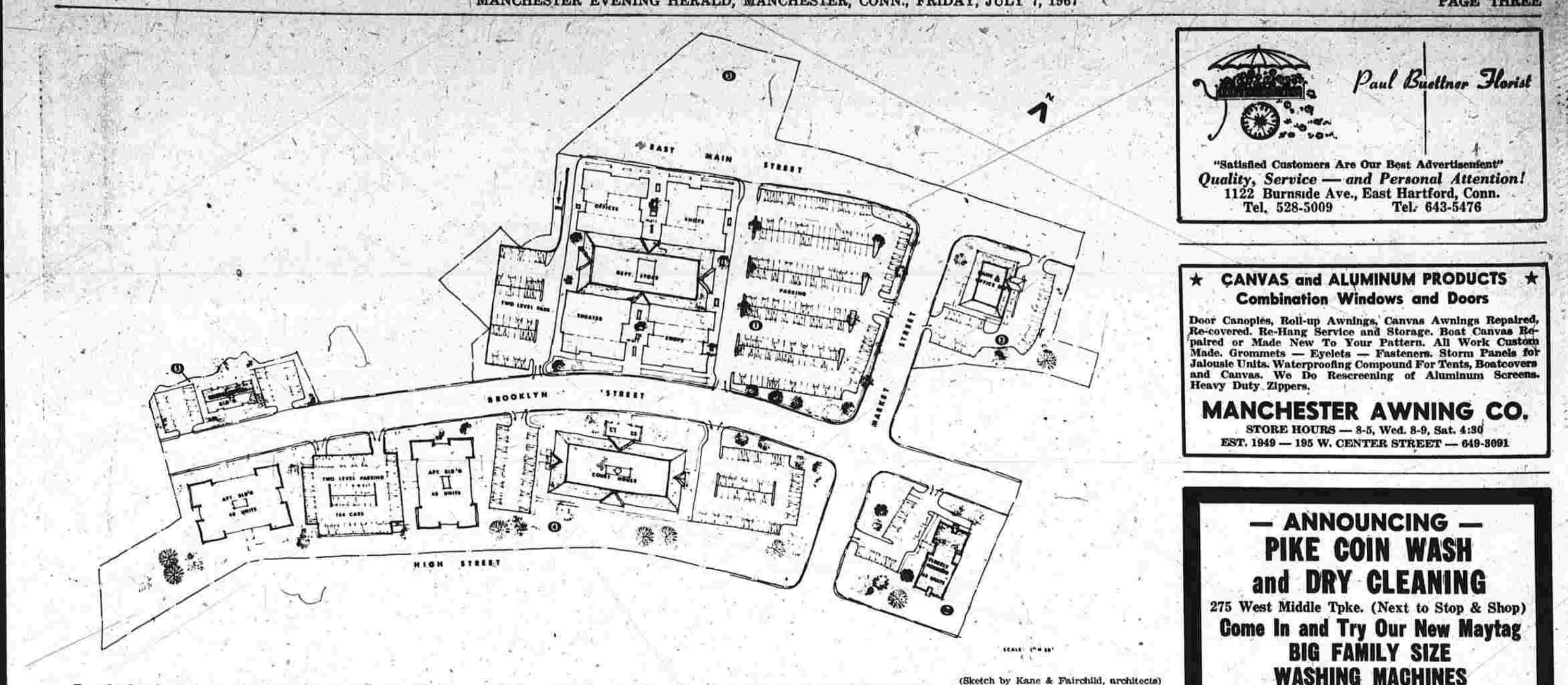

Choice of Tract Developer Ends Nine-Year Struggle

By MALCOLM BARLOW The nine-year history of the Vernon Redevelopment Commission, now reaching a climax, includes many rough periods and discouraging moments. In 1958, the discouraging aspect of a decaying City of Rockville prompted Mayor Herman G. Olson and other civic-minded citizens to form the Rockville Development Commission.

Housing Termed 'Excellent'

A report prepared by Planning Board and Donald, a planning firm, has found that the quality of housing in town 'excellent' with no 'significant residential blight or potential blight.'

A 1967 field survey by the firm showed that 96 per cent of the town's 3,818 housing units are sound.

Most Homes New With the exception of the public buildings in Wapping Center and the eastern third of South Windsor, and specifically, that portion of town lying to the east of Newers Rd. and small sections of Sullivan Ave., Denning St. and Backwood Rd. of the town's five neighborhoods, Wapping has the most recently desirable housing.

Five neighborhoods on the planning board's report are labeled as follows: South Windsor; Main St. Hill Terry; West Woods; Pleasant Valley and Wapping.

Causes of Deterioration Four primary causes were cited for the deterioration which does exist: Age of structures, inadequate original construction, insufficient maintenance and mixed land use.

The Main St. district is that portion of South Windsor lying to the west of Rt. 5, and bordered on the north, east and south by town boundary lines.

