LBJ Offers Plan To Bar Rail Strike

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Johnson proposed new legislation today to avert a nationwide railroad strike by pressing for a voluntary wage settlement within 30 days, but imposing a two-year ban on strikes by law if necessary.

Johnson's proposal would apply only to the current labor dispute involving six railroad unions, but the President said: "We continue and renew our search for a just and general solution to emergency strike or lockout problems in our country."

Johnson would name a five-man board under his rail legislation to spread the first 30 days in intensive mediation toward a voluntary agreement, the next 30 days in hearings and the final 30 days in more mediation.

The petition will be presented along with many copies of the water to Governor John Dempsey and the State Legislature, the group said.

The petition states that the signers are petitioning the elected representatives to intercede to correct "a deplorable and unbearable water situation."

It charges that the Connecticut Water Company, despite repeated complaints on citizens' behalf, has furnished customers with water containing algae and other foreign matter resulting in poor quality water which has discovered bathroom fixtures.

The petition asserted that on a number of occasions the Public Utilities Commission has been requested by customers of the water company to make the steps be taken to remedy the situation.

of trumps with each hand, de- clare should begin by playing correct line of play to draw exactly two rounds of trumps and then go about your business in the side suits. It is a mistake to draw the wrong number of trumps or to allow the opponents to do this for you.

Opening lead—jack of hearts.

West led the jack of hearts, and declarer won in dummy with the king. He led a trump to the ace and then led a low trump. West won with the queen of spades and drew a third round of trumps with the king. This third round of trumps was to prove declarer's undoing.

West then returned to hearts, forcing out South's ace. Since only one trump remained in dummy, South could ruff one of his two low hearts. He eventually lost a heart and a club in addition to the two trump trumps already given up.

South should draw two rounds of trumps to prevent an opponent from overruffing with a doubleton in trumps. South does not mind an overruff by an opponent with three trumps since that will take the place of the trump that the opponent is sure to win.

Marines Capture Third Viet Hill

SAIGON (AP) — The U.S. Marines took Hill 881 North today, the last of three border peaks that have cost the Leathernecks nearly 1,000 dead and wounded and the Communists an estimated 1,000 killed in 12 days of some of the hardest fighting of the Vietnam war.

U.S. officers in Chi Nung announced that the peak of the hill was occupied at 2:30 p.m. by a Marine company that met only "light resistance" in the final assault. This indicated that the North Vietnamese had pulled out of their entrenched positions, possibly slipping across the Laotian border just below the demilitarized zone.

Elsewhere in South Vietnam's northern sector, the South Vietnamese reported their second success this week in the Hue area 40 miles south of the demilitarized zone. A spokesman said a battalion of the Vietnamese Army's 1st Division and a company of guerrillas into a vice with another government force. The guerrillas had murdered personnel carriers Thursday. U.S. Army helicopter gunships joined in the battle, and 80 guerrillas were killed and five captured, the spokesman said.

Two days before government troops reported killing 150 guerrillas in an all-out battle northwest of Hue.

Poor weather limited U.S. efforts to only 68 missions over North Vietnam Thursday. But U.S. Air Force planes returned to the Hanoi area to bomb the electrical transformer site seven miles north of the city again, and Col. Robin Olds of Washington, D.C., shot down his second MIG. 37.9 Mill Tax Rate Adopted by Directors

Record High Budget Reaches \$10,620,126

In an atmosphere more reminiscent of a courtroom than a hearing room, the board of directors early this morning adopted a record-high \$10,620,126 General Fund budget for the 1967-68 fiscal year and voted a 37.9 mill tax rate.

The vote was 6 to 0, with the Republicans voting "yes" and the Democrats abstaining. The board of education is getting \$294,343 less than it requested but still \$429,890 more than its current appropriation.

The directors also voted a 6 to 0 vote to approve the current budget for the fiscal year 1967-68 and set a 3.52 mill tax rate. They cut \$29,028 from Weiss' recommended \$60,000 budget and lowered his recommended 3.65 mill tax rate by 13 mills, or 71 cents per \$100 of assessed value in the fiscal year 1967-68.

The 1967-68 budget is \$706,277, 71 per cent above the current year's budget of \$400,000. It is \$1,218,852 over the 1966-67 budget of \$487,425. The 37.9 mill tax rate means that each \$1,000 of assessment equals \$37.90 in General Fund taxes.

Air Force Makes Rescue

DA NANG, Vietnam (AP) — Seven survivors from the wrecked American schooner *Dante Deo* were brought to Da Nang tonight and the leader of a group said, "The ground crew found them." The schooner was reported to have been on a scientific expedition when she was wrecked on the northeast coast of South Vietnam.

A U.S. Air Force amphibian plane flew to the islands, after distress signals were received, and made the rescue.

Six survivors were rescued and one was killed. The survivors were the only persons aboard the *Dante Deo* when she ran aground.

All survivors brought to Da Nang appeared to be in good health.
