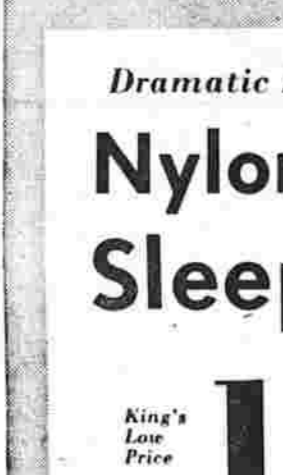

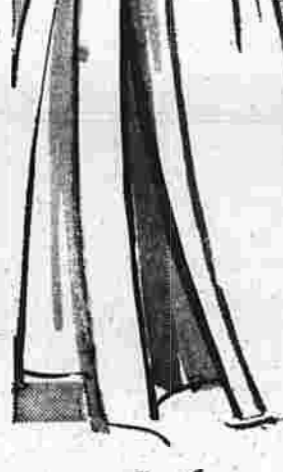

The final confrontation began when William Kenech, a security officer, told the group seated on the grass: "Ladies and gentlemen, we would like you to leave."

The protesters then stood silently in a circle for 10 minutes and headed for the entrance and the waiting U.S. marshals.

Broadford Lytle, a spokesman for the group, protested as he was taken aboard that he had volunteered to leave of his own volition. Nevertheless, he was hustled into the bus with an officer at each entrance.

Lytle shouted through bars covering the windows of the bus that the demonstrators would refuse to pay bail, refuse to walk into a courtroom, and that the members were being denied their civil rights. He said several would sue.

"Do not work for the Pentagon," Lytle shouted. "Do not work for the government. Do not pay taxes. Join us in the movement against war."

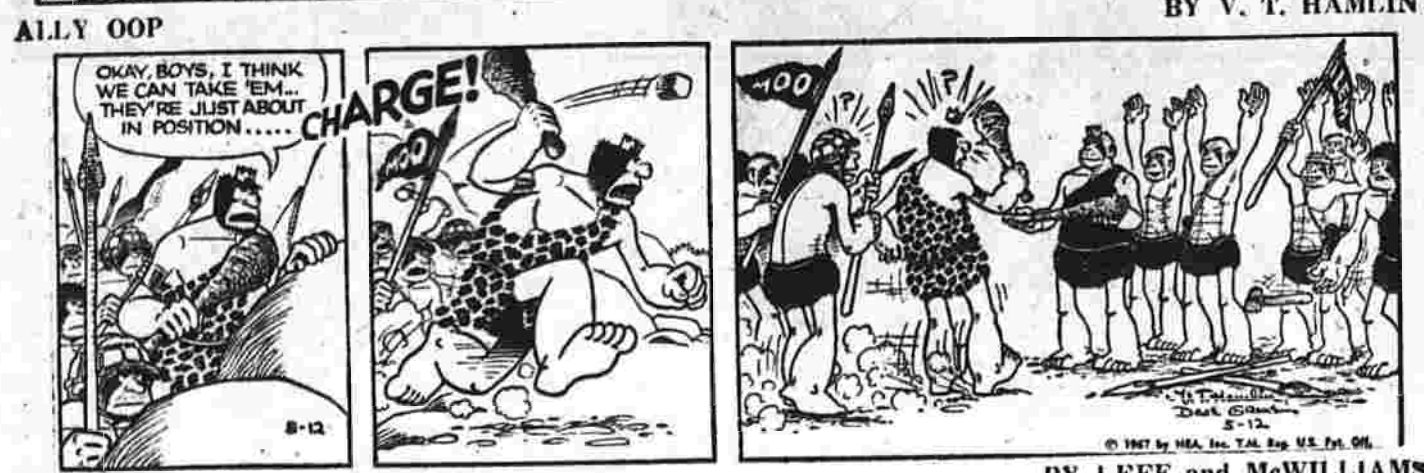
