Perhaps our military planners had an idea of plotting their moon game both ways.  
 As for the objections by the scientists, they are numerous. They are not sure what additional moonlight a countryside would do to the animals and plants there. Some fish spawn when the moon is full. Plants react in different ways to the phases of light. Astronomers might be confused by so many artificial presences in the night sky.  
 For the moment, the objections by the scientists appear to have carried the day—or the night. In fact, the White House science adviser has stated that the Government is not interested in the mirror concept at the present time and no activity on it is visualized. Perhaps discussion has already solved the problem.

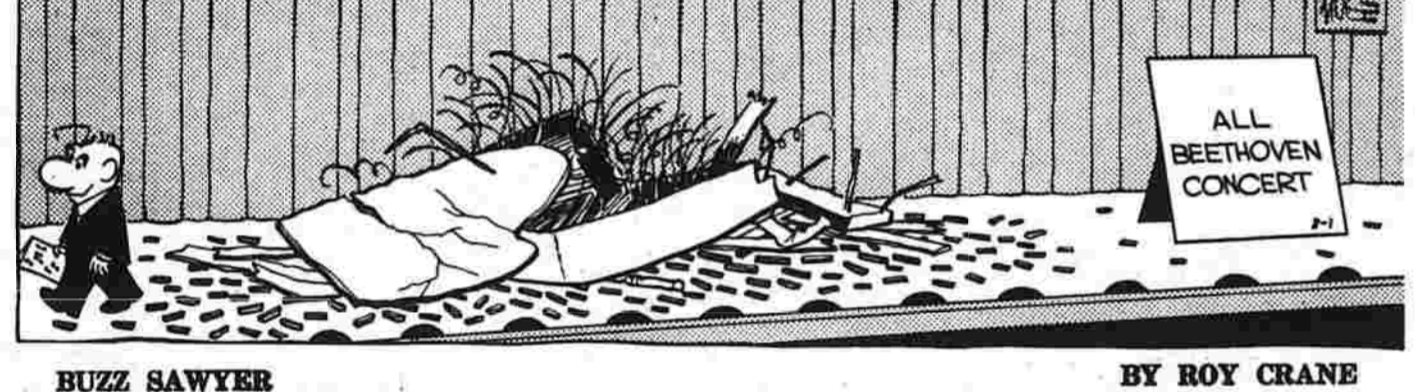

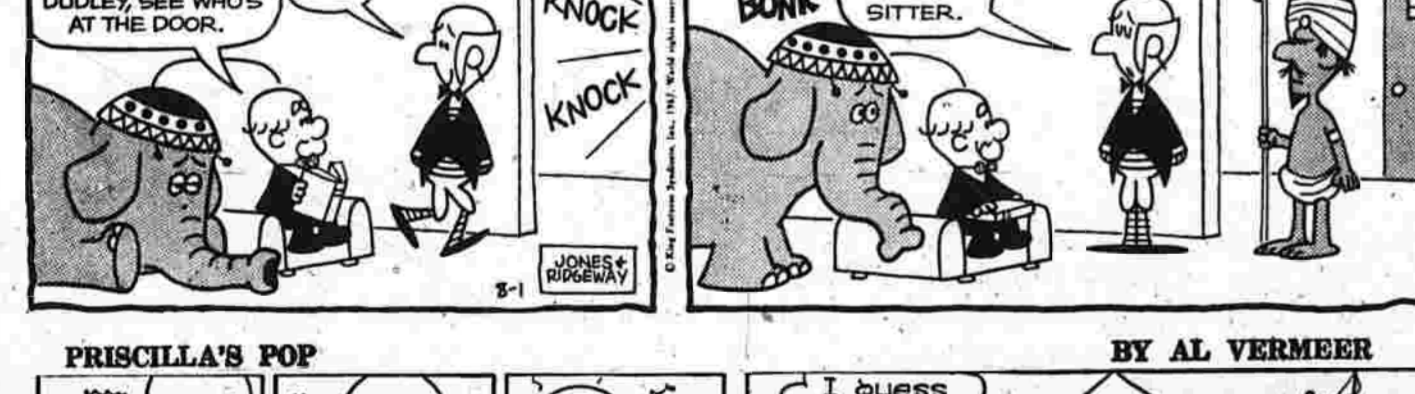

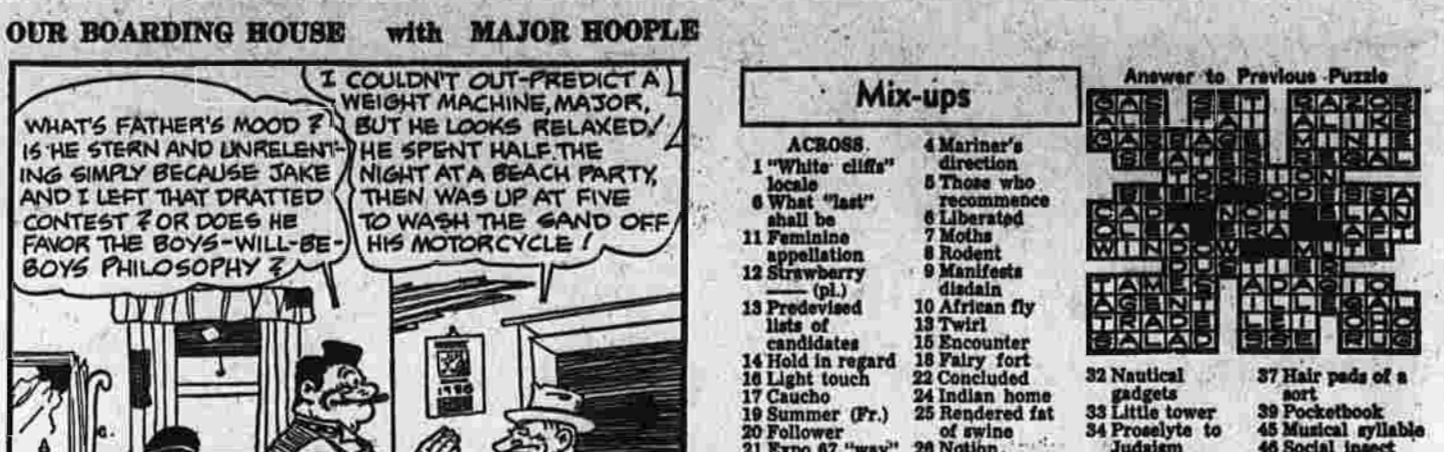
