\$100,000 Operation Statewide Siding Scheme Smashed by State Police

HARTFORD (AP) — A statewide aluminum siding scheme which reportedly bilked "poor credit" persons in several shore towns more than \$100,000 in the past year, was smashed by state police.

Major Samuel Rose, detective division commander, directed a nine-month probe which resulted in the arrest of Cy Manning, 38, of West Hartford, president of Casco Aluminum Co. Manning surrendered at state police headquarters after a bench warrant was issued by State's Attorney John D. LaBelle. He is free in \$1,000 bond pending presentation in Superior Court.

Manning was charged with obtaining money under false pretenses and submitting false credit applications.

The state police probe centered in the area of Groton, Ledyard and Old Saybrook, but other communities in the state are believed to be involved.

The scheme, police say, worked in this manner: A salesman would visit a homeowner and interest persons in aluminum siding. No sales would be made, but he would tell the homeowner that a regional salesman company would visit them.

Within days, Manning would visit the home and offer to cover the house with siding at inflated prices. The prices varied but some instances doubled the accepted market price for such a job.

Manning would then offer a cash reduction to the homeowner for every home in the neighborhood, regarded later as a result of the labor charge.

No overt formal transaction would be completed, but the

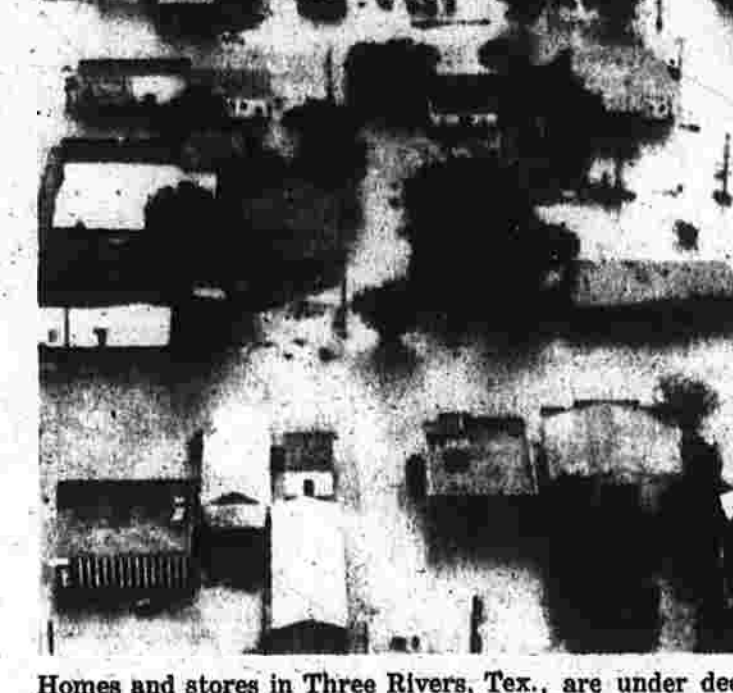
