Bad News From "The Other War" The bluest news out of Vietnam in a long time concerns what seems to be a sudden but general acknowledgment of collapse of success and hope in what

has been described as "the other war." This is the war for the minds and hearts and loyalties of the Vietnamese people. It is the war that even President Johnson, for all his predilection for the military solutions, has repeatedly recognized as crucial. It is the side of the war which determines whether there is ever going to be anything for us to leave behind us in Vietnam if we ever pull out. It is the side of the war which is to determine whether, whatever we may do to North Vietnam, the Vietcong are to remain, in South Vietnam, as strong and as certain of eventual political triumph as they were when we first started fighting this war with American troops.

This "other war" has had a succession of titles and blueprints. In the latest, it is known as the RD program, with RD standing for revolutionary development. It has featured the training of South Vietnamese cadres for the purpose of going out into the villages presumably made secure by American military success, and then winning over the peasants in these villages by polides of land reform and agricultural techniques not dissimilar to those being introduced by the Vietcong.

This was the program supposed to be pepped up by the new team President Johnson is sending to Vietnam. But this is how a Christian Science Monitor correspondent quoted a Vietna-

mese officer about the program the "The RD program has failed. It's too late to salvage it. It can still appear to work for a while-but it is only an illumion. Our RD cadres are not good

enough—they are supposed to be revolutionaries, but they're only draft dodgers. And now we have a problem recruiting enough to meet our 1967 quota. "Even worse, there is not enough security in the village for the cadres to work well. We need a new strategy of how to secure the countryside and to win over the peasant. But no American or Vietnamese leader has even started

to think about that yet." The same dispatch from Saigon gives three reasons why the RD program is not working.
