# Negroes on Rampage In Iowa Community



## Police End Uproar in Waterloo

WATERLOO, Iowa (AP)—Gangs of Negroes ran amok with fire bombs and rocks in this north-eastern Iowa community Sunday night, and police finally broke up the riot after Negro leaders had tried but failed to settle things peacefully.

Several hundred persons jammed the predominantly Negro North End business section for several hours as young men started fires, smashed windows, looted stores and pelted vehicles with stones.

Five persons were injured seriously enough to require hospital treatment, although none was admitted as a patient.

Two parked cars were overturned, and one shot was fired at a police car but missed.

Police made five arrests after about 75 city officers, state highway patrolmen and sheriff's deputies charged up East Fourth Street and cleared the mob away.

Authorities had kept police out of the area for more than an hour after nightfall while leaders of the Negro community tried to stem an outbreak that had been simmering for two days.

About 10:30 p.m. police moved into the area briefly but pulled out again in a few moments. They did not enter again until nearly midnight, when fire alarms began pouring in and store windows were shattered all along the street.

Officers swung their clubs and cleared the street quickly, but it was 1:30 a.m. before peace was restored.

The street was left littered with broken glass and store merchandise dropped by looters who fled before the charging policemen.

Police Chief Robert Wright said although several hundred men, women and children were on the scene, most of the trouble was caused by about 100 "young hoods."

It was the third straight night of racial trouble in Waterloo, which has some 6,000 Negroes among its population of about 75,000.

## Viet Warfare U.S. Cruisers Pound Reds' Gun Positions

SAIGON (AP)—Three U.S. Navy cruisers pounded Communist gun positions in the demilitarized zone Sunday as the Red guns kept up their lethal artillery and rocket barrages on sandbagged Marine positions just below the zone.

The U.S. Command also reported that photographs of a bombing raid near Hanoi showed the Communists may have lost 68 of their aircraft carrier missiles to one devastating naval air strike.

Little ground action was reported as U.S. Defense Secretary Robert S. McNamara toured battle zones for the second day. After visiting the embattled Marines below the demilitarized zone Sunday, he shifted today to the Mekong Delta to look into pacification programs, tour a Special Forces camp and visit the new Army-Navy Mobile Riverine Force which moves infantry about the watery delta.

Off the demilitarized zone, the heavy cruiser St. Paul and the light cruiser Providence and the three moved close inshore to pound Red positions with 15 8-inch guns, 6 6-inch guns and 5 5-inch guns. The 8-inchers can reach almost 15 miles inside the zone.

The heavy blow at the Soviet-built missile came two days ago when Navy fliers hit a barracks area and missile storage site at Ban Yen Nanh, 14 miles southeast of Hanoi. It was the first raid against the area which apparently had been well scouted by reconnaissance planes.

A spokesman said pilot reports and photos after the strike disclosed that 68 canisters in which missiles are stored were hit by the raiding planes and the area was dotted with flames, explosions and broken wreckage.

The spokesman said the photographs did not disclose whether missiles were actually inside the canisters but it was likely they were loaded. However, the canisters were not believed to have contained the explosive warheads of the 37-foot-long missiles.

## 263 Left Dead In Japan After 'Weak' Typhoon

TOKYO (AP)—Typhoon Billie weakened to a tropical storm by the time it hit southwest Japan over the weekend, but floods and landslides killed 263 persons, left 101 missing and 460 injured.

It was feared the death toll would be the largest from a storm since June 1961, when 302 persons were killed in a typhoon.

Thousands of police and soldiers were sent out to clear debris, restore communications and search for victims.

The storm hit northwestern Kyushu and western Honshu islands, flooding more than 200,000 homes, sweeping away roads, bridges and rail beds, paralyzing road and rail traffic and cutting communications throughout the area.

The district around the atom-bombed city of Hiroshima, in western Honshu, was hit hardest. There 99 persons were reported dead, 51 missing and 120 injured.

