Rights March Continues

Five Men Wounded In Shooting Spree

HAMMOND, La. (AP) — A group of 20 Negro marchers strode off today on the fifth day of their planned 105-mile march from Bogalusa to Baton Rouge, following a shooting episode in which five white men were wounded and 12 Negroes arrested.

Leaders of the march denied that any of the walkers were involved in the shooting, which occurred when Negroes shouting "We want beer!" fired at whites blocking the way to a tavern here Sunday night.

Gov. John McKeithen told a newsman that the march leaders "have now accomplished part of their purpose: They have gotten some people shot and they are going to have some people put in the penitentiary."

Red China Releases Soviet Merchant Ship

MOSCOW (AP) — The battered Soviet merchant ship *Svirsk* limped out of the Red Chinese port of Dalren Sunday a Moscow report said, after the Chinese released her captain and three crewmen following a bitter exchange of protest notes with the Soviets.

The Soviet Union announced that seven tugboats full of Red Guards escorted the ship out of the Yellow Sea port.

The *Svirsk's* hull, superstructure and equipment bore anti-Soviet inscriptions. All the Russian crewmen were aboard when the *Svirsk* headed for the Soviet port of Vladivostok, the announcement reported, but the ship's documents were kept by the Chinese.

Soviet Premier Alexei N. Kosygin sent a telegram to Chinese Premier Chou En-lai Saturday demanding that the Red Chinese release the captain and captured crewmen and let the *Svirsk* sail.

Copper Strike Families Still Awaiting Next Pay

SALT LAKE CITY (AP) — Families of the nation's 42,000 striking copper workers and the dozen or more copper towns are awaiting the next payday, but it seems no closer now than when the strike began a month ago today.

Most people close to the situation—the workers, company officials and union representatives—indicate this could be the longest copper strike of them all, longer than the six-month work-stoppage of 1959-60.

France Rocked

BORDEAUX, France (AP) — Earthquakes rocked southwestern France and northern Spain Sunday, devastating one French village and felling scattered buildings elsewhere. One death was reported.

The Pyrenees Mountain village, population 1,000, was badly hit by the quake tremors, and its residents abandoned their homes to spend the night in cars or huddled around campfires.

U.S. Planes Hit Again Near Chinese Border

New Strikes Are Closest Of the War

SAIGON (AP) — U.S. warplanes struck for the second straight day today at North Vietnamese targets just 10 miles from Red China's border, along the major railroad from China to Hanoi.

The attacks Sunday and today were closer to the Chinese border than any previous air raids in the Vietnam war.

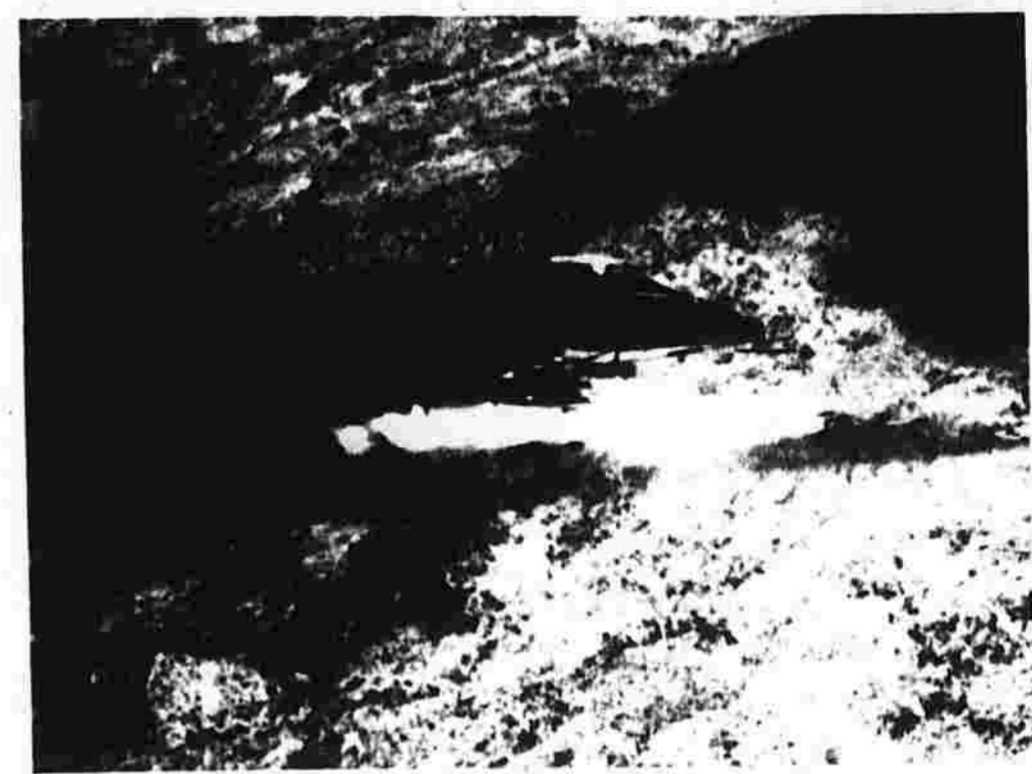
Navy A-1H Intruders and A-1H Skyhawks from the carrier *Constellation* in the Tonkin Gulf raked the Lang Son railroad bypass bridge 63 miles north of Hanoi.

Other Navy pilots from the *Constellation* hammered a rail siding south of Lang Son and pilots said they cut the tracks in several places.

The pilots reported they encountered only light antiaircraft fire.

No planes were reported lost in the latest raids, but the U.S. Command announced that on Saturday's 151 attacks on the North, an F105 Thunderchief and an RF4C reconnaissance plane were shot down by ground fire.

