

## Forrestal Limpers to Port, 145 Men Dead or Missing

### 4 Climbers Still Lost In Alaska

ANCHORAGE, Alaska (AP) — A rescue party, hurrying ahead of a gathering storm Sunday searched Mt. McKinley where at least three climbers were at least three climbers died but could find no trace of four other men who are missing and feared dead.

The five-man party, exhausted by the strenuous search in the rarefied air on the 20,320-foot mountain, contacted park headquarters by radio from the 15,000-foot level Sunday afternoon.

They said they were trying to reach the 12,000-foot level for more protection from the wind and snow storm which closed on the peak during the day.

The storm, expected to last up to 72 hours, smothered most of the remaining hope of finding alive the four climbers who have been missing nearly two weeks.

The searchers said they had combed every major crevasse between the 17,900-foot camp and the 15,000-foot level and had checked all snow caves where the missing men might have burrowed to escape the wind and cold.

"It's impossible for an outsider to comprehend the conditions on the mountain," Chief Ranger Art Hayes said. "The peak is in the jet stream, where winds up to 150 miles an

## Rolling Human Fireballs Paralyze Forrestal Pilot

ABOARD THE CARRIER FORRESTAL, OF Vietnam (AP) — The fireballs that hopped and tumbled toward Lt. James J. Campbell were men, and he stood transfixed beneath the white body of an F4 Phantom jet until he heard their screams.

Then Campbell and scores of other Navy men preparing the jet planes for strikes against North Vietnam flung themselves on the fireballs that seconds earlier had been their buddies.

"We rolled on them, dived on them. Anything to get the fires put," said Campbell, from Homestead, Pa. "Some of the guys were burning from head to foot. I got the fire on the top part of a man's body out, but his legs were still burning as the medics carried him away.

"They were screaming and writhing. And as their planes burned up we saw the big bombs fall to the flight deck, glowing red."

The young officer was in the midst of the worst U.S. Navy disaster in a combat zone since World War II. He was at the after end of the flight deck of the 76,000-ton carrier Forrestal, that had steamed into the Gulf of Tonkin five days earlier

to join the war against the Communists.

A pilot poised to participate in the war had probably the first intimation that disaster was imminent Saturday. He was Lt. Cmdr. John S. McCain Jr. of Washington, D.C., a graying 30 and the son of the chief of U.S. naval forces in Europe.

Hunched over the controls of his A4 Skyhawk, he was third in line from the catapult that was to blast him and the other planes off to North Vietnam.

A loud explosion shook McCain.

"I thought my aircraft had exploded. I looked out and fuel was spilling over the flight deck. Flame was behind me

and in front of me. I thrust open my canopy and edged out along my refueling pole. The flames were 10 feet deep around the plane."

McCain jumped 10 feet to the deck and rolled through the fire, scorching his light tan flight suit.

"I rolled clear and moved toward the starboard side. I looked back and saw another pilot leaving his plane. Then he fell into the fire, he was burning. I ran toward him," McCain said.

"Then I saw a chief repairman come up. He ran right past me into the fire toward the pi-

### New Blaze Breaks Out, No Damage

SAIGON (AP)—The aircraft carrier Forrestal, ravaged by flames and bomb blasts Saturday, limped into Subic Bay in the Philippines today and another fire broke out as she prepared to dock.

It was only a flash fire, nothing like the holocaust that left 76 of the crew dead, 69 missing and presumed dead, and 64 injured on the 76,000-ton carrier.

Knocked out of action in the aerial war in Vietnam, the Forrestal was replaced in the Gulf of Tonkin by the 38,500-ton Intrepid.

The U.S. Command said there was no significant action in 33 allied operations on the ground. But it reported 23 Marines killed and 191 wounded in a North Vietnamese ambush Saturday in the demilitarized zone between North and South Vietnam.

At Subic Bay, the cry of "Fire!" rang out from the Forrestal's loud-speaker system. No flames were visible to those on shore, and Navy officials presumed the fire was small.

The Forrestal later docked, and no fire was visible aboard.

### Thant Disputes U.S. Version of Vietnam Fight

GREENSBORO, N.C. (AP)—U.N. Secretary-General U Thant had disputed directly the U.S. version of its fight in Vietnam. He says it is against a nationalist independence movement, not against Communist aggression.

Thant chose an international forum of Quakers, long-time advocates of peace, for his strongest criticism yet of the U.S. military action.

