





Part of the reason for this may be found, perhaps, in reports of dead end easimism sweeping the thoughts and lings of the Johnson Administration itself, as if it were now beginning to discover and experience the realities which critics called the only inevitable result of the stepped up involvement the orders to begin bombing North

And the inner pessimism reported in the administration itself would seem to be rooted in the actual course of the war. This is that it gets tougher, and more costly, both in lives and dollars, as it goes along, and that, despite this, it seems to stay as far from any conclusion as ever.

At any rate against such a background we have such developments as the following:

Eight respected Republican Congressmen join in a special statement urging a phased attempt at joint de-escalation and negotiation. Senate Majority Leader Mansfield

delivers the most forthright and pessimistic speech he has yet made on the war, noting that Defense Secretary McNamara has been given reports of "progress" in Vietnam, and then charging that "the fact is that reports of progress are strewn, like burned out tanks, all along the road which has led this nation ever more deeply into Vietnam and Southeast Asia during the past decade and a half."

Senator Mansfield's major worry is a simple one: World War III may be, starting in Vietnam. Michigan's Governor Romney, whose

presidential candidacy has been believed to be in trouble, suddenly revises his Hartford speech stand on Vietnam, in which he at least backed the Johnson administration's basic commitment in Vietnam, toward a sharper criti-

"The Administration," Governor Romney now says, "has been guilty of 'over-reaction' in military terms with an accompanying and unfortunate growth of feeling among the American people that a purely military solution in Vietnam is possible. If continuance of our policy of escalation triggers a wider war with major Soviet and Communist Chinese participation, then the the Administration must be held ac-

Romney now asks de-escalation of our bombing, and an increase in proof that the troops of South Vietnam are carrying more of their share of the

Such varied movements of disen gagement from those concepts of the war the President's oratory has now been trying to establish over a period of two and a half years may be finding parallels, for all we know, within the ranks of the administration. It may even be possible that Defense Secretary McNemera returns from his ninth asesament of conditions in Vietnam in

some mood of disaffection himself. But what one really wonders, as one watches the nation and the administration coming to those realizations which some commentators predicted back in 1965, is whether any slight sense of having been wrong, of having played high stakes with too little real knowledge and qualification, has begun to permeate to those academic power theorists who were primarily

responsible for our big military commitment in Vietnam. Their special vision of the American destiny in Asia, not the professional zeal of the generals, must be given main credit for forming a policy coalition with the Texan heritage of President Johnson. How are the great influential academic hawks of the Vietnam policy—the McGeorge Bundys and the Walt Rostows - taking the present stage of that commitment? Are they, perhaps, just a shade sorry they had so much influence?

Black On Diplomacy And Business

Eugene R. Black, the highly respected former president of the World Bank, can perhaps be accused of having become so much a citizen of the world that he himself has grown out of some of his native Americanisms, and has begun to mix a certain sophistication with his own basic instincts as a businessman: In recent public discussions, notably at Wellesley College in June, Mr. Black has displayed his instincts as a business-

man by recommending that we take more of our business of foreign aid out of the hands of the diplomats, out of the present bilateral system which, he concedes, has the weakness of putting too much politics into our efforts to do good abroad, and turn it over to the hands of business. And he has expressed the theory that if we let business, and hard-headed business principles take over more of our doing-good abroad, that would produce more of the political result we are seeking than our present political methods.

But while Mr. Black thus seeks to take away from the politicians and the diplomats some of the functioning he thinks might better be done by business talents by business standards, he also has had some advice for diplomats which sounds almost counter-American "What we need," said Mr. Black as he described our diplomatic effort in the world, "is a little less enthusiasm, a little less activism. We should cultivate diplomacy more as a profession, and

"Today the diplomat at home and abroad spends more time being a manager and an administrator than he pends nourishing the knowledge and skills necessary to be a good political analyst and adviser, and a good advocate of our interests. . . .

less as a business.

"Because our diplomacy has came to embrace so much official business, we are too often surprised by events in the world which should not surprise us. We are too often forced to take action in

Mr. Black's ideas, on such examina-

tion, prove not to be very revolutionary after all. He is merely recommending that businessmen be businessmen and diplomats try to learn to be diplomats. But even he must realize that, when he advises an American diplomat to learn to manifest "a little less enthusi aam, a little less activism," he is perhaps a little ahead of the present stage of development of the typical American character. A diplomat who had succeeded in suppressing entirely his enthusiasm and his activism would have to carry the flag with him to convince people of his nationality.

Two New Yachts

Unless unexpected developments come about, Intrepid and Dame Pattie, both newly built, are going to be the opposing yachts in September's America's Cup races. So far there is every indication that Intrepid will be this country's choice to defend against the Australian challenger in the international sailing contests off Newport. Both the new 12-meter boats already

have proved their swiftness. In the recent round-robin preliminary trials, in the western part of Long Island Sound, only American Eagle compiled a wonlost record even close to Intrepid's. Constellation, the 1964 defender was less successful and Weatherly, defender against England in 1962, was outclassed. Weatherly is not actually a candidate anyway, filling in for the revamped Columbia until the latter's arrival from California. Columbia, oldest of the five sloops, defeated England's Sceptre in

1958, when the cup competition was renewed for the first time since before World War II. Constellation also is regarded as a trial horse. Intrepid's only loss in the eight early tests was due to a navigational error,

when the wrong marker was turned and several minutes were lost in rectifying the mistake. A second set of trials known as the "observation" series. starting this week and a final set in August will decide the defender's identity, out only a reversal of form, or a surprise by still-untested Columbia, can reduce Intrepid's chances.

Dame Pattie's supremacy in the Australian trials of Sydney was even more convincing. Gretel, the 1962 chal-lenger which captured one race in five t Newport, was no match for the newcomer, skippered by "Jock" Sturrock, who steered Gretel five years ago. So decisive was the margin that the original plan to send both boats to America or further tests was dropped.

Thus Sturrock and Intrepid's "Bus" Mosbacher are likely to renew their rivalry in September. Crews and helmsmen are almost as important as the boats, maybe more so. Teamwork has to highly developed, and American crews are sharpened by the drilling they undergo in the summer series of tuneups. That's one advantage the home

forces have. Familiarity with prevailing weather onditions is another. The America's Cup races are now held over a triangu-Olympic course of 24.3 miles, with four of the six legs being salled on the long side of the triangle three of the four to windward. Downwind, into the wind, tacking or reaching, both Dame Pattie with its narrow beam and long waterline and Intrepid with its two rudders have shown themselves to be ex-ceptionally fast and maneuverable.
