### Vernon School Board Weighs Future Enrollment

Student enrollment figures for the next five years and after were discussed and agreed upon by the school board at a meeting held Monday night.

The board, which is planning a new school building, is concerned with the future of the school system in the next five years. The board is planning a new school building, which will be needed to house them.

Dr. Raymond E. Donaldson, school superintendent, has supplied board members and the commission with projected enrollment figures for the next five years. The commission is working with planning consultants Raymond and May, who are using other methods.

Exact forecasting is impossible, but a good guess is crucial to saving tax dollars and having enough for the town's students in the future.

The board finally unanimously approved a temporary grade set up of kindergarten through fifth grade in elementary schools, sixth through eighth for a middle school, ninth grade in the Sykes school and ninth through twelfth for high school. It voted to eventually reach a K-5, 6-8 and 9-12 set up with another high school.

**New Elementary School**

Therefore, the fall of 1971 will find Vernon students attending about the same schools as today for the grades. A new elementary school at the Vernon Center will pick up the expected increase in enrollment in the early grades as well as the fifth grade now in the Vernon Center Junior High School.

The Sykes addition will enable it to handle the ninth grade until 1971 at least. The board expressed the hope the high school would have all four highest grades eventually.

It was agreed a new high school would have to be built. The last spot for it would be in Rockville Center with a reserved project, according to a Raymond and May spokesman.

But, owing to the difficulty of renewal work, the board decided to look into buying the Mitchell property just south of Rockville for a high school with about 1,900 seats.

An alternative would be land in the southwest corner of Vernon for a school of about 1,400 seats. In that case the present high school would be enlarged. A total of about 3,200 students are expected in high school when the town reaches maximum population in the year 2000 or later, according to the consultants.

**Two Middle Schools**

The middle schools, with sixth through eighth grades would be the Sykes school and the Vernon Center Junior High with additions. Maximum number of students is estimated at 2,200 by the consultants.

The 5,040 expected in the elementary schools can be handled by the present schools with three more. The board agreed the proposed 39 room school will take care of the immediate need.

Two more elementary school sites will be south of the Wilbur Cross Highway near the Vernon Circle and the other near the high school and Rockville, according to a board agreement. They will each handle about 600 students.

Recreation space for the Sykes school was a major concern of the board. Frank DeTolla, board member, urged purchase of land near the school be made.

The question of population prediction for the schools came up also at the Board of Representatives meeting last night. The board asked the Permanent Building Committee to examine projected students for 1968 and beyond before making its report on the 39-room elementary school.

**Miss Casati Named**

Miss Edith T. Casati, a member of the board for the past five years and secretary for a number of years, was elected chairman of the board.

She becomes the first woman chairman since town schools were consolidated in 1915 and a board established.

William R. Hahn was elected assistant chairman. Mrs. Marie Herbst, secretary. Albert Smith, assistant secretary. Joseph Powers, treasurer and Robert Menard, assistant treasurer.

Menard was elected last night to fill the vacancy left by the resignation of James J. Brennan.

Miss Casati said she would name standing committees at the next meeting set for May 29 at the high school.

The program for summer school at the high school was presented to the board. It provides for a six-week course of makeup work in several courses, driver education and personal life typing.

Summer school at the elementary level will concentrate on remedial and developmental reading and arithmetic and will run six weeks.

### Famed Canteen In North Platte To Be Reopened

**NORTH PLATTE, Neb. (AP)**—The North Platte Canteen, which piled six million American service men and women with free coffee, magazines and cigarettes during World War II will reopen May 28 as part of Nebraska's centennial celebration.

The canteen, operated by volunteers, opened 10 days after Pearl Harbor by accident. Residents flocked to the Union Pacific depot with gifts when they heard that a Nebraska National Guard company would pass through en route to the Pacific Coast. When they arrived they found that the troop train carried boys from neighboring Kansas. They handed out their gifts anyway and kept right on handing them out.

In the first month the canteen volunteers served 22,700 men. It closed April 1, 1948.

### Paper Clips Having An Explosion, Too

**CHICAGO**—Paper-clip makers are benefiting from the "paper-work" explosion. The Pin Clip and Fastener Association, representing three major producers, reports member paper-clip shipments climbed to 6.7 billion last year from 6.2 billion in 1965 and 5.6 billion in 1964. Home demand is rising noticeably, an association spokesman said, and so are orders for the larger, or "jumbo," clips.

### Talcottville Bridge Repairs Near Completion: Tricario

In a requested report on road repair, Tricario said the stalling program is planned to cover at least one half of town roads needing it each year on a rotating basis. The treatment is given until the roads qualify for the preferred bituminous pavement.

