



### **Beyond The Boundaries** In Milwaukee two stubborn men are

at the forefront of a battle over open housing legislation. The contest threatens to keep Milwaukee in a continuous state of disruption. Father Groppi, the militant priest at

the head of the Negro merchers, has vowed to keep marching until the open housing legislation is passed. Mayor Maler, who makes no secret of his contempt for Father Groppi, is apparently fully convinced that open housing within the city limits of Milwaukee alone will not dissolve the ghette, merely enlarge it by driving whites out into the segregated suburbs.

There is high logic in the position of both men. Father Groppi knows that continued geographic segregation and the injustice it brings cannot be eliminated by merely wishing it eliminated. Such segregation apparently exists in that large Wisconsin city with a rigidity not found in most.

The mayor wants most of the 26 suburbs around Milwaukee to enact open housing legislation along with the city to open up the possibility of breaking up the core that helps create and certainly fosters the racial hatred that plagues the area as it does much of the rest of the nation.

The problem is not peculiar to Milaukee. It exists wherever a core city is encircled by attractive suburbs, most of which for one reason or another. have very small Negro populations, and particularly welcome.

The dilemma is this. How to get most of the suburban communities, each eager to protect its own identity and to preserve its non-core characteristics to act in concert for what obviously is the greater good of society in the long

To the Milwaukee marchers this must seem the remotest of possibilities. Father Groppi, whose concentrated efforts have failed even in his native city, can easily dismiss it as another dodge, the empty promise of utopia to avoid carrying out an at-hand solution.

The inference to be drawn from the conflict in Milwaukee is clear. However hard it is for some to accept, the solution to the core city ghetto problems beyond the boundaries of the