"It is nationalism, and not communism, that animates the resistance movement in Vietnam against all foreigners, and now particularly against Americans," he said.

A surge of applause came from the audience of about 8,000 Sunday night in the Greensboro Memorial Auditorium as part of the Friends World Conference.

He said, "I am convinced that the war cannot be brought to an end until the United States and her allies realize that it is being fought by Vietnamese, not as a war of Communist aggression, but as a war of national independence."

## Dodd's Life the Same; Differences Hidden

WASHINGTON (AP)—On the surface at least, life for Sen. Thomas J. Dodd now appears about the same as it did before he was censured 92 to 5 by his colleagues last month.

But it is apparent from talking to the 60-year-old Connecticut Democrat and other senators that neither he nor they can erase the censure from their minds.

"Of course I'd like to forget about it," Dodd told a reporter. "But it just isn't possible."

Colleagues observe all the amenities in their contacts with him, but there are differences not readily apparent.

One senator, for example, who had invited several colleagues to speak to summer interns working in his office, said he had not and would not invite Dodd.

The Senate censured Dodd June 23 for conduct "which is contrary to accepted morals, degrades from the public trust and tends to bring the Senate into dishonor and disrepute."

This was based on a finding by the Senate ethics committee that Dodd had converted to his personal benefit at least \$115,

083 on campaign and testimonial funds.

The Senate rejected 51 to 45 a second count that Dodd billed both the Senate and private groups for the same travel expenses.

The censure vote did not deprive Dodd of any of his rights or privileges as a senator and he has made an obvious effort to carry on his work as usual.

He has put out statements about pending legislation and actively has tried to prevent the extradition of former Prime Minister Moise Tshombe to the Congo, where he has been sen-

## Congressmen Push For Monday Holidays

WASHINGTON (AP)—A move to make most national holidays fall on Mondays, thus providing five or six three-day weekends each year, is about to get a push in Congress.

A House Judiciary subcommittee has scheduled hearings for Aug. 16-17 on bills that would shift Washington's Birthday, Memorial Day, Independence Day and Veterans Day to Monday. Several bills also would add Thanksgiving Day to the list.

With Labor Day already falling on a Monday, the measures would produce a string of short vacations throughout the year. Christmas and New Year's Day still would cycle through the days of the week.

Similar bills have been kicking around Congress for years, but this is the first time hearings will be held on them.

The idea has strong support in the business community, which thinks it would smooth out production schedules and cut down absenteeism among workers who make their own three- or four-day weekends when holidays came in midweek.

The only real opposition

comes from traditionalists who find it inconceivable that the Fourth of July, for instance, should be celebrated any other day.

But supporters of the legislation have amassed a lot of information showing the dates of most holidays have been set arbitrarily and that the calendar itself has been changed.

Washington's birth date actually was Feb. 11 under the Julian calendar in use in 1732, the year of his birth. But England, in 1752, adopted the Gregorian calendar for itself and its colonies and thus produced an 11-day shift in the calendar.

Actually, the difference between the Gregorian and Julian calendars lengthens one day each century. So Feb. 11, old style, would now be Feb. 24.

As for Independence Day: The resolution of independence from England was adopted by the Continental Congress July 2, 1776, and 50 of the 56 signatures were placed on it on July 19, with others added over several months.

## Milwaukee Officer Killed in Rioting

MILWAUKEE, Wis. (AP)—National Guard troops patrolling in jeeps swept the streets of Milwaukee's inner core, on the fringe of the paralyzed downtown area, clear of traffic today after a night of Negro rioting that left two white persons dead and scores injured.

The bodies of a police officer and a woman, the latter shot in the head, were found in the ashes of a home that burned in the district during the height of the disturbances.

Police headquarters said that Patrolman Bryan Moschea, 24, had hurried to the scene trying to evacuate children from the building.

At least one suspected sniper was besieged and captured. Among more than 50 persons taken to hospitals were 12 policemen, 8 of them wounded by gunfire in exchanges with snipers in the five-square-mile area, where most of Milwaukee's 86,000 Negroes are concentrated.

Normal activities in the central city and in most of its 20 surrounding suburbs as well, halted after Milwaukee Mayor Henry Maier had declared a state of emergency and ordered everyone off the streets "until such time as the Police Department tells us the situation has returned to normal."

At Madison, Gov. Warren P. Knowles, who had ordered 900 National Guardsmen into Mil-

waukee with 500 more standing by at outstate armories, told an early morning news conference that the state would "stand behind the mayor for anything he wants."

