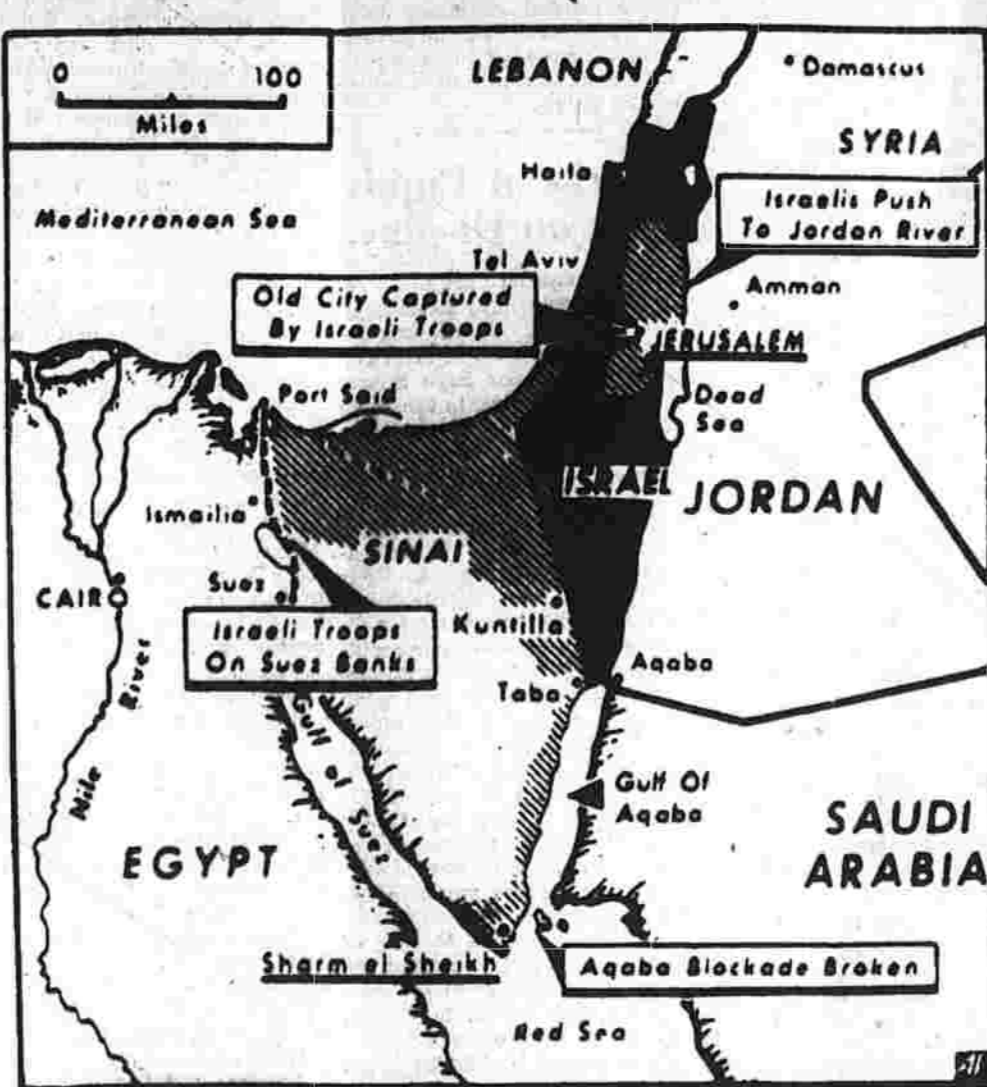

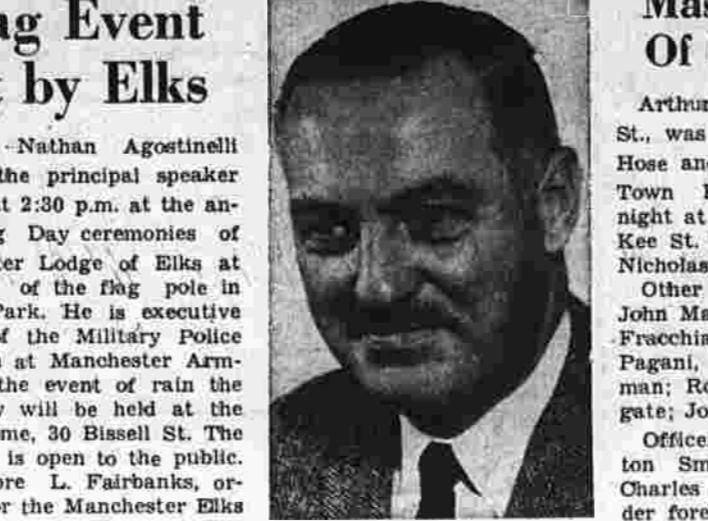

Sheinwold on Bridge

A certain kind of bridge hand seems very easy to play. You rattle off the first eight or nine tricks without a care in the world. Suddenly you stop; there aren't so many tricks as you had expected.

Opening lead—two of hearts; South won the first trick with the Jack of hearts; led a diamond to dummy's queen and returned a spade, losing the queen to West's ace. West returned a trump to South's queen. Declarer led a spade to the king, ruffed a spade, led a trump to the nine and ruffed another spade. Then he paused in great puzzlement; he still had to lose a diamond and two clubs and was therefore sure to go down.

"Fine work," North commented. "Why didn't you finesse with the ten of spades?"

"The spades might be 4-3," South objected. "You might lose to the doubler Jack. I thought I was going to make that hand."

South had the contract in his fingers, but he left it slip through. He should have led the ten of spades, which would have won the trick with the queen of diamonds. South should get to his hand with a trump to lead his low spade.

West must play low, and dummy's king wins. Declarer returns a spade from dummy, losing to the ace. Most Americans Home Emergency Evacuation Is Nearly Completed

BERRY, Lebanon (AP) — About 4,800 Americans living in Lebanon have been evacuated in an emergency air-bus operation that began Tuesday morning and was winding up today.

U.S. Embassy spokesman said 3,183 Americans had flown out by Wednesday night.

The embassy ordered the evacuation of all nonessential American officials and urged the evacuation of all nonessential private Americans after the outbreak of war Monday.

It chartered 39 Pan American and Middle East Airlines flights, each capable of carrying 120 evacuees, for the operation.

Crisis Gives Boost To Rail Strike Club

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Middle East crisis appears to have given the Johnson administration the boost it needed to secure congressional approval of legislation to head off a nationwide rail strike.