Priorities for the hardware are being directed to all subdivisions with all utilities.

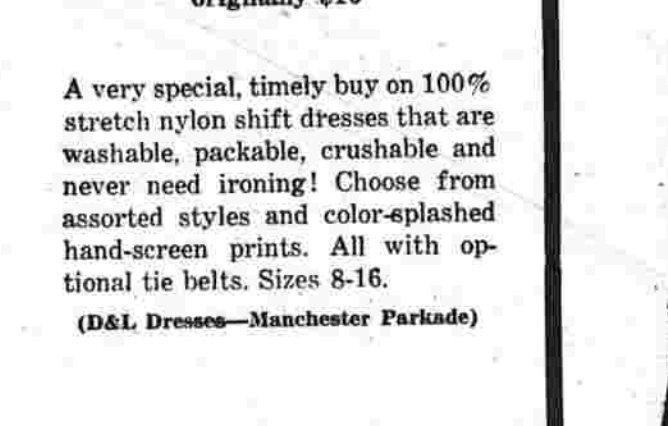

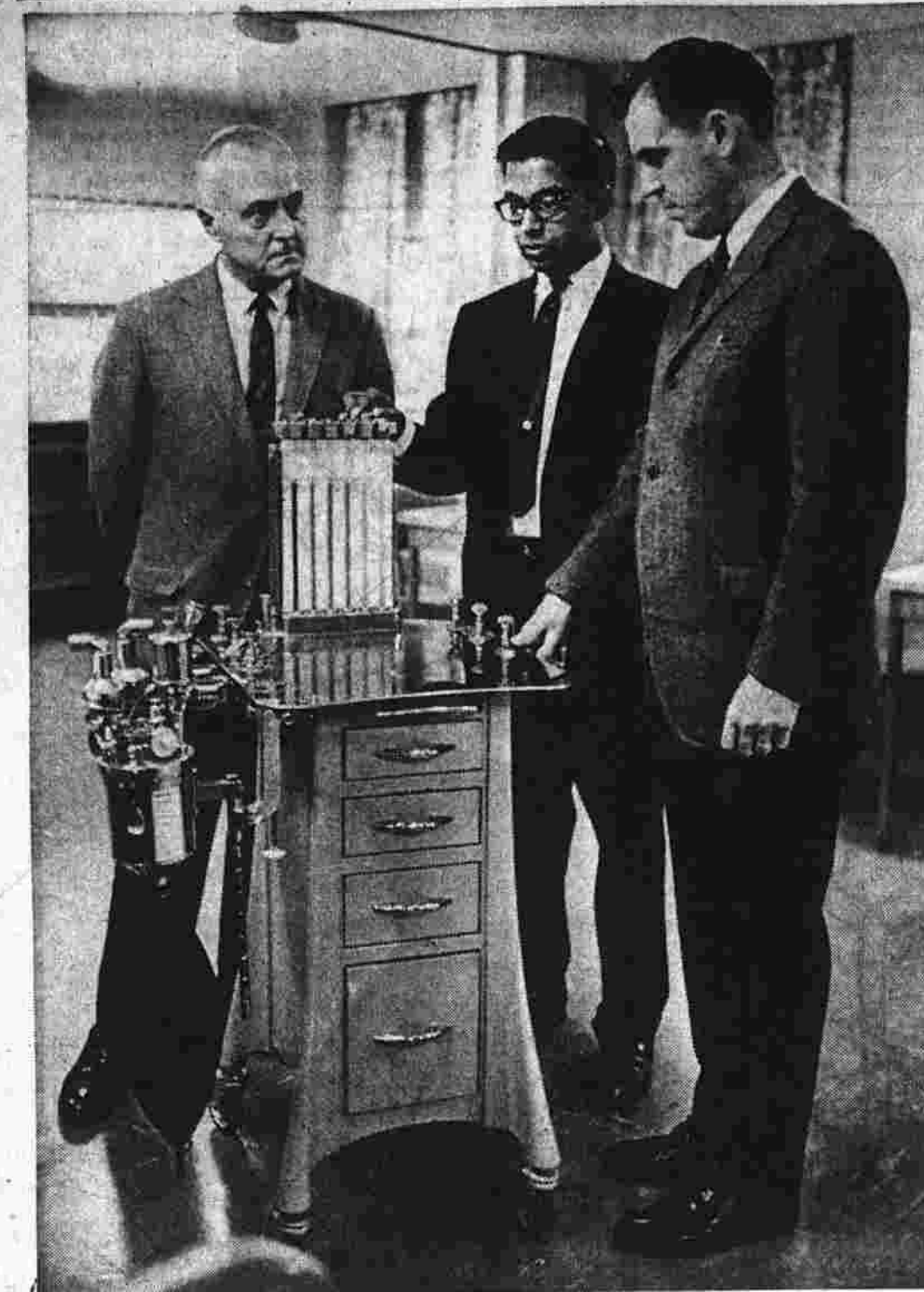

### Park Ave. Fraud Charged Message from Picasso Helped Indict Dealer

NEW YORK (AP) — Picasso returned the photograph of a painting attributed to him with the word "faux" boldly scrawled across its face, indicating a forgery.

