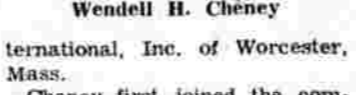

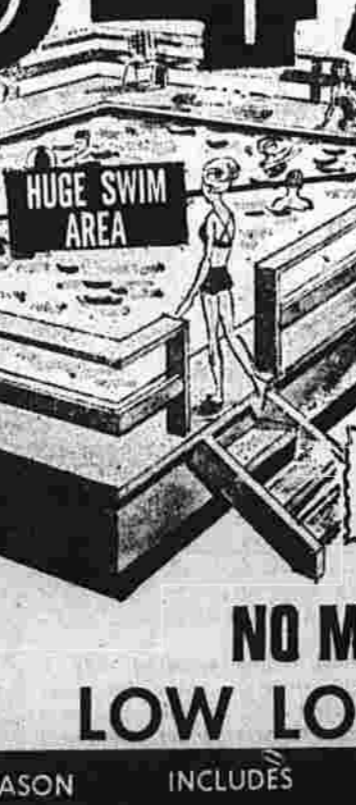

The Best Picking On TV

By CYNTHIA LOWRY

NEW YORK (AP) — Panels of professionals of the television business are now looking over and judging 160 nominations in 33 categories. Winners will be given golden "Emmy" statuettes of the National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences in the annual two hour ABC program on June 4.

If the Emmies were awarded on the basis of this constant viewer's judgement, several of the categories could be skipped entirely. In others, there would be more than one recipient.

Programs qualifying are those broadcast between March, 1966 and last April 16. Thus, my votes would go to both "Death of a Salesman" and "The Final War of Olly Winter" — both on CBS — and far and away the outstanding shows of the period.

CBS's recent Dick Van Dyke special is my choice of the best one-shot variety show of the season. The syndicated "China: The Roots of Madness" seemed tops in the news and documentary field.

The situation is more difficult when it comes to picking individual performances and it often seems a matter of personal choice. This viewer would cast a vote for NBC's "Dean Martin Show" in the variety series category; for NBC's "I Spy" in the dramatic series, and for CBS's "Hogan's Heroes" in comedy.

Lee J. Cobb of "Death of a Salesman" and Ivan Dixon of "The Final War of Olly Winters" left indelible impressions. So did Mildred Dunnock in "Death of a Salesman" and Geraldine Page in ABC's "Christmas Memory."

David Janssen has given a sustained and convincing performance through all the seasons of ABC's "The Fugitive." Lucille Ball still is the top comedienne of the television world, and Brian Keith of CBS's "Facily Affair" handles him-

self with dignity and sentiment in a comedy role that could easily be over played.

In the one category for daytime programs, my ballot would go to the syndicated "Mike Douglas Show" as a consistently agreeable and amusing daily variety show, and to Tom Kennedy of NBC's "You Don't Say" as a witty, bright host on a game show.

'Phasing Out'
Leigh Taylor-Young who came to "Peyton Place" when Mia Farrow suddenly departed, will be "phased out" of the ABC evening soap opera. She will disappear from the story in August. Miss Taylor-Young, who plays a shy girl named Rachel, recently married Ryan O'Neal, one of the leads in the serial, who will remain in the show.

Hazel's Candor Remains

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Shades of George C. Scott! When Shirley Booth was notified of her Emmy nomination for "The Glass Menagerie" last week, she exclaimed, "Oh, no!"

Mind you, it isn't like Miss Booth to be ungracious about

industry honors. But maybe some of Hazel's candor remains after five years of playing the flippant housemaid. She insists on saying what she thinks.

"I remember just before I was leaving to do 'Menagerie' in England," she recalled. "My poodle happens to be paper-trained, and I opened a newspaper for her. My eyes lighted on a story in which Helen Hayes said 'The Glass Menagerie' is a trap.

"I quickly rescued the paper and read what Miss Hayes said: that the mother's role in 'Glass Menagerie' is impossible to play and had killed her friend Laurette Taylor what with all her dieting for it, etc. That should have been an omen for me, but I went to England did it anyway.

