors to "tell the MRA to hurry up with Renewal so that I will know when and if I must move my office."

Mrs. Barbara Sanzo warned that the town is losing tax revenues because of the slow pace of renewal.

And Democratic Director Francis Mahony charged that the MRA "is dragging its feet."

His charge was made during a discussion of a proposed Recreation Park Swimming Pool.

"If they (the MRA) don't get going and if we wait for them to get off the ground, there may be no pool even next year," he warned.

Thieves Identified LONDON (AP) - Three known London criminals have been identified through photographs by two guards and a truckdriver as the thieves who hijacked \$2.1 million in gold bars from an armored truck Monday.

Scotland Yard said it was the first break in the manhunt search for the men who overpowered the driver and guards in a daylight ambush. None of the three wore a mask. Police at docks and airports were given photographs of the three suspects and told to grab them on sight. Detectives circulated the pictures among underworld informers. Police believe the stolen gold, weighing 2 1/2 tons, has been hidden in one spot until the case cools down. Then, police speculate, the gold is likely to be melted down for sale in small quantities.

Captain Blamed MONROVIA, Liberia (AP) - A Liberian investigating board says the Italian captain of the supertanker Torrey Canyon was solely responsible for the wreck that spilled 36 million gallons of oil into the sea, fouling British and French beaches and doing enormous damage to marine and bird life. The three-member board recommended Tuesday that the license of Capt. Francesco Ragusa be revoked because of alleged negligence in "one of the major ship disasters in maritime history."

The 61,000-ton tanker drove onto a reef off the southwest tip of Englewood March 18. Ragusa, 66, has been licensed by the Liberian government since 1968.

Nasser Hits U.S. CAIRO (AP) - President Gamal Abdel Nasser denounced the United States Tuesday night as "the leader of anti-revolutionary forces everywhere, here and in the Middle East at large."

The concept of the Americas is so great that they want the entire world to say yes," Nasser asserted in a Workers' Day address.

Nasser praised Yemad President Abdullah Al Sallal for arresting two Americans, Stephen Louis Grand Prix, Ind. and Harold Hartman of Baltimore, Md. They have been accused of firing bazooka shells at an ammunition dump in Ta'iz.

"America works in every field against revolutionaries," Nasser said. "Of course, they don't say anything about shooting bazooka shells into ammunition dumps in Yemen."

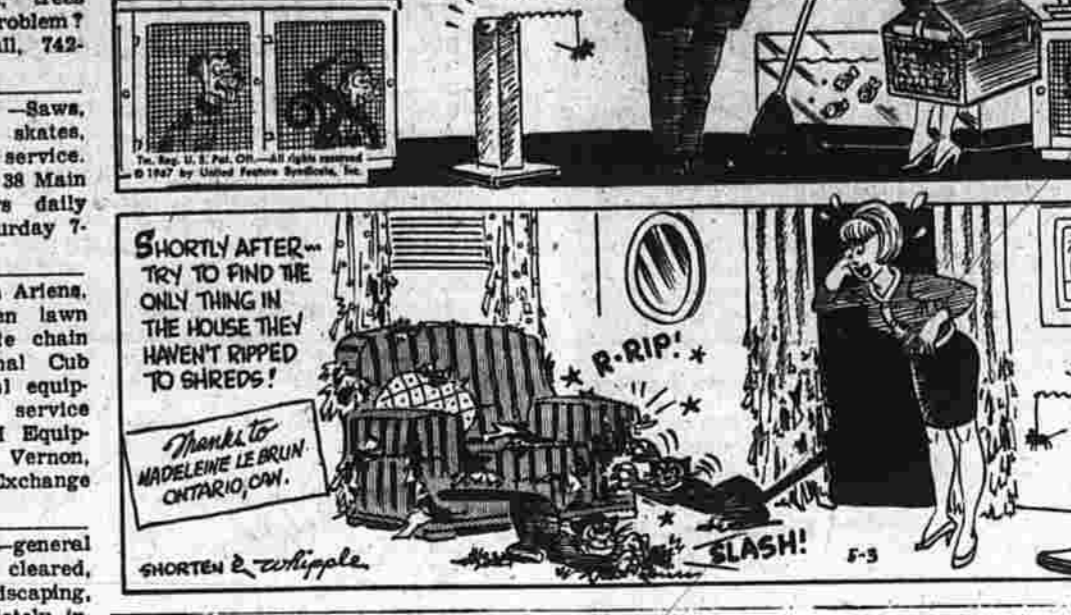
