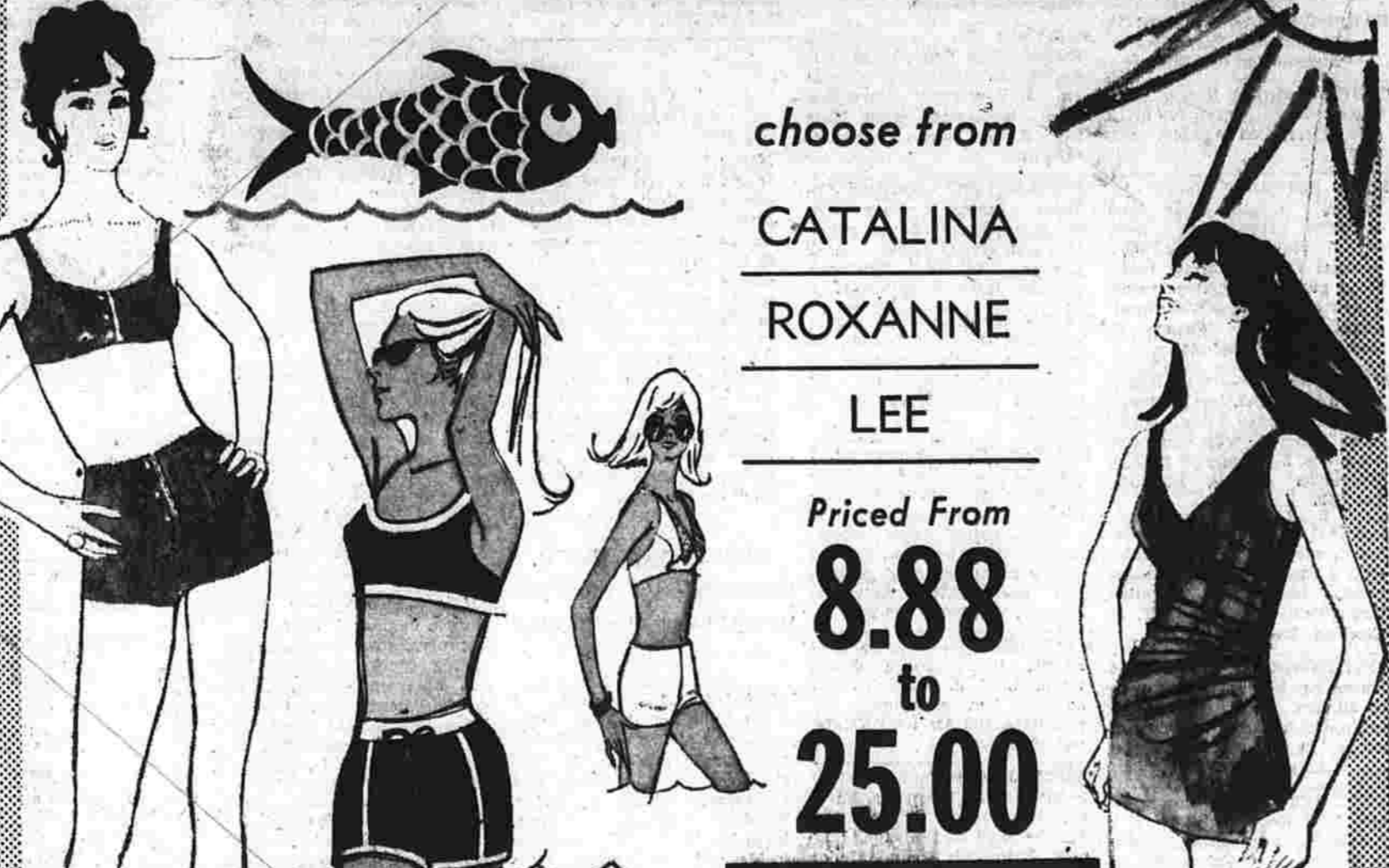

### Plane Travel To Middle East Drops Sharply

NEW YORK (AP) — Travel agencies and airlines reported today that the number of American travelers to the Middle East is dropping fast and many Americans visiting there are returning home.

