

Contribution

The nation's major life insurance companies, including those based in artford, have embarked upon a program that could contribute materially solving the problem of decent housing in the slum areas of large cities.

The program was announced at the White House by President Johnson, but was reportedly the fruit of thinking by top executives of the insurance industry and was not instituted by the gov-

Basically it earmarked a billion doliars of the industry's 16 billion dollar overall investment for financing the construction and reconstruction of slum area housing which would otherwise not find financing because it is risky and promises a poor return on the in-

The idea reportedly evolved somewhat in this manner. Throughout the entire life insurance industry, individual companies began seeking ways to contribate somehow to ameliorating the condittion of troubled cities. Barly this year, it became apparent

that the scope of the problem was too great to be handled by individual comanies, it was turned over to an indusry-wide committee which worked out President Johnson, in making the an-

iouncement, made it clear he likes the idea because it provides a hope of directing private money into urban devel-The President's chief affection for

the proposal is that It will probably rescue the rent supplement program under which the government subsidizes the rents of some people living in private housing, operated usually by nonprofit groups, instead of in government nousing projects. It is bogged down now chiefly because the fear that it will not attract private finance.

The insurance industry is obviously well qualified to know where the lowreturn areas of real estate development lie, since the industry's financial success proves it has been astute at avoiding

No one has yet worked out details of bow the proposal would work, but there indication that the insurance comsanies may take the initiative and seek ut builders to undertake housing

One of the most attractive features of the idea is one of is vaguest ones at the moment. While the attention is centered on housing, the insumance industry also has something else in mind the possibility of financing job creating new industry that might othervise not find capital funds.

If it ever comes to pass that these two worthy objectives would work in concert, providing housing where it is needed most and jobs where they are needed most, instead of housing only where it pays best and jobs where they can best be filled, the one billion as a start would have been the soundest kind

of investment for the stockholder. It is obvious that the economy and well-being of urban centers, which is threatened, is vital for the protection of the investment the insurance industry has in the nation. Whose investment, for that matter, is not concerned?

Groppi, the militant priest who leads the Milwaukee civil rights movement, found that this vanfaller was somehow the fault of the Mayor himself.

Father Groppi might, with a shade more justice and accuracy, have blamed the deliberate, cool-blooded vandalism in question on the inviting presence of the television cameras, obviously waiting for the demonstrators to do something worth showing the nation.

But the main thing that was on exhibit, once again, was the comfortable theory that, no matter what comes out can make a giant contribution to Amerof the nation's ghettoes, it is not really ican public welfare. bility and the guilt always belong t somebody else—to the mayor of the city where the ghetto exists, for instance, or to every member of American society anywhere who has not done his utmost, 24 hours every day of his life, to make some positive contribution to the solution of this nation's social

There is so much truth in this theory that we are all somehow guilty, that there is some measure of innocence, some inevitability of compulsion, in the actions which flare up out of the ghettoes we have all allowed to exist, that no one should even attempt to discard the theory, or evade its implications. There is, nonetheless, an occasional

small percentage of action for which everybody is not necessarily responsible or guilty. There is occasionally touch of revolutionary leadership which is more violent and irresponsible than it need be. There is occasionally a television camera which inspires unnecessary violence by its own very presence. And there are, believe it or not, still some individuals left, even in this day of exalted crusading, who would be plain ordinary hoodiums in any day and circumstance, and who, naturally enough, in this particular day and circumstance, wrap their vandalism, looting, and wanton destructiveness inside a civil rights

Having made that clear-we hopewe now go back to a more usual, fashionable, and still valid vein of thought that if there are hoodkims in America today, all of us have some share of the responsibility for such continuing imperfection in our society and

Ralph Nader's New Campaign Ralph Nader, who did more than anyone else ever did before to bring public

attention to the need for safer automobiles, is turning his attention now to the question of safer highways. It is a huge and complex subject. But the need is paramount. The big federal programs for a national system of modern superhighways has probably saved a great many lives. The new roads, with their dividers and their limited access and their carefully engineered grades and interchanges are a great deal safer than the old roads they replaced. But it is already clear that these new highways aren't nearly as safe as

they could be or should be. Mr. Nader is urging Congress to restore the funds that were cut out of the program this year for making the federal highways safer. He deserves support and assistance. There should be a far greater public awareness of the hazards which have been recognized-and how they can be eliminated.

Right here in the Waterbury area, for instance, there are many safety improvements which could be made. Some of the problems are subtle ones that may require intensive study and major changes-such as the mysterious accident trap on I-84 in the Scott Rd. section. Others are so obvious that the State Highway Department should have spotted them and made the easy corrections long since. For instance, a driver using the eastbound exit from I-84 onto Sunnyside Ave. has no way of knowing whether he is exiting into a one-way or a two-way thoroughfare. A person who assumes that he is still on a one-way

road can cause a serious accident. A simple sign at the intersection would eliminate this danger.
