





The Letters The official reply to charges over the

Ashmore-Bagg letter to Hanoi raises at east as much question as it answers. The controversy on the subject thus far has centered on whether Harry Ashmore and Bill Baggs, when they deivered a State Department letter to Ho Chi Minh, were being used as a primary or secondary avenue of communication between Washington and the North Viet-

What happened briefly is this. Ashmore and Bagg in interviewing Ho Chi Minh felt they detected a "deliberately conciliatory" attitude toward the United States. That information came to the attention of Senator J. W. Fulbright and through him to the President and the State Department.

As a result Assistant Secretary of State William Bundy drafted a letter and, at Bundy's request, Ashmore sent

At about the same time, presumably shortly afterward, the President also sent a letter to Ho, this one through Moscow channels.

These events took place in February, but the letters became public later, the Moscow letter in March when Ho issued a sharp reply, the Ashmore letter recently when Ashmore leveled charges against the President.

The charges were that the President had "effectively and brutally" negated the effect of the Ashmore letter by ending another which was tougher. Bundy's answer to the charges holds that the Ashmore errand was a "sub-

sidiary" effort to the Moscow exchange which was in process and that there were no inconsistencies in the messages. This does not explain why there was no effort, after the President's Moscow message became public, to let Ashmore know about the role his message was
