Because it represents what there is teleft of hope and intelligence in the behavior of mankind on this earth the United Nations keeps coming into focus in one crisis after another. Nowhere, at the moment, is the United Nations winming, or enjoying favorable prospects. That is another way of saying that

mankind is losing, everywhere. A new loss comes into the news with the announcement by Secretary General Thant that the United Nations is required to withdraw its United Nations Emergency Force from the border between Israel and the United Arab Republic. The withdrawal is required because President Namer of the U.A.R. has requested it, and because the Emergency Force was originally stationed there, where it has managed to keep peace for 11 years, with the consent of

The maintenance of this force, like the actual quelling of the Suez war in 1956, has been one of the most proper and self-justifying functions in the his-tory of the 22 year old organization. This is what it was created for. Now, in one of the situations where it did help prevent world war, and in one of the situations where it has helped keep bor-

At the moment, Secretary Rusk is under some pressure from people like Senator Mansfield, who think the United Nations quent to be for big nations as well as for little ones, and ought to try to stop big wars as well as little ones, to have the United States demonstrate presome kind of willingness to let the United Nations assume some jurisdiction in Vietnam. Senator Mansfield would merely like to have the United Nations try to bring about negotiations for peace in Vietnam. Secretary Rusk, on the other hand, wouldn't mind getting ivilized credit for being willing to conmit the United Nations, but his view of proper United Nation action with regard to Vietnam would be to have it pass a solution condemning the Victoria and Yorth Vietnam, authorizing the United tates to fly the UN flag on its bombers over North Vietnam, and encouragng all the other members of the United

ations to contribute armed forces to he cause in Vietnam. But it has never crossed the mind of Secretary Rusk, and perhaps not even of Senator Mansfield, that the only real ay to get United Nations jurisdiction and help for peace in Vietnam would be for the United States to submit its own ots and policies there to the debate and judgment of the United Nations. have, on occasion, sought to take the Vietnam issue to the United Nations with ourselves cast in the role of prosecutors instead of merely the role of one of the parties.

What might have been, what might, by some sudden access of desperation sanity, still be the proper course for the great founder of the United Nations has just been suggested by Congressman Paul Findley, the Illinois Republican. He proposes that the United States take the Vietnam question to the International Court of Justice for adjudication and agree to abide by the rulings of the court.

The normal psychology which has governed at Washington, to keep us away from anything so foolish and possibly embarrassing, holds that we are too big a nation, too right a nation, to be expected to do a thing like that. The real reading has to be, of course, that we are neither really big enough, or sure enough of the rightness of our own course, to dare risk such a step.

The United States believes the United Nations should help keep the peace in the Near East. President Nasser, undoubtedly, believes the United Nations should be keeping the peace in the Far East. Neither of us believes the United Nations should have the same kind of jurisdiction and authority in both places. Such dismal coincidence of policy between the United States and Nasser is real proof of how sick a world it




