Four Families Homeless After Portland Fire

Today's bridge hand will do nothing to change your fundamental beliefs. If you believe in insurance, the hand will confirm your faith; if you are a skeptic, the hand will prove the value of skepticism. You come out by the same door as you went in.

Opening lead—queen of clubs. West opened the queen of clubs, and Ernie Keller, Los Angeles insurance executive, saw his chance to make a sales pitch. "I just want to show you the value of insurance," he remarked, as he won with the ace of clubs and carefully returned the four of trumps.

East won with the eight of spades and hastened to cash the ace of hearts. West signaled encouragement with the eight of hearts, and East continued with a heart to the jack. Now the defenders were at the end of their tether. A heart continuation would accomplish nothing, since dummy would ruff. West would not draw trumps and run the diamonds.

Quite a rare deal, but Keller was quite correct in making his insurance play on the first round of an early round. He clearly made the mistake of taking his three top trumps. Quite a skeptical about insurance, you might play the hand at three notrump. The defenders can take four hearts, but the rest are yours.

Keller has a comment about this, too. The odds are about 2 to 1 against a 4-4 break in hearts. If the hearts break some other way, the opponents could almost surely take enough heart tricks to defeat three notrump. Four spades is a far better contract, he insists. "Provided, of course," he reminds you, "that you won't mind paying a small premium."

South Windsor Democrat Group Criticizes Council Efforts on Water

The Democrats for Better Government has questioned the efforts of the town council of South Windsor in the past two or three years to improve water service in South Windsor.

In a prepared statement issued today, the group said the council's efforts to date have produced only "temporary corrective measures."

The issue arose after reports of petitions being circulated in town to the governor and the state legislature complaining of the quality of the water and the service supplied by the Connecticut Water Company were made public.

The committee also said that the council had approved a plan to install a water tower on a 12-foot pipe near the town hall, but that the second tower had been erected in receiving signals as opposed to a lower installation. Atty. Donnelly also claimed the building permit was erroneously and improperly issued since the tower would not be within 40 feet of the rear property line and the application for the second tower had been denied by the zoning board of appeals last month and therefore the building inspection was powerless to override the decision.

Atty. Donnelly said the town building inspector Donnell had stated that the tower was a "duty bound" one that he felt no provisions in the zoning regulations were applicable to the tower and that it was a subordinate use under the regulations.

Speaking in defense of the zoning regulations, Joseph C. DeLoach, chairman of the zoning and zoning regulations, said he was not for or against the applicant. However, he was not in favor of a precedent being established that a permit was issued for a water tower on a 12-foot pipe. The request of Howard A. Holm, 429 Niederweller Rd., for a variance for a water tower to be built on a 12-foot pipe was also approved. The variance is in an R-40 zone. The board ruled that the action is brought about by the efforts of the council of the Public Utilities Commission or any other group is unimportant.

"We promise that we will get immediate, positive results in one way or another," the committee said.

"If councilman Pitts is concerned with who will get credit for correcting this injustice, the members of the Democrats for Better Government will gladly allow him to present our petition to the government," the group noted.

A meeting on the water issue will be held by the Democrats for Better Government group at the A-2 plaza, Sullivan Ave., Wapping, at 8 p.m. tonight.

ZBA Tower Decision
The zoning board of appeals has ruled to uphold a decision of the building inspector on the question of a building permit issued to Alfred F. Yacono to erect two radio-television towers in his rear yard at 177 Clinton Dr., Wapping.

Yacono requested a variance from the zoning board of appeals some months ago to allow the installation of an amateur radio antenna tower on his premises. The variance was granted at that time on the condition that the base of the tower be located within 40 feet of the rear property line of the property and that a building permit was obtained for the installation of the tower.

However, last month a petition by Yacono to allow the installation of a second tower on his property was denied by the ZBA on the grounds that undue hardship was not evident. A building permit was secured by Yacono to erect two towers, one to be located in the same place as specified in the request for the second variance and the other some 65 feet from the rear boundary of his property. Both applicants were for towers, not an antenna, however.