# Assured Wage, Bonus Seen Union Demands

DETROIT (AP)—Walter P. Reuther indicated today his United Auto Workers Union would demand a bonus based on profits and payable on top of a guaranteed annual income in new contracts with the automotive industry this year.

Reuther's disclosure came in a news conference just before the first of the 1967 bargaining sessions began, this one at the nation's largest automaker, General Motors Corp.

Shortly before, Louis G. Seaton, GM vice president for personnel, hinted the corporation was agreeable to a wage increase but added that "this appears to be a crucial economic

year—for GM and for the nation.

Asked if he were going to talk about profit sharing in this year's negotiations, Reuther told a news conference, "We're going to talk about 'equity sharing.'"

He then explained an attempt would be made to win a basic salary for workers, just like executives, and that "after the year is over and we know exactly what the size of the profit pie is, the worker shall be entitled to a second increment" in pay.

Reuther has made a guaranteed annual income, a top priority in this year's negotiations and says a worker must know at the beginning of a year what his income will be for the next 12 months, any layoffs notwithstanding.

The Detroit News reported, meanwhile, that a poll of UAW members showed they placed the guaranteed annual income proposal a poor third in their preferences in this summer's contract talks. Wages ranked first, with retirement program improvements—earlier retirement emphasized—a distant second.

Seaton said earlier the auto industry's cost-of-living clause, which increased wages 18 cents hourly during the current three-year pact, "must be given full recognition in negotiating a new contract."

GM workers were described by Seaton as being in the top third income group in the United States with an average wage, "including cost-of-living allowances and many fringe benefits," of \$4.68 per hour.

Furthermore, he added, "their straight-time wages are 30 per cent above the average for all manufacturing employees throughout the country."

Seaton said, "Our employees have very substantial guarantees of income in cases of short work weeks or layoffs" under

## Congress at Work, Long Session Seen

WASHINGTON (AP)—Congress returned from a 10-day recess today facing the prospect of staying in session until well into autumn if it is going to clean up the work laid out for it.

All the problems put aside for the third long congressional holiday of the year were still waiting to be solved and a new and tougher one is likely to be added—a request for a tax increase.

Despite claims of Democratic leaders that the first six months of the session produced significant achievements, little that was not tied to the Vietnam war was accomplished and the bulk of President Johnson's program is still to be voted on.

Neither the House nor Senate planned to deal with major bills until later in the week.

In the House, a bill aimed at curbing riots is to be taken up Thursday and its overwhelming approval is expected. The Senate should get to a truth-in-lending bill during the week after disposing of bills authorizing funds for the Atomic Energy Commission and appropriating money to run Congress.

The truth-in-lending bill, finally making it to the floor after six years of battling in committee, would require the disclosure of the true annual interest rate and the total interest in dollars on all consumer debt

transactions. The House hasn't even held hearings on it.

Little other major legislation is ready for floor action. The House Ways and Means Committee, which was expected to bring out a Social Security revision bill last month, is talking now of needing two or three more weeks to work on it. The Senate won't begin hearings on it until the House passes it.

Hearings are still under way in the House on the administration's antipoverty program and will probably last all month. The Senate has yet to begin hearings on a House-passed school aid bill.

Johnson's requests for a \$25-million increase in postal rates and a 4 1/2 per cent pay raise for government workers are still in committee and not likely to emerge before the end of July. His bill to beef up local law enforcement agencies should reach the House floor soon.

One pressing problem to be dealt with is a bill to head off a threatened nationwide rail strike.

House and Senate conferees held three fruitless sessions just before the recess in an attempt to reconcile differences in bills passed by each body. Six unions

## Gov. Wallace Under Surgery For Malignancy

HOUSTON, Tex. (AP)—Gov. Lurleen Wallace of Alabama entered surgery this morning for an exploratory operation for a malignant tumor.

Doctors were to determine the extent of malignancy and, if possible to remove the tumor from the state executive, now 40, in an operation expected to last several hours.

Doctors said they hoped to be able to tell what the operation revealed when a medical bulletin is issued at 3 p.m.