Five substandard units were found in the Hill Terry area. This problem of mixed land use, residential structures intermingled with the commercial and industrial uses, is the main cause of this blight, along with the concomitant feature of lack of maintenance.

The West Woods Neighborhood contains eight substandard units. Because of the sparse development in this area, the percentage of deterioration is high.

Undeveloped Portion In the central portion of South Windsor, the West Woods Neighborhood is located. It is bordered on the west by Rt. 5, on the north and east by Sullivan Ave. and on the south by Ellington Rd.

South Windsor Veteran GOP Councilman Bows from Town Politics

John J. Egan Jr., veteran Republican councilman and former mayor, has announced that he will not seek re-election in the Oct. 2 town election.

Egan has been appointed Michigan manager of the United Division of Sperry Rand Corp. and will move to Detroit.

MEKONG RIVER DELTA, people and furnishes most of the South Vietnam (AP)—American military commanders have hardened back to civil war.

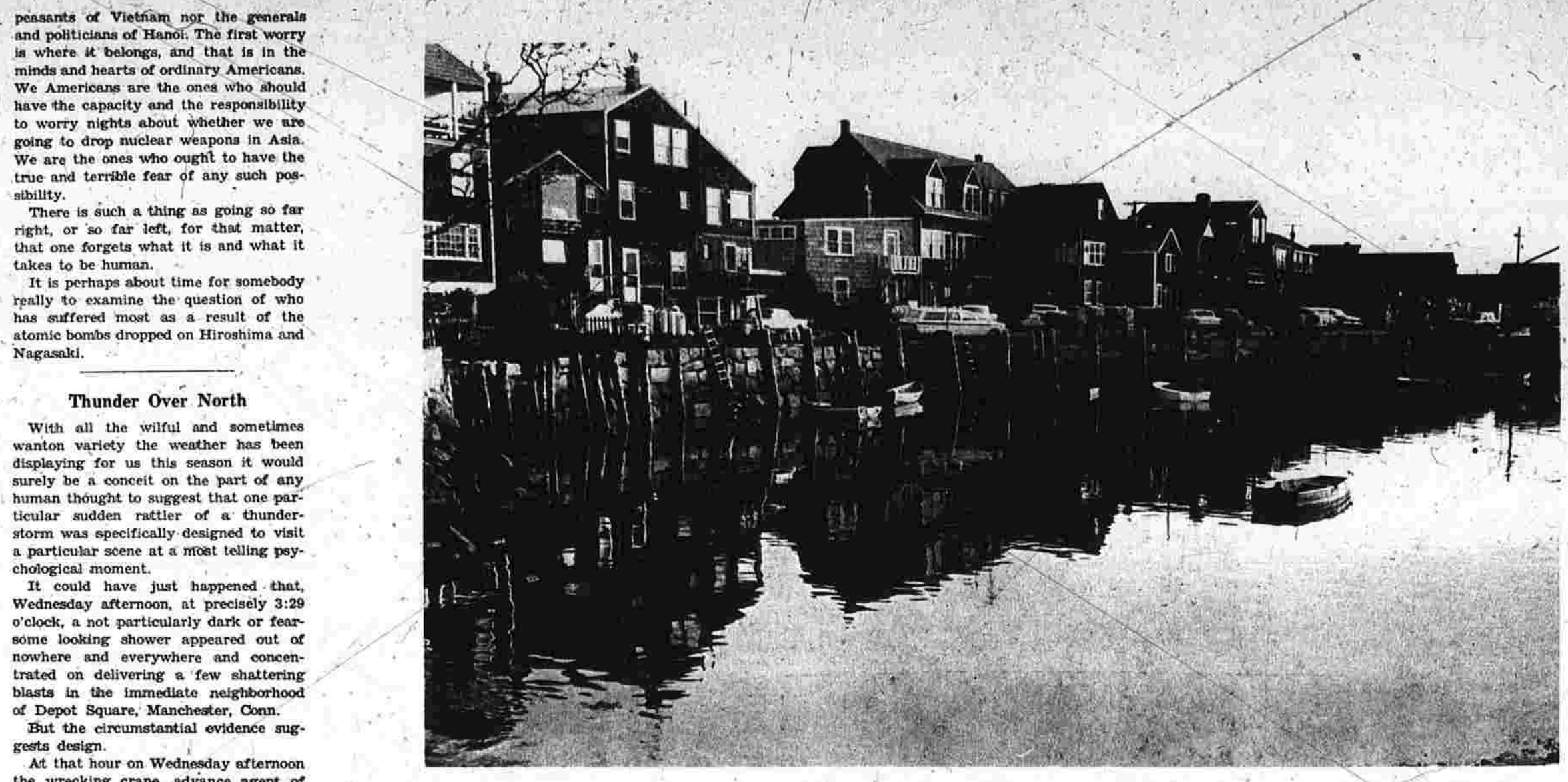