Edal, the Israeli airline, said it had no extra flights from Tel Aviv to Rome to bring out the American. Trans World Airline said it was also providing extra flights out of Tel Aviv and would add still more if asked to do so by U.S. authorities.

Pan American World Airways said its number of passengers returning from the United States dropped to 1,076 Tuesday from 1,898 on Monday. It said passengers arriving were 1,987 on Monday and 1,810 on Tuesday as opposed to a daily average of about 1,800.

The American Express Co., a major travel agency, suspended regular tours to Egypt and the Holy Land. Thomas Cook & Son and the Pugsley Travel Bureau said they had not experienced much reaction as yet. They said the crisis had been so short as yet to influence future bookings.

Travelin, Inc., which specializes in Middle East tours, said bookings were way off.

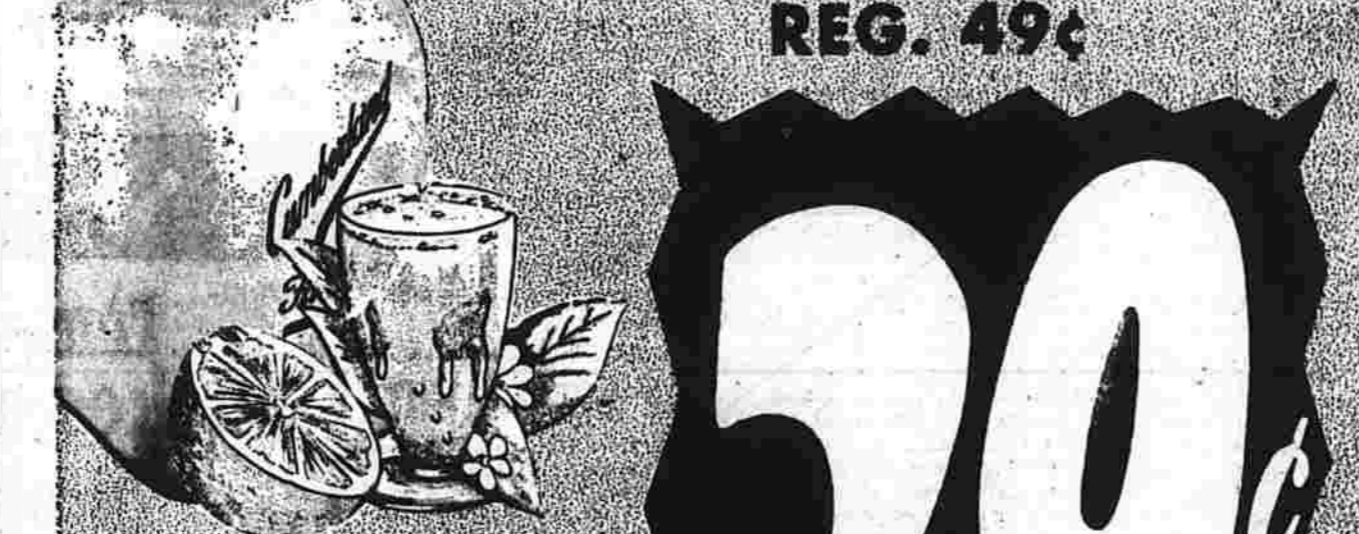

### Claims of Moral Victories Can End Middle-East Crisis

There is a way out of the current ominous-looking Middle East crisis, if leaders are willing to take it.

Arab leaders in particular in the past have been slow to rationalize, when the chips were down, and find peace-making ways out of dangerous situations into which, from time to time, they seemed to have been hurled.

What appears to have happened in this crisis is that the leaders have so far outlimb that it is difficult to climb back. That may be needed is some plausible excuse to do it, a claim of, at least, a moral victory.