Tension in the core area, where more than 90 per cent of the Negroes who make up 12 per cent of Milwaukee's population live, have been simmering since last summer.

The cordoned area was bounded by Michigan Street and Capitol Drive on the south and north, respectively and by Second Street and 20th Street on the east and west.

Roving bands of Negroes smashed windows, looted, stoned passing vehicles, and hurled fire bombs on the pavement. Off-duty police were called in

Acting Deputy Fire Chief Alven Hainke said full crews were sent to 70 fire calls. Most of the fires were doused quickly either by rain or by firemen operating under police protection. But at least two of them burned out of control because policemen couldn't clear out snipers in time to enable firemen to work.

## Romney Recalls Delays In Getting Federal Aid

DETROIT (AP)—Gov. George Romney said today, "We were pleading for federal troops as fast as we could get them" during the early hours of the Detroit riots and he listed, point by point, the delays that arose before federal authorities responded to his appeals.

"You can draw your own conclusions," the governor said in an interview. "I'm just telling you what happened."

Grimly, Romney said nearly 24 hours elapsed between the time he first asked Washington for help and the moment when

the federal airborne troops were committed to the riot zones. The racial explosion took 39 lives and hit Detroit with an estimated loss of \$1 billion in property damage and related costs.

In the interview, Romney made these points:

1. He said U.S. Atty. Gen. Ramsey Clark "changed his position" with respect to requiring a written, not just an oral, request to send the federal troops to Detroit.

2. After President Johnson's representative, Cyrus R. Vance, arrived in Detroit, nine hours passed before Vance agreed to commit the federal troops.

3. Federal authorities demanded a "certification of an insurrection." Romney said, "My basic point was that the federal troops should be sent because I didn't want to let the situation get out of hand. That's what we were trying to prevent."

Romney said the first moves were made at 2:30 a.m., last Monday morning.

At that hour, Detroit Mayor Jerome P. Cavanagh telephoned Vice President Hubert H. Humphrey in Minneapolis for advice. A member of the mayor's staff said the call went to Humphrey because "the President has more or less made him the liaison between the federal government and the cities."

Humphrey told Cavanagh and Romney to telephone the attorney general in Washington.

"We knew we would need federal forces," Romney said. "The National Guard could not get to Detroit until late Monday afternoon."

The guardsmen were bivouacked at Camp Grayling, 200 miles northwest of Detroit. "The airborne troops could have been flown in by jet from Ft. Bragg, N.C., much faster than the guardsmen could get here," Romney said.

At 3 a.m., the governor said he talked with Clark and "described the situation." He said 5,000 troops were needed at once. Romney said the attorney general replied that he would have to confer with the White House.

"I asked him then if he needed anything more than an oral request from me and he said, 'No.'"

About an hour later, the governor and the mayor called a press conference to report that they had requested federal troops to help quell the rioting.

"In the middle of the press conference, Clark called and said he wanted a request and a certification that we had an insurrection that we could not control," Romney said.

"I replied that there was no

## Some Paratroops Pull Out of Detroit

DETROIT (AP)—Some federal troops were pulled out of Detroit today, and Gov. George Romney urged the nation not to let the racial explosion lead to a backlash endangering "valuable programs and policies designed to bring about first-class status for all citizens."

Earlier Romney had partially lifted a ban on liquor sales and reduced Detroit's riot-caused curfew time by an hour, from midnight to 5:30 a.m.

"In the backwash of questioning and disgust and fear, the dangers of the demagogues follow just as certainly as rats followed a flood," Romney said. "There will be unreasonable appeals from both whites and Negroes."

"Men of reason should recognize these dangers and guard against compounding error by piling misdirection on top of disorder," the governor said.