Atty. Donnelly, representing some 18 property owners in the area of Yacono's property, argued that the application for the building inspector's decision was based on the issuance of a building permit. He said that the zoning regulations were most pertinent to the appeal and specified the use of the land in question.

The real issue in the case, Connolly said, is whether a tower is an accessory use in the zone in question. When the building code and zoning regulations conflict, the zoning law governs the building code in such matters, Atty. Donnelly said.

Tax Exemption For Servicemen Asked in State
HARTFORD (AP) — An injunction will be sought next month by the federal government in an effort to restrain Connecticut from collecting sales or use taxes from out-of-state military personnel on duty in the state.

Judge M. Joseph Blumenthal Monday set June 5 as the date for the hearing and at the same time reserved decision on a defendant's motion to dismiss the case.

The government wants a court ruling that servicemen are exempt from the tax under the terms of the Soldiers and Sailors Civil Relief Act of 1940.

The injunction would specifically enjoin the state from collecting a 2% tax from Navy Lt. Stanley Schuman of Nebraska. He is protesting the tax imposed on a boat he uses for pleasure while living in Connecticut.

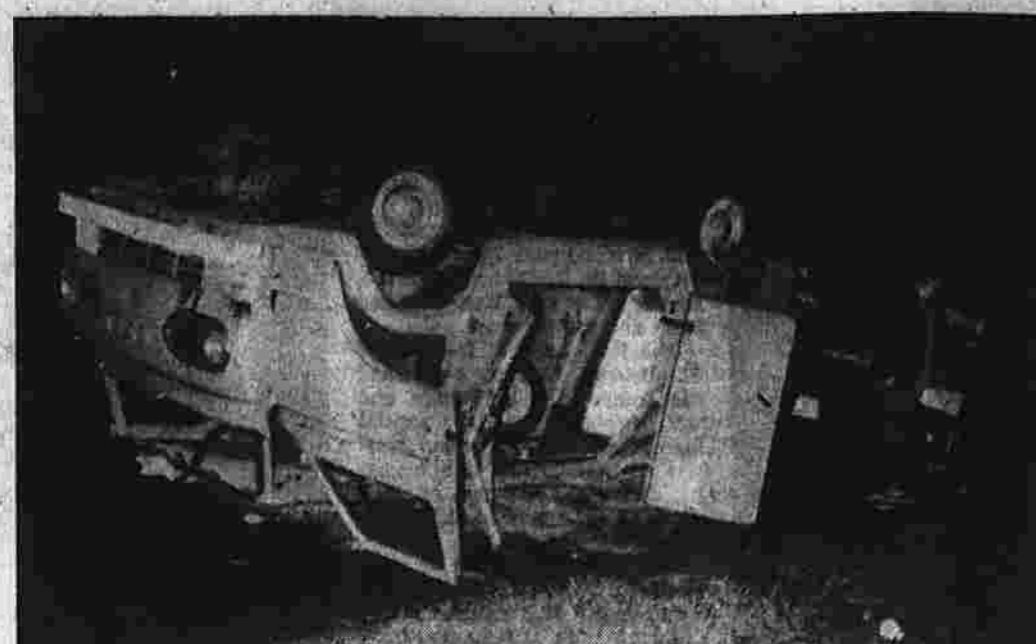

Becker said the state stands 48th of the 50 states in the percentage of income which goes for education. "I think we should be ashamed of this," he added.

