If, in the course of his dilemma, d Gaulle seemed lacking in courtesy, he fortunately did manage to remind himself of a nightmare even worse than that of the continued living of French souls under the politics of Canada. So there came, in some speeches, a saving warning to his ardent followers - a warning not to split and weaken Canada so that either of its two halves might then fall into the control of that suzerainty even more despicable than the Canadian—the vulgar American.