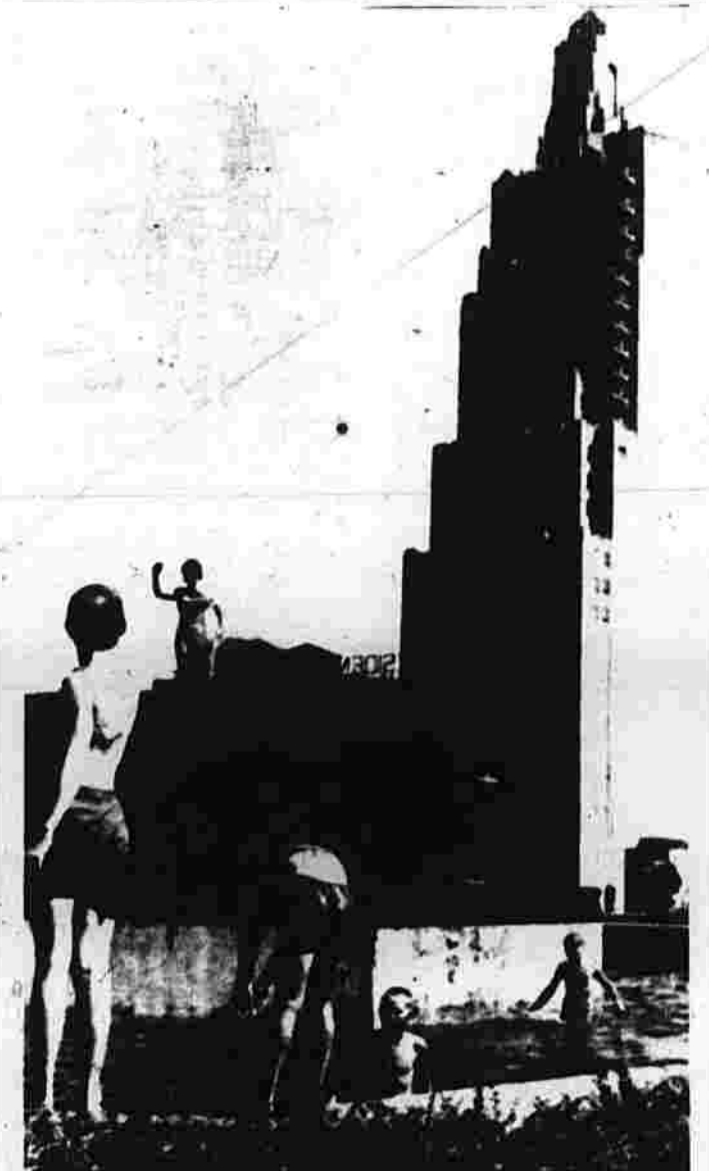
His remarks were contained in a speech for the National Association of Counties convention in Detroit.

Cyrus R. Vance, President Johnson's representative in Detroit, told a mid-morning news conference that three battalions of regular Army troops sent to quell a week of violence were being pulled out of the city.

"This is another step in the process of orderly withdrawal," Vance said, adding that the troops would be sent to Selfridge Air Force Base 30 miles northeast of Detroit.

He would not say when any federal paratroops would be taken out of Michigan.

Sources at Ft. Bragg, N.C., said, however, that some of the Portland's 15,000 Negroes live in the Albina District.

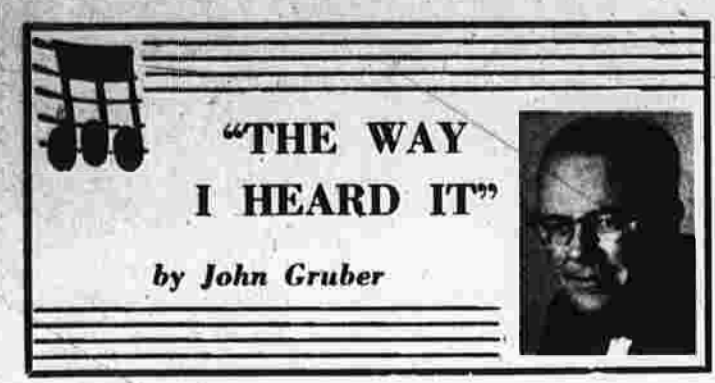

### Vernon Legal Aid Office Planned To Provide Help to Needy

A legal aid office in Rockville is planned as part of the Toland-Windham Legal Assistance Program, according to Herbert Hannabury, president of the Toland County Bar Association.

The office, one of five in the two-county area, will provide legal aid to low-income people. Space is being sought now for use by the firm, Hannabury said yesterday.

The program will serve 26 area towns. Other offices are planned for Willimantic, Danielson, Plainfield and Stafford.

Hannabury and William Hall, chairman of the Legal Aid Committee of the county bar, have been meeting with members of the state bar. The state bar is backing the program and the county bar endorsed it at their last meeting.

The program comes under the Office of Economic Opportunity. The Windham Area Community Action Program centered in Willimantic is responsible for this area.

