Still No Way Out must be occurring, about now, to some of the bright academic power politics theorists who are really the spirits guiding both our highest military and civilian leaderships at Washington, that it might have been a very pragmatic thing, nay, even a more moral thing, in the long run, to have made sure we rigged the Vietnam elections instead of go-

ing through all our silly democratic vanities about wanting them to be free. For we did, with our watchful presence and our pitiless publicity, make sure that the military candidates who represent our reliance for stability in South Vietnam did not dare manage the election resolutely enough to produce an im-

pressive mandate for themselves. And, in the degree of actual freedom which resulted, the voters of South Vietnam-at least those who managed to get to the polls-showed a surprising and embarrassing sentiment in favor of negotiation for peace.

American policy had obviously been hoping for two things-the first a demonstration of freedom in voting for the people of South Vietnam-and the second a verdict, from that free voting, for the regime we support in South Vietnam and the purposes we proclaim for ourselves in waging a mighty\*war in Viet-

Could this result have been attained. veryone, including Hanoi, would have been impressed, and Hanoi, presumably might be in some mood to reassess its own percentages in keeping on with the

demonstration of some freedom in voting, but too large a part of that free vote expressing what amounts to opposition to our own presence and war-making in Vietnam, does not strengthen our position with regard to Hanoi.

basic failure deepens. To fashion a hope for the moment, one has to steer in between two extremes and settle upon an almost equally unsatisfactory middle course. One extreme would be to try to redeem our failure with such fierce violence that we bring the whole world down about our heads The other extreme would be to tuck our prestige between our legs and turn and

The dreary middle course would be to stay about where we are, but to try to do as little killing and destroying as possible, and prove that we can play stalemate with as much patience and philoso-

are able to make by ourselves. If, in the meantime, any third party should prove able to work its way into the situation -and third party intervention or diplomacy has, ever since February of 1965 been the only possible way we could be rescued from our commitment to escalation—we should be very grateful for such a possible reprieve, and stand totally willing to agree to our own unconditional cessation of bombing of the North as the first contribution to the possible success of such mediation.

De Gaulle Re-Creating History

Even when he seems to become the senile blunderer, President de Gaulle travels like no other world figure of our time. In fact, one cannot be sure that what seemed so foolish in Quebec was not merely his deliberate way of building up, for that piece of tourism, the kind of impact, the kind of connection

on his present journey, and not worry about its having its present impact or about its ringing historical bells. For when the head of France visits the nation of Poland, little superficial showmanship is necessary. It is an act

Russia, having been deserted by France on the issue of Czechoslovakia, next deserted France and Britain on the issue of Poland, and signed its pact with Hitler

tioned once again. That was how the classic power politics set-up of 1938 and 1939-the pattern in which President de Gaulle inevitably moves when he flies over Gerto visit Poland-worked once before. We have no doubt at all that Charles de Gaulle thinks that, if he had been France then, the pattern would have worked. The preliminary steps, this time, call for getting the United States, Germany's chief ally, out of the European picture, and then surrounding Germany with new French alliances.

But what happens if the federal appropriation goes to \$100 million as the Administration has requested? Connecticut's share might then be nearly two million dollars. Could the General Assembly refuse this "gift" even if it cost another. \$2 million to get it? History suggests that it will not. Politicians simply cannot resist this kind of pressure. They will even force their constituents to follow federal controls at additional cost to the individual in order to get their