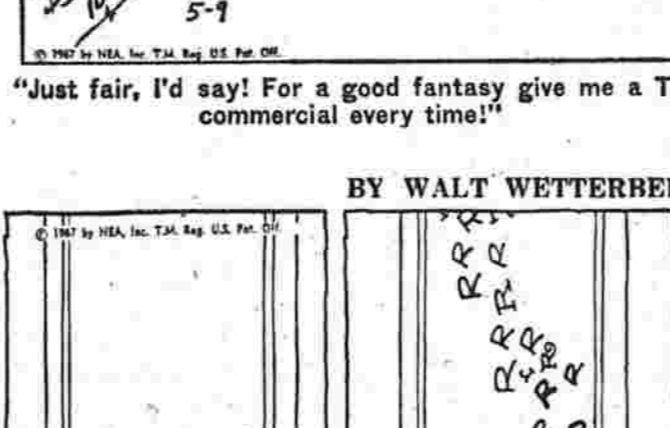

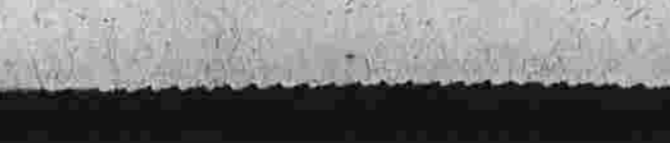

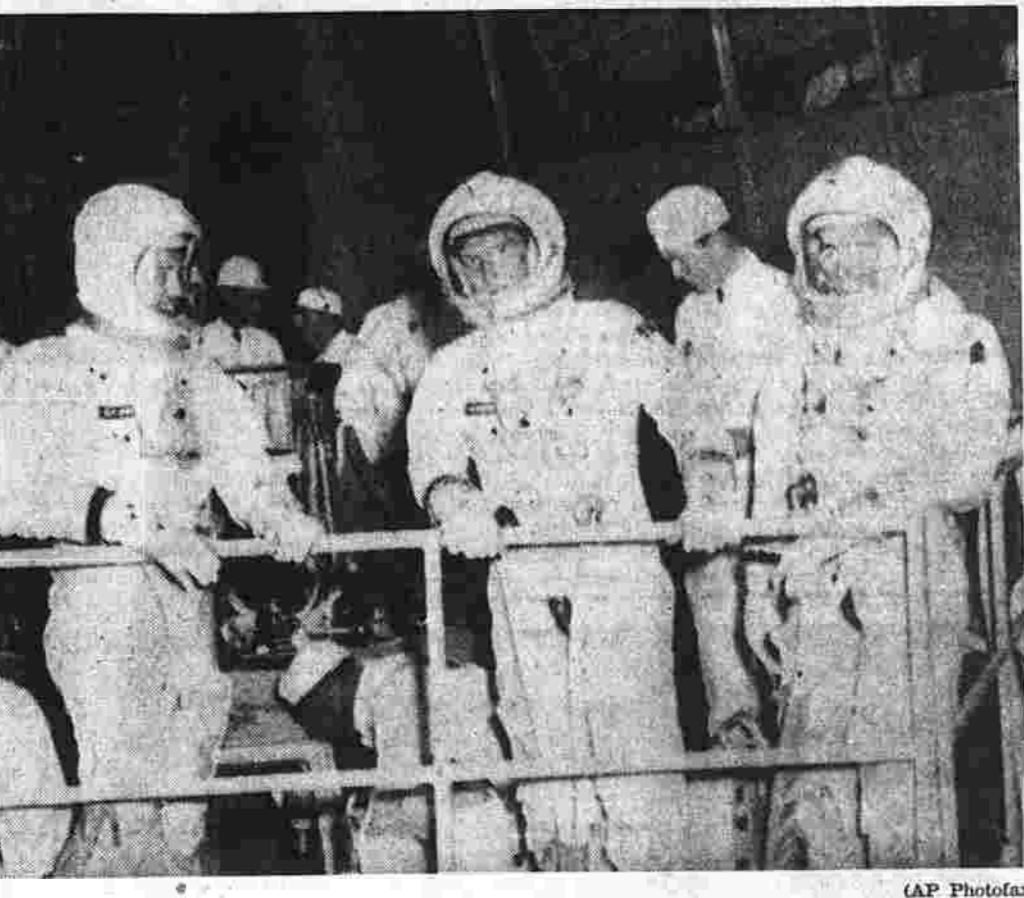
