### Tolland Town May Be at Blame In Vernon's Sewer Vote

Shortsightedness on the part of Tolland residents from years ago, resulted in the loss of sewer facilities to the Tolland Industrial site on Rt. 30, according to statements made at last night's Board of Representatives meeting in Vernon. The Board of Representatives turned down an application to the Kingfisher location in the Tolland site, by a 10-1 vote. The actions were taken after clarification of the prior agreement which permitted Burroughs to hook into the Rockville sewer system. The decision was made in April, 1963. Simeon Luhrsen, former Democrat selectman at the time, had recently maintained an agreement existed between Tolland and Rockville to provide sewers to industries located at the Tolland site. Minutes of the former Rockville City Council meeting revealed the decision granted permission to Burroughs only. Discussion at the time, originally included extending the lines to the town of Tolland according to Representatives Abner Brooks, a former Rockville selectman. Tolland residents at a town meeting denied the use of the Tolland dump to Rockville the same time the town was negotiating for use of the Rockville sewers. Rockville reportedly then in retaliation, Burroughs only, in retaliation. Rockville agreed to provide Ellington with sewers at the same time on a capacity flow basis. Ellington had been co-operating with Rockville in the consolidation of the towns of Vernon and Rockville resulted in Vernon assuming all obligations of the former city of Rockville. If permission had been granted by Rockville as claimed by Luhrsen, the present Board of Representatives would have been bound to approve sewers for Kingfisher's proposed Tolland site.
