

Massed Commitments

existence and bearing on the Near East crisis to make sure that, once the next overt recourse to force is tried, the whole world can be joined into the

Some of these commitments are as old as Secretary of State Dulles' memgrandum assurance to Israel, in 1957, that the United States would itself more or less guarantee the freedom of the seas in the Gulf of Aqaba. Some of them are as new as the new pact reached, in Cairo yesterday, by King Hussein of Jordan and President Nasser of the United Arab Republic.

These commitments pledge Egypt to the maintenance of its blockade of Aqaba. They pledge Israel to military action to break this blockade if somebody else doesn't use either diplomacy or force to lift the blockade. These commitments now pledge all the Arab state to come to the aid of any one of their member who may be attacked by Israeli in the course of such action to force the end of the blockade. These commitments include Britain in the Western guarantee of the freedom of the seas for Agaba. And Russia has obments to the Arab states to encourage them to play the game Russia wants played, which is not a game to start war in the Near East, but a game to use the threat of war there in order to persuade the United States to halt its escalation of the war in Vietnam.

All these commitments are now massng themselves together and against each other, and this massing of commitments is the first stage in what seems likely to prove a massive showdown of military movements and military feints, like the weighing of anchor by the United States Sixth Fleet, and the report of Russian naval ships coming through the Dardanelles. Everything keeps heading toward this massive showdown, and there are almost no glimpses of any possible developments that might keep the showdown itself from materializing, in all its most terrible significance.

We say "almost no glimpses." It is helpful, so far, that Israel has been persuaded, probably by United States promises of ultimate support in any showdown, to desist from that immediate blow that would be normal for Israeli moods and Israeli military competence On the other side, it does seem fairly clear that, while Russia wants a crisis in the Near East, Russia does not really want war in the Near East, but merely less war in the Far East. And there seems a possibility in the news that the United States is, at the moment, engaged in at least a temporary de-escalation in Vietnam, and easing off on its bombing of Hanoi and Halphong, which might be sound American policy anyway, even if it would have come better if it could have seemed purely voluntary, and not an adjustment to the arrival of new crisis elsewhere.

But it is extremely dangerous to try to magnify such slight possibilities of restraint." It is easier to get into such a orisis than to get out of it. How, one must ask, does Russia, supposing Russia wants to call off this crisis after a new understanding with the United States about Vietnam, go to President Nasser and pull him back from the extreme commitment he has made to the closing of the Gulf of Aqaba?

Putting it realistically, one can conseive of a situation in which every major participant in the present Near East erisis really wants no violence, really wants not only to have the uneasy peace of the past restored, but a firmer and better atmosphere established for the future—one could conceive of all this midden highmindedness being present and then one would still have to admit that it would be a miracle if the parties involved could ever find the language and the instruments for bringing their good intentions to reality.

That leaves the difficulties even more nous. For the moment, one has s fudes that the best thing to have

happen, right now, as of this instant, is nothing, and that the only policy which really commends itself at the moment is the policy most of the participants seem to be trying to follow-to postpone the final showdown, and hope.

Not Even Riches Can Dim It There is only one wonder Sir Francis Chicester, the most thrilling individual

of the year, did not accomplish. He didn't manage to complete his exploit without thereby qualifying himself for and exposing himself, to all kinds of fabulous future enrichments. Along with everything else, he will be filthy rich from now on. That will be, we suppose, a sort of bearable minor irritation in the midst of so many major satisfactions.

Of all the forces man finds himself tempted to challenge in this world, that of the sea remains the most immense, the most rewarding. The sea is a vast, unpredictable law to itself; no one can eally master it; but courage and skill can survive it. It is the great, inimitable mixture of basic sameness and infinite variety: it cradles man like a mother and drives him like a demon; it draws all his questionings and wonders, and gives answers which are always strangely satisfying even while they are eternally evasive. No man knows himself until he has known the sea. Many of us never know ourselves.

Sir Francis knows himself well, having tested himself by all the elements, and most of all by the sea. The spic of his 226 days, his 28,500 miles alone on a craft three men could handle in an emergency, is first of all his, and all his alone, and not all the emolument in the word that is heading his way could tease its deepest secrets out of him. Perhaps he came close to the deepest secret, however, the other day, whn he confessed that there were times during his lonely ordeal when he didn't really want to be reminded that he was a man, with the tastes, instincts, emotions which normally belong to man. He was bound to an ordeal and, while bound, could not risk the acknowledgment of other ties. It is in losing one's self almost completely that one achieves perhaps the highest fulfilment of self. And perhaps that phrasing, so Biblical, brings us close to the final strength and appeal of the Chichester exploit. It has the proportion of an ancient myth. It will stand as glorious even if as much as a million pounds attaches itself to him as a

Still Made Up There

We have been reading some of both kinds of super-super weather reports, and our own interim report is that it will still be a comfortable time before the extraordinary and developing power of man has brought the power of the weather itself under control.

One set of reports comes in a document from the President's Interdepartmental Committee for Atmospheric Sciences. Here it is testified that by means of heavy seeding of silver lodide into electrical storms, a 32 per cent reduction in the amount of lightning between cloud and ground has been achieved. It is also reported that consistent experimentation has showed it possible to increase the amount of precipitation in any given area by from 10 to 20 per cent, which often could, of course, be

the difference between drought and fer-And it seems realistic to look forward to an ability to prevent the develop-

These findings add up to more of a realistic assault, by man, on the mantouching processes of the weather than has usually been granted, by the public fancy, to the "rainmakers." Even as these findings were being made public by the President's Interdepartmental Committee for Atmospheric Sciences, however, two separate parts of the Eastern United States found themselves living with the effects of weather happenings still safely beyond

the reach of man. Because the jet streams that ride over us at 200 miles an hour have, this spring, chosen themselves, for what reason not even weather satellite observations seem able to specify, a series of unusual patterns, the drought-weary Northeast has had itself a 1967 wetness which has nevertheless been too cold to be called a spring, while the normally tropic-wet Everglades in Florida have been having a disastrous drought when the only weather emergencies they have ever been prepared against have been

those of hurricane and flood. Famed Actor Claude Rains Dead at 77

LACONIA, N.H. (AP) Claude Rains, one of the movtes' and stage's most versatile actors whose roles ranged from the suave to the wild, is dead. His motion picture career covering a quarter-century brought him four Academy Award nominations—but no Os car-after starring on the London and Broadway stage. Rains died Tuesday at Lakes Region Hospital of abdominal bleeding and shock after a lingering illness. He was 77. In an acting career that began with an appearance at age 11 in a London stage production of "Sweet Nell of Old Drury," Rains played charming lovers, ruthless villains, sympathetic scoundrels and doting fathers.
