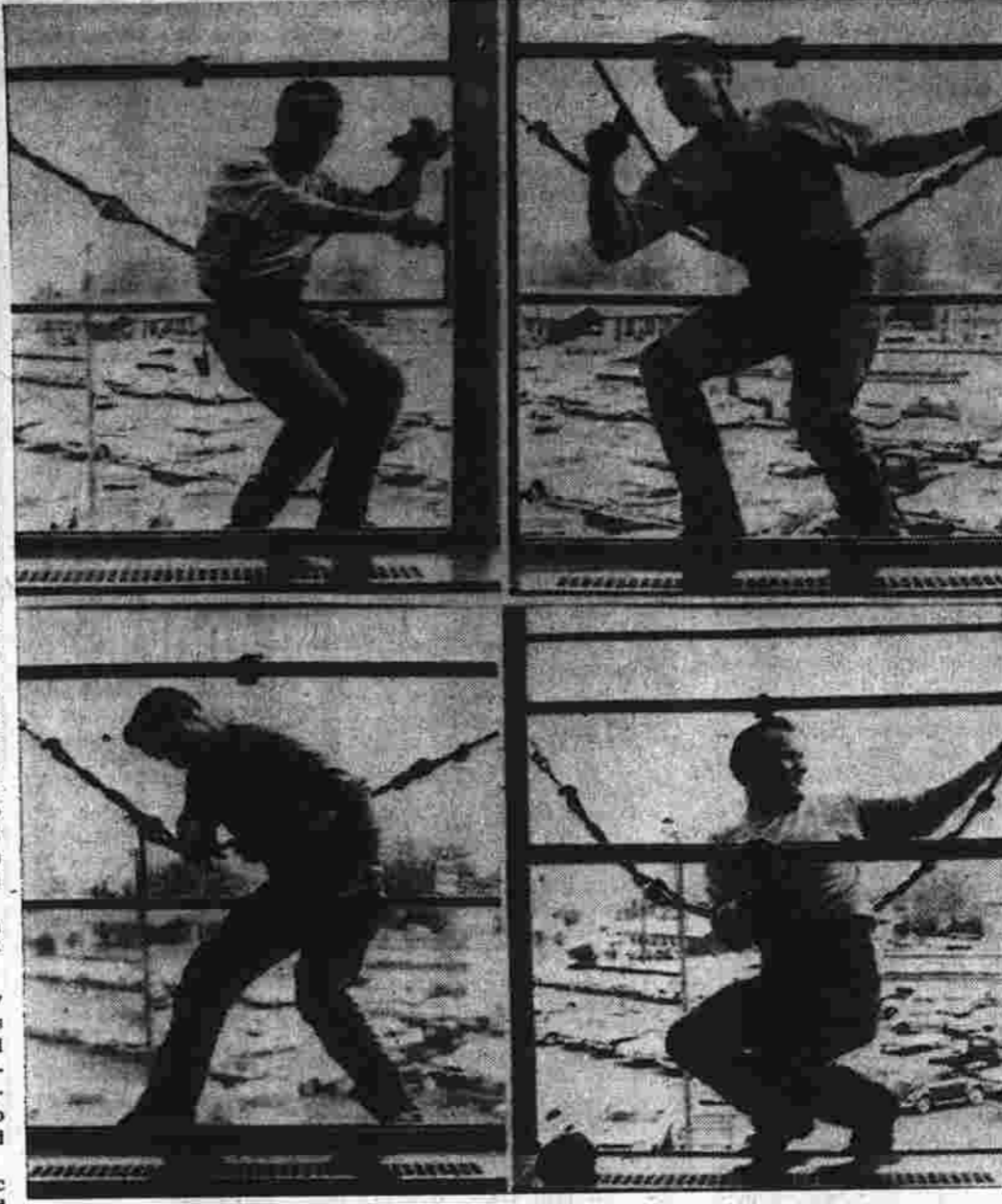

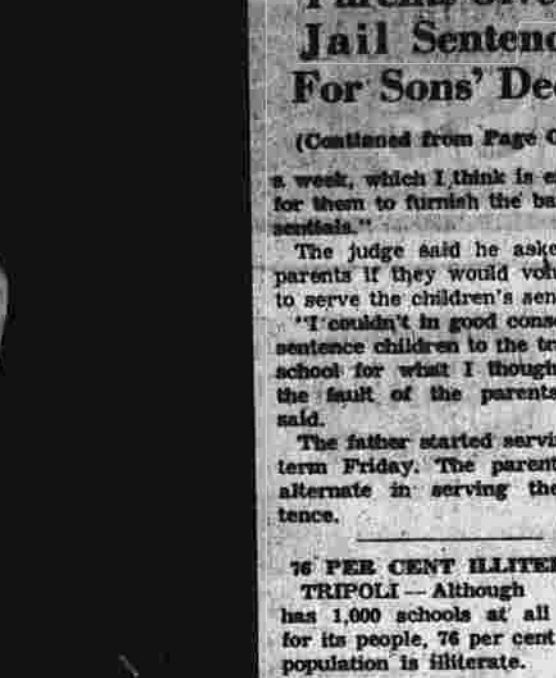

News Show with a Difference

NEW YORK (AP) — A live weekly news review on a network of more than 125 educational television stations promises to be the brightest, freshest—and most controversial—spot on the dials next season.

