Not Just Oratorical

There has seldom been, in American official attitudes, or in the comment of television and press, as much sophisticated understanding of the required behavior of a Russian leader as that extended Premier Kosygin during the last three days of his stay in this country.

We knew, almost everybody was saying, that Premier Kosygin would, after the summit meetings with President Johnson, have to say things to convince his Arab friends that he hadn't deserted them as quickly and completely in the diplomatic field as Russia had deserted them on the field of battle.

We knew, everybody was pointing out, that Premier Kosygin had to guard himself against attack from "hawks" at home and from propaganda sniping from Communist China, both of which would be eager to charge him with making appeasement deals with the United States.

It was conceded that, after he escaped from the infectious clutch of the people of Glassboro, Premier Kosygin would have to put on his tough line again for his public appearances.

This sudden access of sophisticated understandings of the situation necessities of a Russian leader was a new thing. And it was so new and different, and even, in some degrees, refreshing that we dislike expressing the immediinstances, be much too comforting.

We believe the Russian position turned suddenly hard last winter, after the United States had failed to play along with the possibilities of peace negotiations over Vietnam and had resumed escalation of its military effort in Viet-

The crisis in the Near East was in itself one result of this new Russian hard position, and was designed to set up a pressure upon the United States which might bring the United States to a willingness to de-escalate in Vietnam. When Brael's military prowess knocked this piece of Russian toughness by proxy out of the arena, this was a defeat for Russia, but not a softening defeat. Rather, it was warning and resolution for Russia to try to be sure that, in its next tough move, it would calculate more soundly.

- If American policy makers and the American people can borrow, from their understanding of the necessities of Kosygin's public oratory here, some equal sophistication for their understanding of Russia's major policy necessities, they would know that American pressure in Vietnam inevitably had to come to the point where it was pressure upon Russia, and that Kosygin is telling an actual truth, not merely making a propaganda point, when he says that the situation in Vietnam stands as the great block between all other phases of the Russian-American relationship in the world.

The harder we push in Vietnam, the harder Russia has to push back, either somewhere else, as it attempted to do in the Near East, or in Vietnam itself. Suppose, then, we do become sophisticated enough to realize that Russia has taken a new hard, tough line and that this is almost an inevitable Russian response to actions and policies of our own. Do we then know what to do in order to create a situation in which Russian can go back toward a softer line? Do we know how to de-escalate? Or has an unending escalation of toughness become an inevitability for us too? Can we found a way to ease off in Vietnam without losing face and postion for ourselves? Last winter, calculating we had Hanoi at last beginning to weaken diplomatically, it was our decision to try to increase our pressure rather than to talk then. Now, feeling Russia harden, do we ourselves know how to do anything but harden our own position some more? The silence, it seems, is general.

Scourge Of Ishmael

Two conditions are needed for a settlement in the Middle East-a strong Israel and an Arab State with enough strength and popular backing to do a deal with Israel. Recent events have amply-too amply-fulfilled the first condition, while demolishing all hope of early fulfilment for the second. There is now no sign of a balance of power in the area. Israel is temporarily on top

The tone of General Dayan's utterances could hardly have been more disturbing, and I only wish some moderate Jews, both inside and outside Israel, would have the courage to give public expression to their private doubts and fears. Bloodymindedness may help to win a war, but it can be even more effective in losing a peace.

It grieves me to hear some of my Jewish friends in London arguing, in support of Dayan, that "appeasement is fatal," and quoting the policy of Britain and France in the thirties. They have completely misread the lesson of history. What was wrong with that policy was not that it was appeasement, but that it was appeasement from weakness. 




