Again, More Troops Needed There is not very much point, as we face up to reports that General Westmoreland is now asking another substantial increase in the total number of troops for Vietnam, in recalling all the various stages of the war at which various other numbers were considered

maximum numbers. Now the new maximum number needed to "do the job" is said to be 600,000. There was a time when it was 50,000, and a time it was 100,000. Most recently, it was supposed to be around

The figures of our supposed maximum need are variable. But there is in the situation, and has been from the beginning, one calculation which has remained constant. It is a calculation which, however reliable and constant it has been repeatedly proved to be in fact, has never seemed to make its way into the acknowledged planning of our own military. The constant is this: that the more

troops we send to Vietnam the more we

There are several factors which contribute to this odd state of affairs. First, the enemy always responds with some escalation of his own. When we first began shipping our own fighting men into South Vietnam, the number of North Vietnamese troops in Now there are perhaps as many as 50,000 to 70,000. Lately, the enemy has created something of a military manpower shortage for us merely by deploying some additional men in posttions from which they might begin to

enter South Vietnam. Second, the more men we have in Vietnam, the greater the instinct of our commanders to do more with them and fight a more conclusive kind of war. For a time, we were fighting guerrilla warfare against guerrillas. We acknowledged, then, it was not a war in which erritory counted for very much. Latey, we have begun trying to hold and secure territory, which involves a different kind of operation, and much greater military manpower. Symbolicalv. the heaviest casualties of the war have just been sustained in a battle to capture one specific piece of territory,

Faced with escalating strategies or the part of the enemy, tempted by more earth-securing strategies of their own, our generals are asking for more men. And the chief theory they advance san finish the job more quickly. From their position, that is the only

procedure which makes sense for them.

In that position, they do not seem capable of recognizing the peculiar quality of this war, which is that the more men and power we bring in to finish the job, the bigger the job seems to get. This is the way early critics of our nvolvément, including many generals themselves, always said it would be, but something the civilian hawks in Washngton and now the commanding generals on the scene have never managed to believe. It is a terrible kind of escaation in which we are involved, in which the harder we fight the bigger the war becomes, and the more quickly we try to end it the longer it seems fated to last. Everything seems to have an effect opposite to that intended, opposite to that supposed to come from the strategy and policy being employed. Whenever anybody finds himself in such a situation, the supposition is that he may possibly be doing something

Lester Maddox, who went from closing up a fried chicken restaurant rather than serve Negroes in it to getting himself elected Governor of the great state of Georgia, has had people guessing ever since he assumed office. The first conclusion everybody was

willing to reach about him was that he was a rather ignorant little fellow, not in any way equipped, educated or trainas those of a governor.

The second conclusion, which began following uncomfortably close on the beels of the first one, was that Gover-

nor Maddox might conceivably be smarter than he looks or acts. Lately, analysis of Governor Maddox has been growing a little more sophisticated, and it has been taking what should be considered definitely a very hopeful, perhaps even a thrillingly hope-

ful turn. Whether he is merely playing his cards close, in deference to his own careful feeling of inadequacy, or obeying some deep, inbred philosophy of his own, the pattern of conduct some observers now see emerging could be something terrific.

It has been observed that Governor Maddox is exceptionally responsive to pleas, arguments, presentations or needs so long as they relate to some particular single individual, but that he clams up, and seems to close his ears and the state's time and purse whenever he finds himself confronted with somebody who is organized. It seems to be part of his own instinctive reaction that he wants nothing to do with any group, or bloc, or committee, or self-fancied "establishment."

Because he so conspicuously refuses

to take his direction and governing orders from these various organizations who fancy themselves the worth and the power of life in Georgia, he is under some attack, from these quarters, for what they benevolently call "lack of leadership." If he let them tell him what to do, of course, they would be saluting him for his "dynamic leadership." But there are enough unorganized people in Georgia to create at least some small area of appreciation for what the new Governor may be trying to do. How refreshing it might be, and how advantageous for all the good causes of our time, if we could get rid of that habit of organizing which deadens their appeal, perverts their principle, and tries to standardize their ad-