Some House critics of the President's proposal conceded privately that the fighting between Israel and the Arab states has all but doomed their efforts to revise or block legislation.

The Senate approved the bill 70 to 15 Wednesday and the House Commerce Committee takes it up today.

Congress has until June 15 to prevent a nationwide strike by some 137,000 shopcraft workers. On that date, a current Congress-ordered 45-day no-strike, no lockout period runs.

Chairman Harley O. Staggers, D-W.Va., said his House Commerce Committee will meet again Friday if no decision is reached today in order to ready the measure for consideration on the floor next Wednesday.

Rusk Stalls Critics Of Mid East Policy

WASHINGTON (AP) — Secretary of State Dean Rusk has blunted some congressional criticism of administration handling of the Middle East crisis — but hasn't silenced warnings of further trouble.

After hearing Rusk give a private rundown on developments, senators cautioned against undue optimism and letting a cease-fire, if and when one becomes a fact, turn into merely a rest before more violence.

And Iowa Republican Jack Javits urged that the United States withdraw all its citizens from the Arab countries before Egypt's "false charges" against the United States endanger U.S. lives.

Sen. Clifford P. Case, R-N.J., said Rusk told the meeting that the U.N. cease-fire resolution had stopped up the arms supplies to the Arab bloc about the State Department's explanations of Middle East policy gave measured praise to Rusk's performance Wednesday.

Senate Republican Leader Everett M. Dirksen said Rusk gave fresh information to some 50 senators who turned out for the session Tuesday.

Chairman J. W. Fulbright, D-Ark., of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, also reported he was encouraged, particularly by U.S. more productive than some past briefings when senators could glean they learned more from news reports.