The Arabs, already in past wars and crises to carry through successfully, have managed to console themselves by claims of victory. Top leaders do not dispute themselves, but at lower levels Arabs have been persuaded themselves that their losses were not really defeats.

After the Palestine war with the Israelis, one could hear often in the Middle East an Arab analysis of what had happened.

It was really an Arab victory, because the combined force of Arab armies had prevented the Zionists from conquering all the way from the Mediterranean to the Tigris and Euphrates Rivers. Most Arab nationalists honestly contend that this is an old Zionist dream that Israel still plots to achieve.

After the 1966 imbroglio which followed nationalization of the Suez Canal by President Gamal Abdel Nasser of Egypt and the subsequent French-British-Israeli attack on the Egyptians, Arab voices could be heard again claiming victory. The Israelis had driven all the way across the Sinai Desert to the canal against Egyptian resistance and had captured huge stores of matériel. What ended that conflict was the combined pressure of the United States and the Soviet Union, forcing the attackers to withdraw.

The way Arabs — some in high places — told the story, it was the frightening prospect of the wise and witty Nasser in Cairo with his protecting troops which caused the attackers to turn and retreat.

Mohammed Haneen Helal, chief editor of Al-Ahram, said a man who often speaks for the Nasser, wrote later in "The simple truth is, no real work piece between Israel and Egypt.

The board is expected to hold another session within a few days to make the final vote legal, but no date has been set so far.

Another session is necessary because school officials discovered yesterday that board action on salary matters requires a two-thirds majority, or affirmative vote of the nine-member body.