The malignancy, first detected three weeks ago by doctors in Montgomery, Ala., was confirmed Sunday by specialists at the M. D. Anderson Hospital and Tumor Institute in Houston.

It is Mrs. Wallace's second battle with cancer in 18 months. She underwent surgery in January 1966 for removal of a cancer of the uterus. When she returned to the hospital for a

## U.N. Will Send Observers To Suez Cease-Fire Line

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (AP)—The U.N. Security Council decided today to send military observers to the Suez Canal cease-fire line, scene of Israeli and Egyptian troop clashes the past two weeks.

The Israeli cabinet met in Jerusalem to consider whether it would permit the U.N. force to take up positions on the eastern side of the canal. Authoritative sources indicated Israel would have no objection as long as the arrangement was temporary.

Secretary-General U Thant also will seek the approval of Egypt for stationing the observers on Egypt's west bank of the canal. Egypt wants more information on the plan before giving approval.

Radio Cairo said King Hussein of Jordan had arrived in the Egyptian capital to a hero's welcome to meet with four Arab government chiefs gathered there. He was welcomed by President Gamal Abdel Nasser.

Already in Cairo were President Houari Boumediene of Algeria and Nouruddin Atassi of Syria. Both are following a hard line toward Israel, and Algeria has refused to accept the U.N. cease-fire that halted the Israeli-Arab war June 10 after six days of fighting.

President Abdel Rahman Aref of Iraq is expected to join the other four later in what will be a little Arab summit conference but not the kind envisaged by Hussein, who wants all Arab nations represented.

There was speculation that Hussein would urge moderation toward Israel since he lost the Old City of Jerusalem, a source of tourist income, and the good farming land on the west side of the Jordan River in the war with Israel. If so, he will clash with Boumediene and Atassi.

An Israeli Army Jeep hit a mine on a road east of the Suez Canal Sunday, killing one soldier and wounding two others, an Israeli military spokesman said. He said other mines were found and there were footprints between the canal and the road.

## Urge U.S. Take Initiative

# De-escalation Sought By 8 GOP Legislators

WASHINGTON (AP)—Eight Republican congressmen proposed today a unilateral diplomatic initiative by the United States for a step-by-step de-escalation of the Vietnam war.

The group said the United States should halt all bombing in North Vietnam north of the 21st Parallel for 90 days. This area includes Hanoi but not the port city of Haiphong.

If North Vietnam responded with a de-escalation move of its own within 60 days, the United States would then halt bombing north of the 20th Parallel for a 60-day period—and so forth through five steps.

"Assuming that both sides would respond in turn in this de-escalatory process, both the U.S. bombing of the North and the North Vietnamese infiltration into the South could come to an end," the Republican congressmen said.

Otherwise, they added, the U.S. bombing of North Vietnam would continue.

The proposal was outlined in a statement prepared for a news conference.

Rep. F. Bradford Morse of Massachusetts, spokesman for the group, was successful, "a small step" were successful, "a spirit of confidence might emerge" between the United States and Hanoi which could lead to peace negotiations, a similar staged de-escalation in South Vietnam or both.

"By halting the bombing in stages, by starting the cessation in northern North Vietnam and gradually working southward, and by tying each successive stage of equivalent North Viet-

namite reductions in its support operations to the South, the plan minimizes the military risks of the United States," Morse said.

Morse said the plan was not put forward as a panacea for settling the Vietnam war but seemed to offer more promise than the present war policy of the Johnson administration or the alternatives suggested by either those who oppose the war or those who want it stepped up.

Morse said he submitted the proposal to the administration some time ago but got no response.

# People In The News

One of Glinka's friends and pupils was Edy. Together with Balakirev (1837-1910). Together with Cesar Cui (1835-1918), they founded the Free School of Music and organized concerts devoted to the works of Russian composers.

Cui's own compositions don't amount to very much, and are really not too distinctly Russian. This is not surprising, since his father was a French soldier who took his education following the defeat of Napoleon's army in 1812. The son followed in his father's footsteps and became a professor of military engineering, as well as a writer and historian.

