She also indicated the prospect of forming a breakaway, rival GOP women's group.

Mrs. Schlafly scheduled a news conference today to discuss the protest she is filing with Bliss over "the illegality and irregularity" of the election procedure at the two-day convention which ended Saturday.

Personally I prefer the spelling I have employed since the sound comes out the same in French, German, Italian, Spanish, and even the Scandinavian languages, and only slightly wrong in English. The pronunciation is Chos-KOFF-shay in English and you may find it spelled that way on a program.

This problem arises with all Russian composers. Commonly we are now used to seeing their names spelled phonetically in German since most of their works were originally published by German publishers.

People who explore the field of serious music almost invariably find Tchaikovsky the most readily assimilable composer, and frequently go overboard in buying recordings of his works.

Pianist Signs Lifetime Pact

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Earl (Fats) Hines, the piano great who has delighted jazz fans for 40 years, has signed a contract giving him \$20,000 a year as long as he lives.

The contract was offered by Leonard V. Martin, owner of The Cannery, a dining and shopping center, including the open-air early fall near famed Fisherman's Wharf.

His single violin concerto is extremely popular and very well written for the instrument. It is fashionable for violinists to sneer at the work, but I'll take it whenever I can hear it.

There are a number of tone poems like "Romeo and Juliet," and Tchaikovsky wrote two very excellent operas, "Eugene Onegin" and "Pique Dame," which are thoroughly neglected in this country.

The first should be pronounced "EV-yeen OH-NYAY-yeen," which "Pique Dame" means the Queen of Spades in French. If you run into either one you'll be likely to hear it in any language but Russian.

After serving in Monteville, Bristol and Myrtle churches, he entered the Army Chaplain's Corps in 1937. He was at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, when the Japanese attacked in 1941. He served in Guadalcanal and Solomon Islands, and won the Distinguished Service Cross and the Bronze Star Medal and the Presidential Unit Citation.

He was chaplain of the Medway Theater of Operation from 1946 to 1947, when he was assigned to the Communist General Staff College at Ft. Leavenworth, Kan. He transferred to the Air Force in 1948 and was named staff chaplain of the Continental Air Command, Mitchell Field, N. Y. in 1950. He was assigned to Headquarters, Far East Forces. For his work in Japan he was awarded the Legion of Honor by the United States and the United Nations awarded him its citation for meritorious service.

Under the pact Hines, 62, agrees to work 10 months a year at The Cannery and is free to arrange outside tours the other months.

Hines, who lives in Oakland with his wife and two daughters, commented Sunday, "I didn't think this could ever happen to a jazz musician. I hope this contract will be the shape of things to come for other jazz musicians throughout the world."

Sex Education in School Urged by Student Panel

MERIDEN (AP) — Sex, including those who oppose abortion, drugs, the draft, schools and the community were discussion topics of 300 Connecticut high school junior and seniors at a college freshmen Sunday. A student panel considering human values and sex unanimously called for increased sex education in schools, beginning as early as kindergarten.

Most panelists thought birth control and abortion laws should be liberalized, but a minority said they thought wide availability of both control information could lead to promiscuity.

Alcohol and drug problems grow out of educational failure and a lack of communication between youths and adults, another panelist concluded. Addicts, the panel agreed, should be treated as sick persons, not as criminals.

Another panelist said that the voting age should be lowered to the present draft age, and that there should be no set legal age for dropping out of school. Students need more vocational and specialized training institutions, the panel said.

Some panelists said there should be no student deferment from the draft. Other thought there should be no universal draft before the completion of college.

The panelists agreed unanimously, however, that draft officials should recognize rights of conscientious objectors, in-

schools should have student-faculty committees to deal effectively with student problems.

Also, the panel agreed, families ought to "hold more discussions just like we have here."

The conference was sponsored by the State Development Commission on Youth Service. Connecticut's electric companies and the State Labor Council, AFL-CIO.

