China's Nuclear Bomb May Force LBJ Move

CAPE KENNEDY, Fla. (AP) — Red China's development of nuclear rockets may force President Johnson to re-evaluate his position on the arms race.

Although most of the nation's military men favor an arms race, President Johnson and Secretary of Defense Robert S. McNamara are reluctant to give a go-ahead for the present Nike-X system for these reasons:

1. The extremely high cost, an estimated total of \$22 billion to protect just U.S. cities, leaving unaccounted 100 million each with 10,000 or more missiles.

2. Rapid technological advances that continually improve missiles. Furthermore, scientists on the staff of Japan's Institute of Atmospheric and Space Sciences concluded that the explosion had occurred 18 to 31 miles high, indicating that the bomb was sent aloft by a missile.

3. The Russians have started constructing at least a limited missile system, and Johnson is saying that if both nations hold off, each will have considerable doubt on the ability of any system to protect our population against Soviet attack.

President Johnson has asked \$750 million in the fiscal 1968 budget for contingency production of the Nike-X system.

He indicated there was little chance, saying: "We believe the missile defense system is not a weapon of attack, it is a weapon of protection."

Earlier last month the chief of Soviet civil defense boasted that his country could destroy all enemy missiles before they reached Soviet territory.

Coventry GOP Plans Newsletter

The Republican Town Committee has authorized the publication of a Republican newsletter, and town chairman John Allen has named Atty. David Rappe as its editor.

Rappe said that the first edition will be mailed to town Republicans by the end of this month. Thereafter, the newsletter will be published "every so often" with an election special anticipated shortly before the Oct. 2 town elections.

Rappe also said that the purpose of the newsletter will be to provide a method for the town committee to communicate with town Republicans and to provide a sounding board for Republican opinion.

In addition, the newsletter will act as a calendar for coming events to be sponsored by the town committee, the Republican Women's Club and the Young Republicans. It will help provide also a drawing together of the Coventry Republicans on ideas and direction.

The first edition of the newsletter will contain a full explanation of the "Republican Plan" which consists of Richard Niles' and the Republican Party's platform.

Others favor holding off until improvements in technology make possible more sophisticated systems, such as exploding huge nuclear bombs in the path of incoming warheads, or lifting a satellite into orbit that could destroy a rocket as it orbited.

Much research and testing is being done in these areas, as well as on projects designed to intercept, inspect and destroy hostile satellites.

Until recently, most satellites were launched by orbital mechanics. However, both the United States and Soviet Union now have maneuverable satellites that could easily destroy present antiaircraft defenses.

Systems under study by the United States include manueverable nuclear attack ships Korymbus and the latter could learn the contents of the suspected satellite and, if necessary, destroy it.

Defense officials report the United States already can determine where a satellite is located, and they believe they have placed a nuclear bomb in orbit. However, they say it is unlikely that a satellite could be destroyed by a nuclear bomb.
