Tollard Town Appearance Changing From Rural to Suburban

The rapid population expansion, experienced by Tollard in the 1960's, has changed the basic characteristics and attitudes of the town. Formerly a rural farming community, it is now taking on the appearance of outer suburbia.

Former winding country lanes, bordered by woods and brooks, are now lined with houses. The sounds of children at play can be heard over the chirping of the birds.

Tollard took twenty years, from 1940 to 1960, to gain 1,000 residents. It has gained an additional 4,100 since 1960, following the present population of 7,100.

The attitudes of residents have undergone changes, as the newcomers have moved out from the more heavily populated suburban and city areas, and seeking more land and a country atmosphere.

The newcomers have also brought with them problems. Problems of education, the schools, sanitation, and a demand for services they formerly took for granted in urban areas.

A major cause of the town's growth is the Wilbur Cross Highway (144) which cuts through the entire length of the town, dividing it into two areas. The highway provides easy access for commuters to reach labor markets in Manchester, East Hartford and Hartford.

Home Price Rise
Homes in the early sixties were available locally at relatively low prices. The means of the average worker. New houses generally could be purchased for \$13,000 to \$15,000.

New homes presently being built range from \$10,000 to \$23,000 and are attracting a different type person.

The early sixties found many newly married families moving into town, purchasing their first homes and settling down to raise a family.

Those moving into the present new homes are more affluent, and usually are several years older and have children already of school age.

The children of the newcomers of 1961 and 62 are now reaching school age. The town was not immediately faced with the problem of educating their children, and could plan for them by the time they approached school age.

The children of present new home purchasers are usually ready to be immediately absorbed into the school system. This will become more of a problem when the larger subdivisions presently before the Planning and Zoning Commission are approved. These plans call for several 50 or more homes in each subdivision.

The town's population is housed almost entirely of single family homes. There are no apartment buildings in the town.

Different Subdivisions
The typical local subdivision differs from many found in more heavily populated areas. Trees are in abundance and have been left in place by the developers. The houses are built on three-fourths to one acre lots, providing plenty of room for the energetic children.

California City Buys Big Liner As Tourist Lure

LONG BEACH, Calif. (AP)—The Queen Mary, venerable lady of the Atlantic, will find a permanent home on the waterfront of Long Beach and rival Disneyland as a lure for tourists.

The ocean liner, now too old for travel as a luxury ship, is being sold by Cunard Lines to the city of Long Beach for \$3,440,000.

The city, whose bid topped 17 others, plans to spend \$3 million to \$5 million to make the Queen Mary into a maritime museum, hotel and convention center.

The news Wednesday from London, where the sale was announced, created excitement among Long Beach citizens.

"It's a rival Disneyland," said Mayor Edwin Wade.

65,000 messages from Jordan to the west bank for members of families separated by the ceasefire line. But so far only 1,223 replies have been received.

The replies were on forms also unacceptable to the Jordanians because they bore the Jewish Star of David. The forms were returned—but after the messages were copied.

There was speculation that U.N. intervention might be involved to break the deadlock. Nils G. Gunning, touring the Middle East as Secretary-General U Thant's special representative, was reported aware of the situation.

Hundreds of refugees continue to move east every day from the occupied territory, but only 30 families—classified as hardship cases—have gone west officially.

The refugees in the Jordanian camps also are threatened by a food shortage if Lebanese dock workers continue to refuse to unload an American freighter due in Beirut today with 4,700 tons of flour given by the U.S. government. The dock workers are insisting that the Arab ban on American and British ships be maintained.

"If that flour is not unloaded," said a U.N. relief official in Amman, "it means no bread for the refugees here, and without bread many of the refugees will go hungry."

LOW YIELD TEST SHOT

WASHINGTON (AP)—A nuclear test shot of low intermediate yield—equal to 20,000 to 200,000 tons of TNT—was set off underground today at the Atomic Energy Commission's Nevada test site, the AEC announced.

It was the 14th weapons-related test since the program was resumed at development of peaceful uses of nuclear energy.