His interest in history, particularly Russian history, spurred Balakirev toward a nationalistic style of composition which Cui himself could never achieve. One of Balakirev's best-known works bears the simple title, "Russian," and is thoroughly Russian in form and thematic material. Another work sometimes encountered is the symphonic poem "Tamara," or "Tamara," as it is sometimes spelled, and concerns an oriental princess who gave her name to that region we know today as Sakharin.

Balakirev was undoubtedly a difficult work which exists both for piano and for orchestra, and is one of the most thoroughly symphonic pieces for piano ever written. It's also interesting music.

A friend of Cui's was Alexander Porphyryevich Borodin (1833-87) who likewise had a profession outside of composition. He was a well-known physician and biochemist, who became active in fostering education for women.

He wrote the musical comedy "Kismet" which played Broadway recently. He didn't know he wrote it, since what he actually wrote was the opera "Kismet" for Broadway. Still, a strict chronological order is impossible since so many of the composers overlapped each other, with the 19th century, producing more composers whose works are played today than any other.

Lindsay Opens New York For Movies in Manhattan

NEW YORK (AP) — The camera focuses on the marquee of a grocery market at Broadway and 90th Street: "We are Proud of Our Bosses." "We stay out of the tough areas," said producer Howard "The Odd Couple."

Then the shot pans down to the figures of Jack Lemmon and Walter Matthau, strolling down Broadway in animated conversation. It is midnight, and they fall shooting "Barfoot in the Park." "We couldn't get enough police to handle the crowds today. Now we can get all we need."

Theodore J. Flicker, who has been directing James Coburn in "The Odd Couple," here, had praise for the police. "They are funny, bright and polite — not like the cops I knew when I was in New York. Not one has his hand out. And they know how to handle the crowd."

The other night we were in shooting in the heart of Greenwich Village, and the crowd was so thick, I'm sure it must have injected a note of authority, it would have touched off a real riot. But the police, men hidden along with the hipsters, and nothing happened."

Within an hour, the Paramount company has finished the complicated scene and moves to another Manhattan location. Such is the facility with which film crews can operate in New York, says Mayor John F. Lindsay, who has been in the city since he took office in 1964.

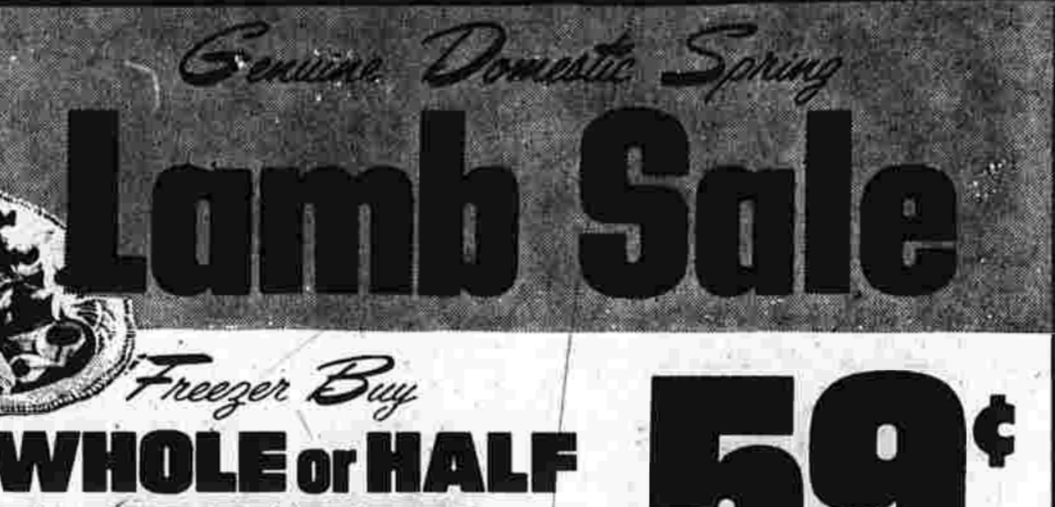
