"Sense" In New Haven

When the spark struck into the tinder n Hartford's North End earlier this summer-but the resultant blaze never really got going—some of us wondered, hopefully, whether some of the things that the whole central Connecticut community had been trying to do hadn't had certain fire-break results. Perhaps the volunteer efforts that had gone into the North End of Hartford, perhaps the concerted effort of Hartford's civic leadership to get into constructive contact with the problems there, perhaps the touch of such token programs as Project Concern, with its busing of a few North End children out to suburban schools—perhaps all these things, small and token and puny as they might be in relation to the problem involved, had had some saving, damping result, for the moment when the spark did fly.

Those of us who thought of the time of test in Hartford from such angles also had a hopeful awareness of conditions in the city of New Haven.

And what we thought was this: that perhaps New Haven, so famous for leading the way in so many phases of the rebuilding and reorganization of the American city, had done so well with its progress toward creating something new and shining for the life of all its citizens that it might offer no tinder at all for the inevitable spark.

New Haven has been the nation's leader in the business of renewal, and has received the nation's largest per capita grants for renewal purposes. The renewal projects financed by such public funds have attracted immense new private investment to the city. Beyond of the central city, New Haven was also beginning to pioneer in the business of rehabilitating, without tearing down buildings and relocating tenants, some of its poorer residential areas. And, to cap it all off, New Haven was the great pioneer in antipoverty programs, its own program, called Community Progress, having been financed by a Ford Foundation grant long before the federal government began to have such a thing as an antipoverty program. Community Progress operates a network of jobtraining programs, and maintains five neighboring service centers to help poor

lents with their problems. There was perhaps one great flaw in this program, and this was that one of the at least temporary effects of renew-al and its dislocation of residents was the concentration of more Negro and Puerto Rican population into the section of the city where, last Saturday night, the inevitable spark flew from an isolated incident and - sadly enough -

One would have hoped that, not only because so much had already been done, but because the atmosphere in the city was so clearly, an atmosphere in which much more was obviously going to be done, New Haven had its chance not to

And Mayor Richard Lee, the city's famous chief executive, spoke for many minds when he said, of the fact that New Haven did flare, "None of it makes sense."

But the truth is, of course, that it doesn't make the kind of sense which our own particular minds manufacture or the kind of sense which appeals to us as part of a noble, but relatively easy way out of this nation's unparalleled

Perhaps there were great dividends from everything that had been done in New Haven, and perhaps these divi this writing, no lives have been lost. But the fact remains that the kind of thing which doesn't "make sense" for us has happened, in spite of all New Haven's positive approach to the prob-

What this experience says is not that all such constructive effort has been wasted. In fact, it can never be neglected, from this time one, unless we want whatever conditions do exist to get steadily worse and more violent.

This experience says that we may have to equip ourselves with a new kind of sense and set up for ourselves new goels more immense and spiritually inclusive than any represented in any ef-fert to "do something" for the Negro. 
