NEW YORK (AP) - Panels of professionals of the television business are now looking over and judging 160 nominations in 33 categories. Winners will be given golden "Emmy" statuettes of the National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences in the annual two hour ABC program on June 4.

If the Emmies were awarded on the basis of this constant viewer's judgement, several of the categories could be skipped entirely. In others, there would be more than one recipient.

Programs qualifying are those broadcast between March, 1966 and last April 16. Thus, my votes would go to both "Death of a Salesman" and "The Final War of Olly Winter" - both on CBS - and far and away the outstanding shows of the period.