The identification was one of a number of bits of information that led to the indictment here Tuesday of a Park Avenue art dealer on charges of counterfeiting and fraud in the sale of \$160,000 worth of paintings.

David Stein, 32, the dealer, was accused of having peddled seven fake Picassos, 33 Chagalls and one Matisse to 12 art dealers and collectors here and in Palm Beach, Fla.

Asst. Dist. Atty. Joseph Stone described the case, "uncovered amid a growing furor over fake art masterpieces, as 'one of the biggest art fraud cases we've ever had.'"

Dist. Atty. Frank S. Hogan said Stein first tried his hand at drawing in the Picasso style in 1961. "To his surprise and delight," the district attorney said, "he sold to a gallery in Paris. Three years later he tried two gouaches, signed Chagall, which he sold in a London gallery for \$4,000 each."

The investigation was launched off when a dealer to whom Stein had sold six paintings for \$28,000 became suspicious and went to the district attorney's office.

An investigation was begun in which both Chagall and Picasso cooperated. The DA's office sent photographs of the paintings attributed to Picasso to the artist in France.

"He was that 44 paintings in his \$1.25 million collection were fake, then up but we talked him out of it, saying we needed it for evidence," Hogan said.

Stein, who Stone said "never had any formal art training, as far as we know," is a British subject who came here from Canada in 1965 and operated galleries both in New York and Palm Beach.