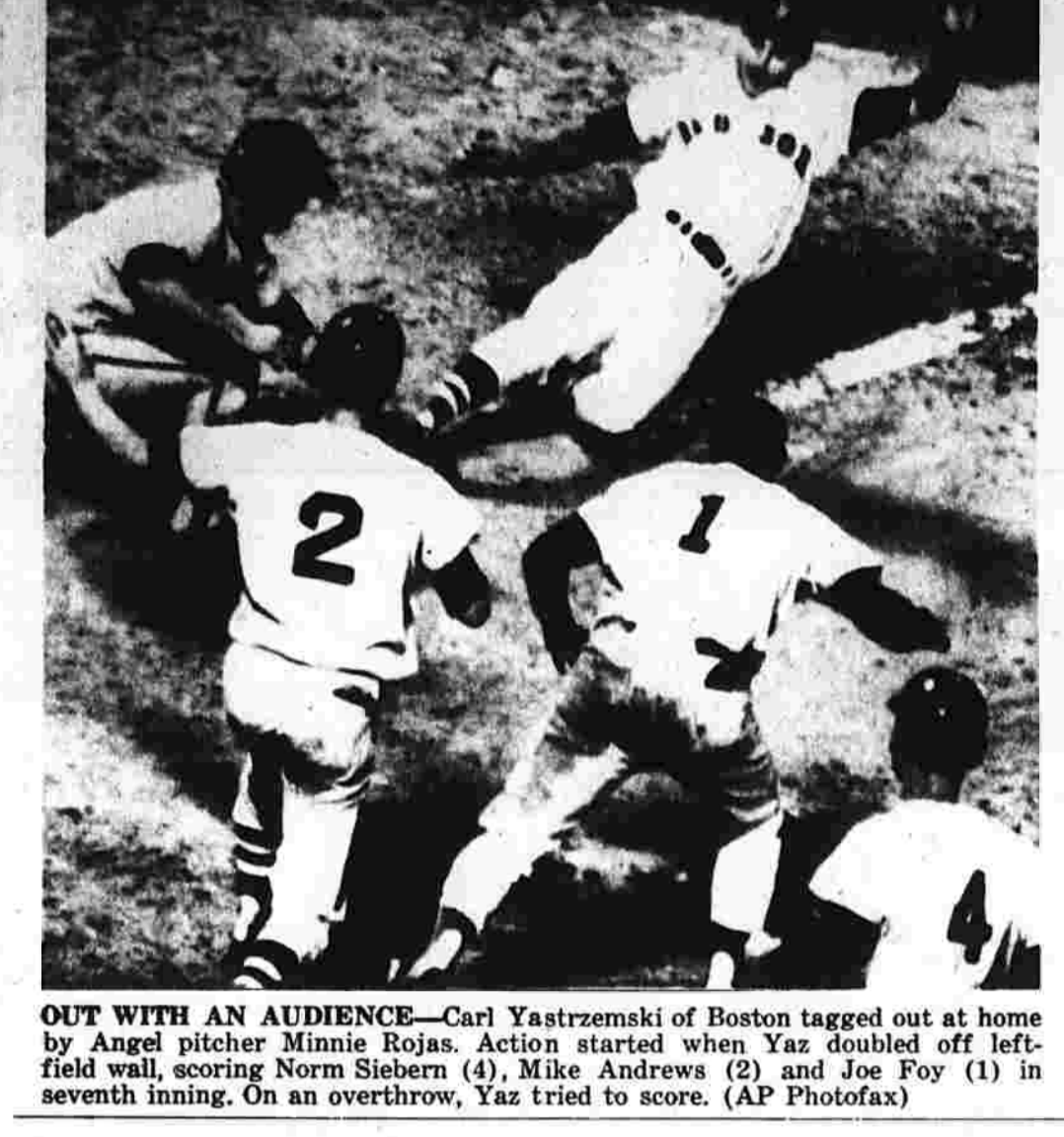

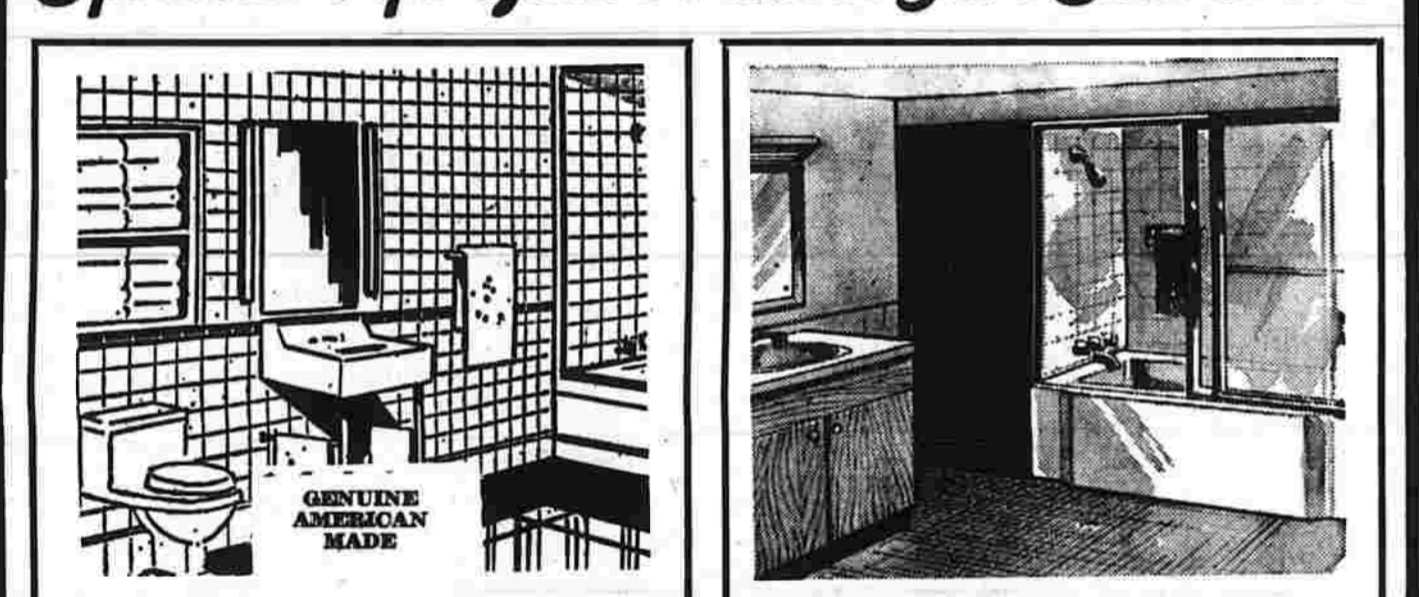