The experimental project, underwritten by a \$10-million grant from the Ford Foundation for two years, is scheduled to start Oct. 29. It will be on Sunday nights for at least three hours, perhaps even four.

It was conceived by Fred W. Friendly, the rangy giant who last year stormed out of CBS News, of which he was president, after the parent network broadcast a rerun of "I Love Lucy" instead of covering a foreign affairs hearing by a Senate committee. He is now a television adviser for the foundation.

Although he has a parent's love for his brainchild, Friendly has turned it over to a trusted former associate to avoid being both a donor and recipient of the Ford funds.

Even so, he talks about the plans as "we," rather than "they," who are former CBS News producer Av Westin, executive producer of the series, and his staff.

"We're really trying to turn the clock back to the not distant past when television time was not so expensive," Friendly explained. "When air time became so expensive, the commercial networks had to go for the lowest common denominator in audiences. We are trying to recreate the climate of a time when the cost of air time did not price experimentation out of the market."

Westin, he said, will operate with a staff of perhaps 50—they have over 1,000 applications—and most of them are young and aggressive.

"Commercial television's worst sins are of omission," Friendly said. "Our program, if it were going now, would be taking a look at this business about the cost of drugs. It would have taken up the Ralph Nader book. It should be controversial and not afraid to look at Harlem's problems, at Vietnam, the death of a newspaper, theater—everything."

"Sure, it will make a lot of people angry. Sure, there will be rotten nights, but there will also be nights when you want to see and hear more. There will be things with which you disagree violently. There will be plays that shock you. You are going to hear opinions from everybody from the lunatic left to the lunatic right, and even the lunatic center."

Friendly, always a mover and shaker, believes the program will stir up news operations on the commercial networks. He believes that the popular TV documentary form is outmoded.

"There has got to be more than that because the one thing that television does uniquely is make the viewer participate."

He thinks that where commercial television, because of assorted pressures, tends to be bland, public television, without sponsors, should bite, sting, generate excitement, curiosity and emotion.

"It's not my baby any more," he said, "but I think it's pretty exciting."

He glanced at a framed sign in his office. It said: "If you believe in great things, you may be able to make other people believe in them."

Obviously, he does and has.

Musical Chairs In the Daytime

NEW YORK (AP) — CBS now is weighing the fate of two long-playing daytime panel shows. The network expects to add a new soap opera "A Many Splendored Thing," spun off a best-selling book as was "Peyton Place." It will probably go into the time spot now occupied by "Password."

ABC will drop "One in a Million," a game show that had its premiere only last month, and substitute "The Family Game," a new package produced by the man who gave them their popular "Newlywed Game" and "The Dating Game." The new show starts June 19.

NBC too is busily playing daytime musical chairs. The "Pat Boone Show" departs at the end of June to be replaced by a game show called "Personality."

DEBATES

Richard Boone and Martin Gabel will recreate their Broadway roles in "The Rivalry," the play about the Lincoln-Douglas debates, next season on CBS. Boone, who once played Paladin on the "Have Gun, Will Travel" series, will play Lincoln. Gabel will play Douglas.

Next Season, More Specials Than Ever

HOLLYWOOD (AP)—The television year 1967-68 shapes up as a very special season.

Perhaps it would be placed in quotes like this: "special." Because, judging from the series announced for the new year, one must conclude the season doesn't sound special at all. The weekly fare seems like the same dreary procession of laugh-tracked comedies, hard-bitten westerns, crime dramas and

variety shows.

The only promising note is that the networks seem to have discovered the power of the special. Breaking up the weekly schedules with one-shot shows has been a network practice since Sylvester "Pat" Weaver invented the spectacular during his regime at NBC.

But only recently have the networks realized the special's worth. It diversifies programming and brings back the thinking audience which has lost the

viewing habit out of ennui.

The cold-cash value of specials is demonstrated in recent ratings. The three top shows were specials, and two others placed in among the first 11.

