





#### Man Blamed For Accident By Coroner

In reports on two separate fatal accidents, Tolland Couny Coroner Herbert Hannabury concrated one driver but held another "responsible." David Donnelly of Whitman, fass., is responsible for the

death of Robert Arnone, 23, of Fort Bragg, North Carolina, according to Hannahury.

Arnone was killed instanly in n automobile accident in Wilington, March 26 on the Wilour Cross Highway. The coroner said, from evidence at the scene it is likely Donnelly dozed or fell asleep and his car went to the right.

When striking a guide post he apparently over reacted turning his car sharply to the left Hannabury said. The car came across the two westbound shown feeding the homeless animal. While the President was philosophizing about his meeting with the Governors yesterday, one of the achievements of the Monday conference in Connectiit was taking place in washington This was a meeting between Connecticut officials and the officials of the Department of Transportation at Washington on the problem of the continual financial crisis of the New Haven Railroad.

It appears, on first report, that this meeting was like the parent meeting at Bradley Field, in that it "didn't solve" any problems and featured no making of any "commitments." Only this time the mcomfortable look seems to be appearng on the faces of the Democratic Governors, while it is the Republicans who are smiling, as if they feared all along that the Presidential visit to New England was an exercise in politics for the 1968 campaign, and nothing more.

Perhaps the moral is that no politician who wants to build himself up should ever let problems like that of the New Haven Road get on the agenda for any of his instant miracle sessions. Everybody agrees the New Haven has to keep running. Nobody, anywhere, on any level of jurisdiction or authority, nas either the vision or the courage really to take the throttle and make it run the way a railroad should. The news this week has quoted General Wheeler, chairman of our Joint Chiefs to Staff, as predicting that American military involvement in Asia will be a long term affair-"We'll be involved out there till the end of the cen-

It has also quoted Secretary of State Rusk saying that it will be "useful for some time to come for American power to be able to control every wave of the Pacific, if necessary" and adding that, if Communist China stays "militant and hard-nosed it is difficult to see how a confrontation can be forever avoided."

We should be grateful for such terrible honesty-for the admission that we do view it as our role to "control every wave of the Pacific." For this shows us precisely how far we have strayed from the path of reason and sanity and law into the age-old role of the great power seeking to dominate as much of its earth as it can reach.

Once a nation can get itself heading down such a role in history, it makes less and less difference what kind of naion it itself once thought it wanted to e. The decisions forward have a way of overning themselves; the debates as to orality or ethics or law have a wear of

It might come as a terrible shock to scretary Rusk to have this suggested him, but it is quite possible that any mical evaluation of the postures of the

United States and Communist China, made without previous classification of one or the other as hero or villain, would find that it was really the United States, rather than Communist China, which had achieved the "militant and hardnosed" stance of the historical moment, with Mr. Rusk's own magnificently uncompromising language a big part of the posture.

Mr. Rusk's honesty is a terrible honesty. There was a time when we would not have said anything like this, particularly if we were secretary of state. If we had had to attempt to consign every wave of the Pacific to any particular control, we would have said that it should be the responsibility of international law, and of a new world order centered in the United Nations, to see that every wave of every ocean was safe for every nation, and dominated by none. There was a time, not very long ago, when we would have flinched from saying that we expected to be on the soil of other continents, and other nations, for anything more than the very shortest time possible.

Have we, the American people, really changed? Not yet, perhaps, but we will, unless we somehow take hold of our own destiny and make it clear we do not wish to be the whole world's one nation policeman. Have we ever decided to be the new Britain, the new Rome? No, but we will get used to it.

#### Senator Dodd's Censure

One wonders why the Senate commit-

tee took so long in coming to its conclusions on the Dodd case. Read the entire report, and you will find nothing there you did not already know, nothing that was not fully and freely admitted by Senator Dodd all along the line. There is, to be sure, the notation that Senator Dodd and his larcenous bookkeeper dissereed on one particular, and ves there is the paragraph, almost entirely unnoticed, to the effect that others of the charges leveled against Senator Dodd were found to be insubstantial. All those dreary columns by Mr. Drew Pearson about General Klein, and the West German government and silverware and carpets and Persian rugs and whatnot were apparently investigated and found to be as phony as the rantings of the village gossip, whence they had after

The committee then proceeded to hang Senator Dodd-and one should be very clear about this-because the literature inviting citizens of Connecticut to testimonial dinners did not specify that the proceeds of those dinners would be made vallable to Senator Dodd to spend as he aw fit. This is the gravamen of the report. Are we to understand that the crucial consideration was that the Dodd people failed to print on the tickets or on the programs: "The subscribers to this function understand that the proceeds are available to Senator Thomas Dodd to use as he sees fit, whether to pay newspapers and television stations to carry his message to his constituents. or to pay his golf club to carry dry martinis to his constituents, or to pay his contractor to fix the leak on the roof to