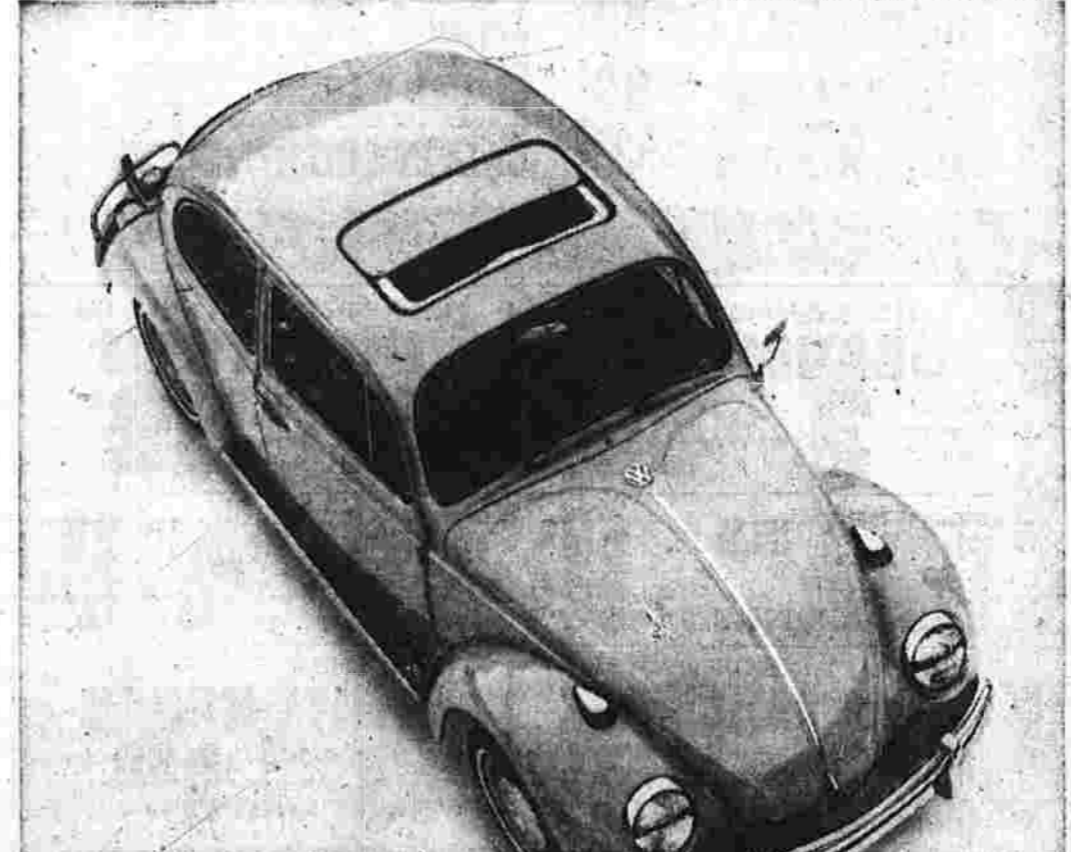


Week Devoted to Public Works Crews

Joseph R. Tamsky outlined the functions of the Town Planning Commission which consists of five members and three alternates, all from property owners concerned with the development of the town. He stressed the importance of the plan in guiding the town's growth and development. The plan is a living document that must be kept current to reflect changes in the town's needs and circumstances.

Tax Relief for the Elderly Seen Preventing Relocation

The values of the various tax relief for the elderly proposals presently before the legislature last night on the television program, "Connecticut Issue," State Sen. David Barry of Manchester stressed the importance of state subsidies to the towns for revenue lost to the towns through proposals for elderly tax relief. Three proposals received serious consideration on the program, including the freezing of the property tax when the property owner becomes 65, without the placement of a lien against the property, and the proposal to provide a set tax exemption on the value of the property of those age 65 or over. The third proposal, advocated by representatives of senior citizen groups, was the providing of a state tax exemption on "essential items." Walter Adams, president of the Connecticut Council of Senior Citizens, Inc., felt the sales tax would reach a greater proportion of the elderly, benefiting the poor as well as the property owner. The proposals to relieve the property tax burden on the elderly are aimed at permitting them to live in their own home, while maintaining the community relationships they have built up over the years. The alternative to this is to provide public housing for the elderly, described as "geriatric ghettos" by State Rep. Richard McCarthy of Waterbury. Benefit of Home Dr. James F. Brown, moderator of the program, pointed out that the elderly derive greater benefit from staying in their homes, where they can continue to participate in their community. The real answer would be the strengthening of Social Security and old age assistance benefits, providing them with more income to pay their taxes. He advocated the promotion of part-time work for the elderly, and the creation of sheltered workshops, where they could do work on a sub contract basis. Adams stated "It's cheaper for the state to maintain these people in their own homes, than in public housing. It also leaves the elderly with a feeling of personal dignity." Barry pointed out that relief of the property tax burden on those with a fixed income would enable the elderly to approve of new proposals within the town. Many elderly citizens in Manchester voted against downtown renewal, he said, because they were afraid they could not support the increase in the property tax it would cause. Tax Burden Shift McCarthy foresees a shifting in the tax burden to younger segments of society. Young people are concerned over the welfare of their parents and grandparents. Adams replied that the elderly are willing to pay their way, as much as possible, and are as concerned about their children as themselves. The elderly are not "too strongly behind the tax exemption bills," according to Adams. "They are worried about the inflationary effect on the towns and the state" caused by the bills, and are "cautious about this." He predicted the elderly devices as copper bracelets or would go along with a tax freeze for the elderly.