"Let me now say that nobody has been able to handle that role, whether it was Laurette Taylor, Helen Hayes, Gertrude Lawrence (in the film version) or Shirley Booth. I could have done better by telephoning my lines in."

Miss Booth would not go as far as George C. Scott, who requested that his nomination for "The Hustler" in 1961 be withdrawn — request denied. But

she commented, "That's one acceptance speech I'll never have to make."

She has made more than her share of acceptance speeches already, having won an Oscar — "Come Back, Little Sheba," 1962 — two Emmies and three of Broadway's Tonys.

After enjoying such honors in a 40-year career, it perhaps is natural that she would now seek the leisure she has earned. The five years as Hazel provided the wherewithal.

"Oh, I'm very grateful to Hazel," she admitted. "I enjoyed playing her, and I didn't think it was a demeaning role, as some of my friends did. I never thought of her as a servant to that family; I always considered her a close friend. And that's the way I played her."

"Hazel" went into reruns two years ago and since then Miss Booth has worked sparingly. She performed in "The Glass Menagerie" and in a two-hour feature for television at Universal, as yet unreleased. Now she is enacting the role Florence Eldridge was to have played in a CBS Playhouse special, "Do Not Go Gentle into the Good Night."

Avoiding Formula

NEW YORK (AP) — Comedian Shelley Berman recently concluded a two-year contract with a Hollywood studio to develop comedy series for television. He developed a couple. Neither was sold.

He isn't exactly bitter about the so-called creative side of television, but it is easy to sense his disenchantment.

"It seems to me that the buyers — the producers, the networks, the sponsors — want comedy that identifies the jokes," he said. "So it became almost mandatory to write by formula — you know, the old story about mistaken identity and that sort of thing.

"You just can't present human beings because somehow they have forgotten that human beings are often funny. They have also forgotten, it seems to me, that there are human beings out there in living rooms."

Berman said that he thought his two shows were funny — "They made me laugh" — but they are now on a shelf somewhere. He continues his successful career as a comedy monologist and is soon to direct a play for Broadway. He was one of the stars in NBC's "Comedy Hour" special Thursday night, doing a telephone act that made him famous.

"I hadn't done it for about eight years," he said. "I had to re-learn it by listening to my record. Then it took me two full days of rehearsal — and the whole thing lasts three and one-half minutes."

Berman occasionally appears

on late evening TV talk shows. He says that while the exposure is good a performer often pays dearly if he uses up material from his current act.

"A good piece of material may be worth \$7,500," he explained. "You may get paid \$320 on the show — and after that the material is shot, for a good long time anyway. It seems that's not quite right."

Newhart in Wings

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — During the recent Johnny Carson crisis, the name of Bob Newhart was banded about as the prime candidate to head the "Tonight" show if Carson didn't return.

Says Newhart: "The New York Times offered me the show, the Los Angeles Times offered me the show, and Time magazine offered me the show. The only trouble was that NBC didn't offer me the show."

What's more, he doubts if he would have taken it. A devout Californian and ardent golfer, Newhart didn't fancy moving his young family to New York, nor did he like facing the 90-minute live show, five nights a week, as a steady diet.

He was spared the decision when Carson responded to the network's offer of more cash. Newhart received an NBC deal more to his liking. It includes spelling Carson for six weeks on the "Tonight" show, plus guest bookings with Dean Martin, Andy Williams, Bob Hope, Danny Thomas and other variety show hosts.

"The major item of the con-

tract calls for NBC to prepare my own series for the season after the next one," said the former Chicago accountant. "It would be either a variety format or a situation comedy. I think I would favor a variety show."

"In a situation show I would have to play a mild character, and I don't see myself in that light at all. I see myself as more of a Paul Newman type. Unfortunately, no one else sees me that way, including my wife. She likes Paul Newman."

Newhart added that he didn't think he could stand playing the same character week after week, as a situation show would demand.

Indeed, his success has been based on his ability to assume a variety of guises, from a public relations man advising Abe Lincoln on his image to a felonious employe retiring from a big corporation.

His comedy sketches now number 35, and he tries to add five new ones each year.

"When I sit down to write one, nothing happens. Mostly they come out of real-life situations."