The networks have been scrambling to line up stars with enough talent and name to sustain hour-long or 90-minute specials. NBC has Bob Hope for nine next season, and Danny Thomas will be doing six in conjunction with his weekly show. Andy Williams is set for

three and there will be one apiece from Jack Benny, Bill Cosby and Rowan and Martin.

Bellringers Barbra Streisand and Dick Van Dyke will be returning to CBS for a special apiece, and probably Jim Nabors, Frank Sinatra, Red Skelton and Don Knotts. Doris Day may well make her Television debut in a special, since she has signed to make features for the new CBS feature film division.

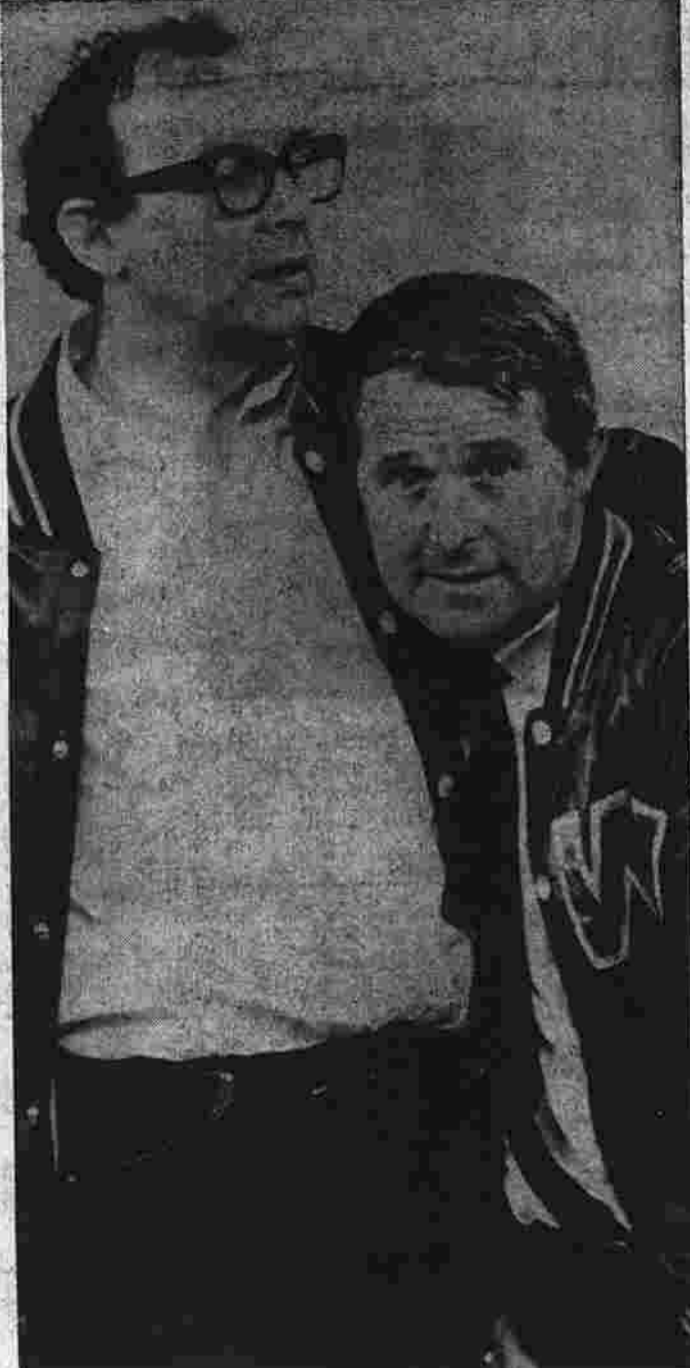

NEW YORK (AP)—Bob Hope's weekly anthology series came to the end of its four season run on NBC Wednesday night. Over-all, the programs deserved more attention than they received.

The final show was "Deadlock," a suspense tale as so many of them have been. It was well-acted, professionally and slickly produced and followed a story line that, in one form or another, is a television favorite.

"Deadlock" starts with a neurotic woman with a gun and a bottle of nitroglycerine entering the detectives room of a police headquarters. She planned to await the return of a detective who had just shot and killed her husband while resisting arrest.

From then on to the very fast wind-up-not unexpected-assorted police characters and innocent by-standers attempted to get out of the dangerous situation.

Some of the series programs have been great—"The Game" last season was certainly one of the outstanding shows of that period and the quality generally has been a cut above TV's average.

Bob Hope has served as host and presented on the series, introducing each program with a quip or two which was greeted by incongruous howls of canned laughter, suggesting a studio audience for what were obviously studio-produced playlets.

Hope, of course, will be back next season with his very popular comedy specials, but the anthology series will be replaced by a variety hour with assorted star-hosts.