Hannabury said Toland County low-income people in need of legal aid get it through Hall's committee which refers cases to local attorneys on a rotating basis with all association members cooperating.

A major purpose of the new program, he said, will be to reach people unaware and available and to furnish them information on their legal rights and responsibilities.

A full range of services will be provided from legal advice to representation at a trial.

Eligibility of an applicant depends on his income and will be investigated. Applicants found ineligible will be referred to participating counsel on a rotating basis.

If accepted, staff attorneys will handle the case or it will be referred to several lawyers who have volunteered to be in the program.

Hannabury said the two county bars and the state bar will have three representatives on a board of 18 directors. Three of those agencies will have a representative and six directors will be from low-income groups.

The program will serve the most sparsely populated sections of the state. But it is among the state's highest percentage of families with less than \$4,000 annual income.

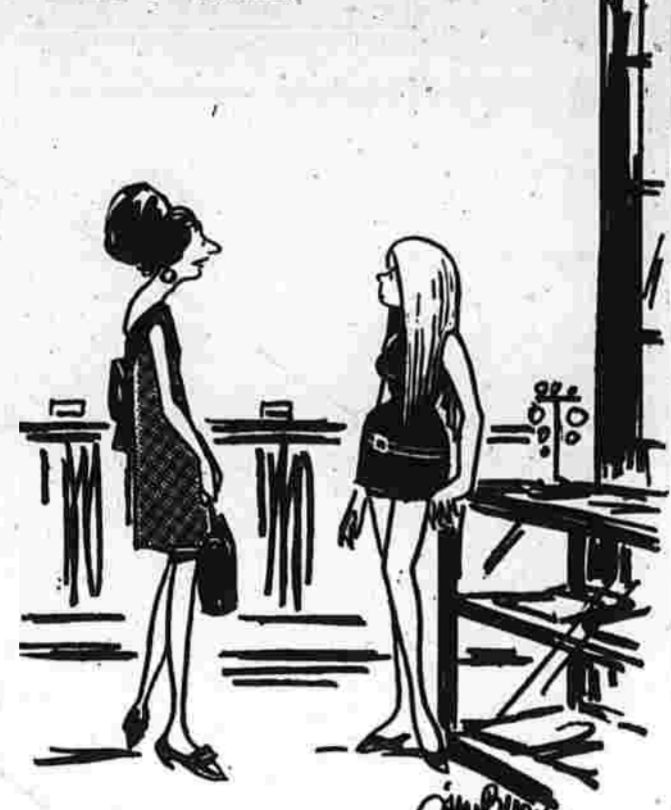

told Clark I would have to check into that."

Romney said he returned to the press conference and told reporters it would be necessary to re-evaluate the situation.

"So then I had to get Simmons from his headquarters and the key men in the police department and we did evaluate it with Simmons and went through the whole picture and Simmons agreed that we needed the federal troops," Romney said.

He said he then advised Clark of Simmons' judgment. Meanwhile, the governor said, at Clark's request, he drafted a telegram. It said in part:

"I do hereby immediately recommend the immediate deployment of federal troops into Michigan to assist state and local authorities in re-establishing law and order in the city of Detroit."

"I am joined in this recommendation by Jerome P. Cavanaugh, mayor of the city of Detroit."

Romney said Clark called back and told him this telegram was "inadequate."

"He instructed me to read the episode in Detroit, and the President's statement naming Romney, with respect to Romney's political future. The governor is considered a front-running candidate for the Republican presidential nomination next year."

Romney refuses to comment on what the President said.

As for his negotiations with the Johnson administration for bringing in the federal forces, he said, "Any interpretation of what happened I will leave until later, or to others."

**Bidault in Belgium**  
BRUSSELS, Belgium (AP) — Former French Premier Georges Bidault after a four-year exile in Brazil, has settled down to a new life of political asylum less than 50 miles from the French border.

Still a fugitive from an arrest warrant in France, Bidault arrived Sunday with his wife. He said he planned to spend his time writing but hopes to return home soon.

The warrant for his arrest was issued in 1962 after he had ignored a court summons to testify about the right-wing National Council of Resistance, which opposed Algerian independence.

Although a close wartime and postwar associate of Gen. Charles de Gaulle, Bidault bitterly opposed De Gaulle's giving Algeria independence.

Belgium, which has a tradition of harboring French political refugees, had pledged to make no political statements in Rome and to abstain from all political activity.

### Hebron Petition Filed In Bankruptcy