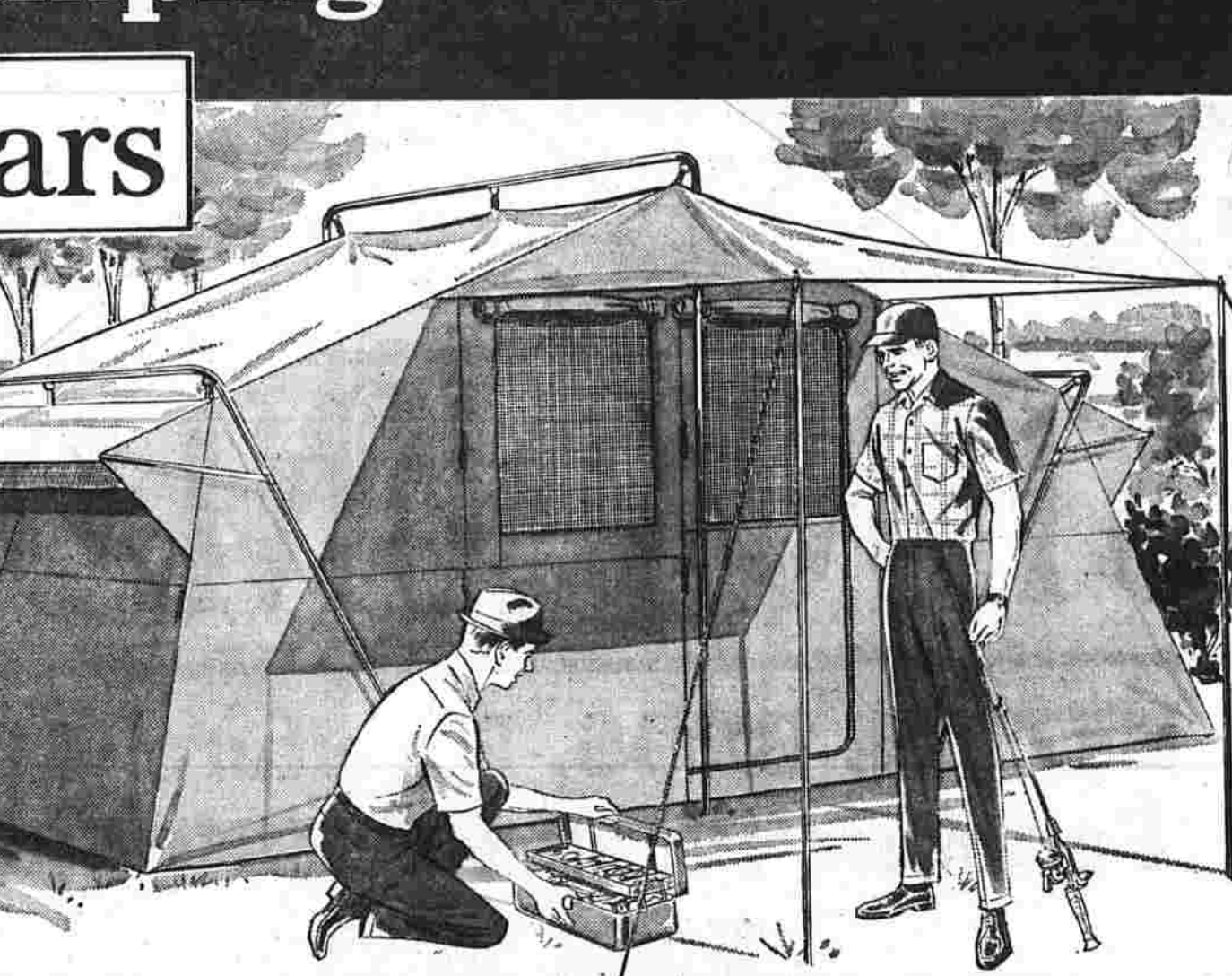

### Ruling Greek Junta Axes Military Foes

ATHENS (AP) — Greece's military dictatorship tightened its hold on power today with a purge of its opponents and potential opponents in the upper ranks of the armed forces.

The military shakeup apparently also was designed to reward middle-ranking officers who ensured the success of the coup on April 21.

But while the military regime was riding high at home, officials of the U.S. State Department said in Washington that the U.S. government is withholding "major items" of military aid that had been designated for shipment to the Greek armed forces.

The items were not specified, but the officials indicated they were withheld because the new regime had not given satisfactory assurance it intended to return the country to constitutional government soon.

Since Greece is still a member of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization, military hardware will still be shipped to Athens to prevent a breakdown of the country's military.

One top officer known to have been removed from the post is Michael Konolechias, commander of the 20th Tactical Air Force headquarters at the NATO base at Larissa in central Greece. Reliable sources said the junta did not consider him trustworthy.

The Appropriations Committee last week cut the total of the program to \$9.5 billion and kept off more than 60 per cent of the funds the administration requested for the model cities program. Its members hoped to hold the line there.

The rent subsidy program approved in 1966 for the government to supplement rents paid to owners of private housing by eligible low-income families in two years, the program has been financed with \$2 million.

President Johnson asked for \$40 million to keep the program moving next year but the Appropriations Committee cut this to \$10 million. Rep. Glenn R. Davis, D-Wis., said he expected strong GOP backing for an amendment to knock out all the money.

He did not elaborate but an aide said Bayh would disclose details soon.

The senator, a 30-year-old first-termer, had fought almost singlehandedly against Potts' nomination since President Johnson announced it last October.

The board has already deleted three positions from the original administrative request for an elementary librarian, a remedial reading teacher and an industrial arts teacher.

The town council in making budget cuts recommended that \$50,000 be cut from the category of teaching positions.

The reason for this cut was that eight of the requested new positions would have to be deleted.

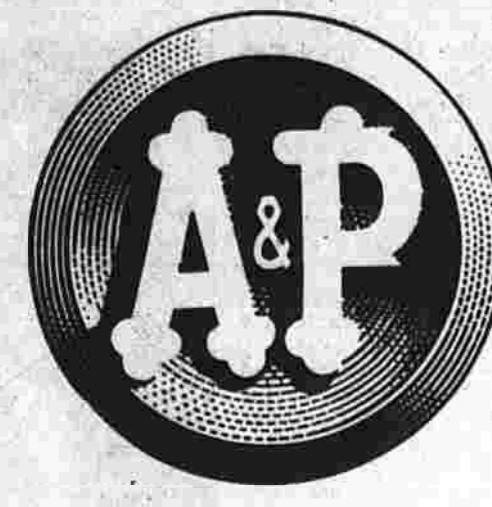

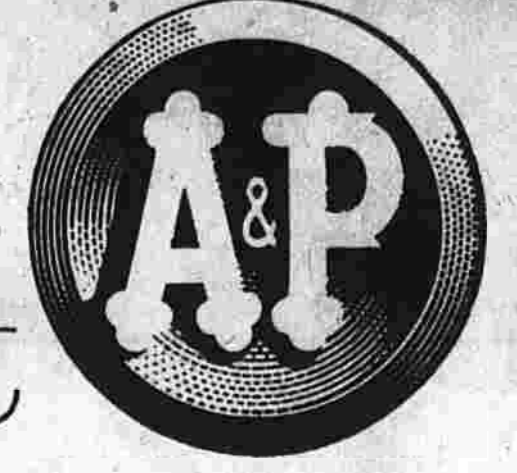
