The Air Power Argument

Not inappropriately, there are some very prominent "hawks" on Vietnam who get that way out of their devotion to the power and efficiency of air power This particular brand of hawk offers a most beguiling promise. It is that we can win in Vietnam almost any time we choose if we will only let ourselves drop our bombs where they would do the most instead of the least good.

That promise makes anybody who believes in restraint and moderation in bombing seem to be guilty of wanting to prolong the war unnecessarily, and have it involve the agony and sacrificof American foot soldiers not really needed. The quick, humane, practical, and masterful thing to do would be to plast the enemy quickly into submis-

It is no answer to the continually adjusting position of the air power hawks n Vietnam to remind them that back in 1965 when we inaugurated the bombing of North Vietnam, their professional prophets were guaranteeing everybody that only a few weeks of such bombing would be enough to bring the enemy to his knees. Although we have now dropped more bombs on Vietnam than were used in Korea, perhaps even more than were used on Germany in World War II, the hawks can always reach for some additional complaint. We haven't bombed Hanol and Halphong. After we had bombed them, if that had produced no change in the situation, we would hear the hawks begin more definite and oner presentation of the idea that we cannot expect to knock out North Vietnam ac long as there is sanctuary or source of help in neighboring countries, such as Laos, Cambodia, or China. The hawks simply do not accept the

possibility that air power cannot win. To every argument which says tha every application of air power to date has not produced the result they prom ised, they retort that air power has not vet been used as they would like to see

This presents a perhaps limitless cycle of argument. The more air power is used and the more it fails to produce it predicted result, the more it should be used. And those who refuse to follow this formula are accused of being re sponsible for the needless deployment and death of additional American troops. No one seems able to win this kind of argument, any more than anybody seems capable of winning in Viet-

does hold North Vietnam helpless and at its mercy as no air power has ever held an enemy before. But that leaves still unanswered and debatable the question of whether, with such power at our disposal, our failure to grasp victory from its use reflects the actual impossibility of victory from such means in such s situation, or our own refusal to use our power to its ultimate ferocity and de-

The basic reasoning behind the vote is believed to be economic. As a Commonwealth, Puerto Rico has more advantages and fewer responsibilities than it might have in the status of a state. It receives federal aid, but pays no federal taxes. It is not inside the United States, economically speaking, so far as wage scales and tax incentives to industry are concerned, but it is not outside the United States when it comes to being able to import United States goods free of tariff. The Commonwealth status seems to combine maximum opportunity and special favoritism for private enterprise with some degree of welfare statism for the average population -a combination forbidden in any system where everything has to balance

What Death Penalty?

The defeat in the House of Represent atives of Gov. Volpe's bill for a special study of the deterrent effects of th death penalty may have pushed farther nto the future the eventual solution the law that is not a law. The conclusions of such a study, one way or the other, might just tip the balance of sen-timent and either get the law repealed or the death penalty used. The trend nationwide has been away

from the death penalty, which has not been used in Massachusetts since 1947 and which is still on the books of a minority of the states. This state, in fact, came very close some four years ago to abolishing its capital punishment law. So the pro-and-con balance is delicate and quite vulnerable to change. Whatever view one takes of capital punishment, it is obvious that the Mas-

sachusetts law now on the books has become impotent because for 20 years no governor has been willing to follow hrough on a death sentence. If there i o be a deterrent to crime, an unused law is not enough. The death penalty has to be exacted. And even that is a debatable course.

The rejection of Gov. Volpe's proposal by a 112-103 vote meant the House was reluctant even to have the matter out up to study and preferred to keep the law on the books. But the lasue will stay alive, because the pro and con groups will keep it that way. We hope their give-and-take will produce, before another year, a one-way-or-the-other official policy on capital punishment. -

Matt. 3:7, 8. No value is imparted to the act of baptism by the church or the administrator of the act. "He that believeth and is baptized," Mark 18:16, is the sequence as Jesus commanded it. Without the proper preparation of faith and penitence by the recipient, baptism effect no blessing. Obviously, the mere act induced by force, fear, or favor is profitiess.