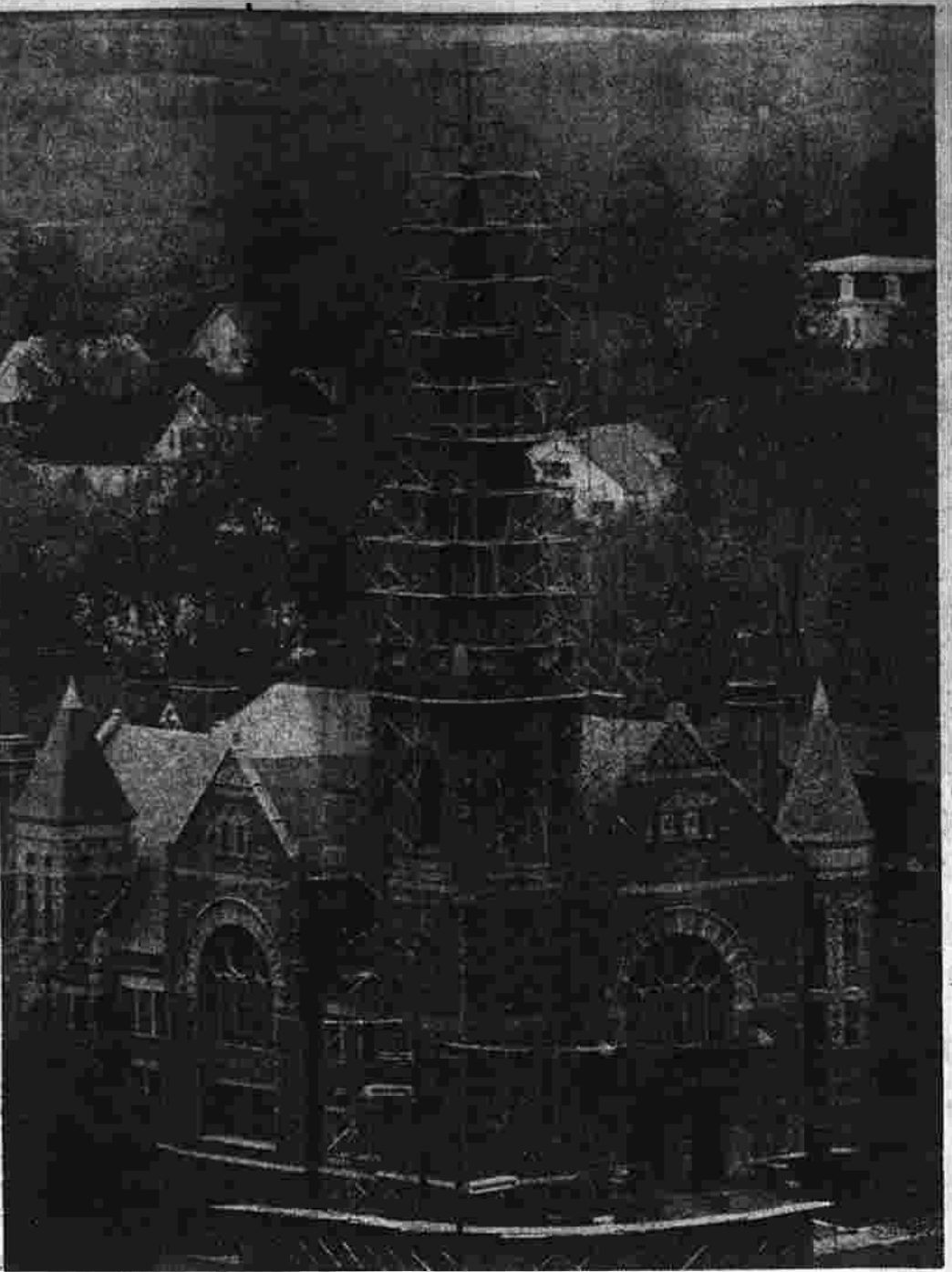

Legislative Roundup

Deadline Stretched For Financial Bills

HARTFORD (AP) — The legislative committee's office has received over \$1.5 million worth of spending and borrowing bills, but the General Assembly had to stretch a deadline to do it.

The bills represent the state budget — essentially that proposed by Gov. John Dempsey in mid-February, with some changes and amendments.

The deadline for reporting out bills acted on favorably by the Finance and Appropriations Committee was 5 p.m. May 24, but since neither committee was ready, the deadline was advanced the time to 8 p.m.

After most of the House members left the evening session, the night session would be brief and technical, the Senate proceeded to move the deadline to 11:30 p.m. to receive the reports from the two committees.

Details of the reportedly beefed-up highway program and the supplemental "baby budget" were not expected to be available until Thursday.

Estimates of the size of the "baby budget" ranged from \$25 million to \$35 million, but no one-out over the chief architects of the Democrats' legislative program—would provide a firm figure Wednesday.

Another bill that was approved Wednesday would require motorcycle drivers to wear helmets and would be prohibited from riding abreast or side-by-side in a line that the Senate has passed and sent to the House.

U.S. Experts Say: Israel Could Win War If 'Big Guys' Stay Out

WASHINGTON (AP) — U.S. military experts believe Israel's armed forces, although outnumbered, could defeat the combined Arab armies if the big powers stay out.

These experts give the Israelis an edge over the Arabs because of what was described as superior training and better equipment maintenance. Israel has about 300,000 men and the Arab states surrounding her, Israel estimates indicate.

However, while Israel was able to mobilize and deploy her 300,000 men in a matter of days, the Arab armies are believed to be able to muster much less than their full strength.

Military specialists expect any open war would pit Israel against four Arab countries: Syria, Jordan, Iraq and Lebanon, all of which immediately border on Israel.

Although Iraq and Saudi Arabia have pledged support, the American experts discount their probable effectiveness on the ground.

This is because Iraq has serious problems with rebellious Kurdish tribesmen and the Saudi-Arabians are embroiled in the Yemen civil war, where 40,000 Egyptian troops are pinned down on the opposite side of the issue.

Some government sources, however, regard as an open question what Arab nations actually might be involved in a war with Israel.