As the air war came closer to Communist China in what appeared to be a lifting of some target restrictions by President

Fulbright Renews Attack On Vietnam War Policies

WASHINGTON (AP) — U.S. administration will continue those restrictions except on certain key, vital missions. The restricted areas are a 30-mile diameter circle around Hanoi, penetrated two or three times previously, and a 15-to-20-mile-wide buffer zone along the North Vietnam-Red China boundary.

Fulbright said the bombing near Red China "is directly contrary to what was the established policy of the government in 1964 and it will lead the country directly into the most disastrous consequences."

Fulbright's committee, including members already troubled over Vietnam, cut Johnson's \$3.4 billion foreign aid request by \$736 million.

Senate Democratic leader Mike Mansfield, a foe of increased bombing, said he hopes to hold the line against further cuts in the bill but added: "I expect it will be tough going."

He told a newsman he expects "all kinds of amendments to be offered."

The Senate warmed up to its latest Vietnam tussle Friday

when a battery of members questioned how fairly the South Vietnamese elections will be run.

Clark Clifford, a Johnson emissary said Sunday he gave South Vietnamese leaders earlier this month the President's warning a rigged presidential election would cost South Vietnam the support of the American people.

He and Gen. Maxwell Taylor visited South Vietnam chief of state Gen. Nguyen Van Thieu, a candidate for president, Premier Nguyen Cao Ky, Thieu's running mate for vice president.

"We took a personal message from President Johnson to Ky and Thieu on this subject and said, as bluntly as it can be said, that if there was any one act on their part which would be calculated to alienate the American people, it would be to have a rigged election in South Vietnam," said Clifford.

Alaska Flood Routs Entire Community

NENANA, Alaska (AP) — All women and children in this central Alaska community of 300 were evacuated Sunday night in the face of rising flood waters from the Tanana River.

Forty-seven Alaska National Guardsmen were rushed from Fairbanks, about 50 miles north-east of here, to assist in the evacuation and help battle the rising waters.

The flooding is a result of heavy rains that have plagued the Nenana and Fairbanks area for about a month.

The Tanana, which floods at 12 feet, overflowed its banks three weeks ago but much of the water had been held away from the town with the help of 36,000 sandbags.

However, the river reached a height of 13 feet 10 inches Sunday night and was expected to rise to 14 feet 2 inches today.

While the men of the town stayed behind to fight the flooding, the women and children were evacuated to a radar station near Clear, about 20 miles away.

Continuing rains in the Alaskan interior have closed all roads into Fairbanks, and mud slides and a washed-out bridge cut off rail traffic from Fairbanks to Anchorage.

Fairbanks, which normally has a rainfall of 2.2 inches in August, had a record 2.47 inches in 24 hours Saturday.

Fowler Gives Choice

LBJ's Tax Boost Or Face Inflation

WASHINGTON (AP) — Secretary of the Treasury Henry H. Fowler offered Congress a stark choice today: Reject President Johnson's tax increase and open the way for a possible \$20 billion deficit, or enact it and still face the prospect of \$14 billion to \$18 billion red ink spending.

Those, Fowler told the House Ways and Means Committee, are the hard facts of the nation's fiscal situation.

He said that with economies the government plans to make, and with the 10 per cent income tax surcharge, which he called "a moderate, temporary, emergency increase," the Treasury can hold its borrowing down to a level that will not disrupt markets and shoot interest rates up. Thus, he said, widespread inflation can be avoided.

Budget Director Charles L. Schultze backed Fowler's estimate of the deficit and said "we are determined to cut more than \$1.5 billion" in spending.

"We are aiming at a cut of

over \$2 billion as a means of holding civilian expenditures below the January estimate," Schultze contended. He said that each appropriations bill as it is passed will be reviewed by the government agency involved to see if the spending can be held below the approved figure.

Fowler said the spending estimate submitted in January for the year that began July 1 may now be exceeded by as much as \$8.5 billion, including \$4 billion for defense, and that revenues may be as much as \$7 billion less than had been anticipated.

He said that what he called an outsized federal deficit "cannot be accommodated without severe disruption to the credit markets, sending interest rates sky high and shutting off the flow of credit to sectors such as the home mortgage market and small business."

He reminded the committee-men that "last year the mortgage market was starved for

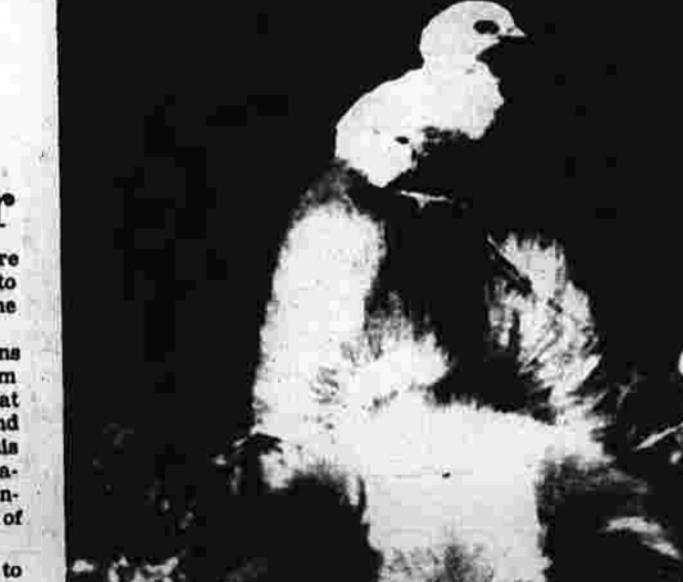
