Los Angeles Times Told It Violated Merger Law

LOS ANGELES (AP) — The Times Mirror Co. has two months to appeal a federal court ruling that it divest itself of the San Bernardino Morning Sun and Evening Telegram, purchased in June 1964.

U.S. Dist. Judge Warren J. Ferguson, in a 36-page opinion, said Wednesday the Times Mirror acquisition violated the Clayton Antitrust Act.

"Evidence discloses the market has now been closed tight and no publisher will risk the expense of unilaterally starting a new daily newspaper" in San Bernardino, Ferguson said.

The government also sought to bar Times Mirror, publisher of the Los Angeles Times, from buying any newspaper in California, but Ferguson declined to issue an injunction.

The Times Mirror Co. earlier said it would appeal an adverse decision to the U.S. Supreme Court if necessary.

The Los Angeles Times has five suburban sections distributed with its regular editions. These suburban sections carry local news of the area in which they are distributed and carry advertising at lower rates than the main edition.

Want Hess Freed
WASHINGTON (AP) — The American and British members of the International War Crimes Tribunal which in 1946 sentenced Rudolf Hess to life imprisonment agreed the sentence No. 2 Nazi should be freed.

The defendants, the presiding Francis Biddle, former U.S. Attorney General, told the Associated Press he and British Lord Oakley, the presiding member of the tribunal which conducted war crimes trials in Nuremberg, Germany, believe the sentence should be rescinded.

In order for Hess to be released from Spandau Prison in West Berlin all four nations which composed the tribunal would have to agree. The others are France and the Soviet Union.

Hebron PZC Approves Zone Change To Allow Recreation Area

The Planning and Zoning Commission has approved the proposed addition to the regulations which will permit the Zoning Board of Appeals to permit a national non-profit organization to erect private recreational facilities in Hebron. The regulations will become effective Saturday.

The independent order of Odd Fellows has been considering the purchase of land on Old Colchester Rd. adjacent to Town Refuse Area to erect a recreational area. Several members were at the hearing on Wednesday and indicated that, if approved, the group planned to make application immediately.

Following application, a public hearing would be scheduled giving local residents an opportunity to express their opinion. The facility, according to the regulations, must be owned and operated as a private recreational area and not be opened to the public. No merchandise and will not be a division of profits.

The site must contain 100 contiguous acres with a maximum of 50 campsites allowed with a maximum period of two weeks camping per year by any party. Other regulations concerning dormitories and sanitary facilities are included.

The commission viewed preliminary plans for a three-lot subdivision on Kinney Rd. which were presented by Robert Tupper. The commission has set a public hearing for Oct. 24.

Deny NATO Log

WASHINGTON (AP) — The United States, the Pentagon says, "is fully able to meet its timing commitments for reinforcement of NATO forces" and will not be a division of profits.

The report, published in the New York Times, contended the war in Vietnam has drained away the troops needed to meet the United States to meet its military obligations to NATO.

Despite the Vietnam buildup, the United States maintains five strategic reserve Army divisions on the U.S. mainland for emergency use elsewhere in the world.

Seek A-Blast
WASHINGTON (AP) — The Kennecott Copper Corp. has asked the Atomic Energy Commission to set off an underground nuclear blast to test its effectiveness in copper mining.

The company, which would cost about \$13 million, would fracture a low grade copper ore deposit owned by Kennecott near Safford, Ariz.

The AEC says the proposal is based on a study indicating the nuclear fracturing technique could lead to recovery of copper which previously could not be produced economically. After the blast the copper would be recovered by washing it from the ore in place.

As Bolton Debates Its Concern

The town of Bolton has begun discussion of the possibility that it might make its symbolic contribution to "Project Concern" by finding room in its school system for a few children from the North End of Hartford, perhaps room with Bolton families for some of these children to stay during the school week.

This is Bolton's business, not Manchester's. All we in Manchester can do is point out that we had our own period of wrestling with this issue, that we brought to our controversy many variations of sentiment and instinct and analysis, but much good conscience on both sides of the issue, and that we resolved the issue positively after discussion and debate which were, in the main, a credit to the functioning of a free and responsible society.

After our decision to participate in Project Concern, there has been a division of result. There has, on the positive side, been whatever touch of good that has been done by the daily interchange between two communities, the one our own suburban white, the other the North End of Hartford. But there has, on the negative side, been a lingering and sometimes venomous backlash, in which those who were closest to the extremist fringes on the issue have sought to perpetuate the quarrel and give it side entrance into many other phases of Manchester public policy.

But, even though the attainment of a decision in Manchester, which now finds the children of Project Concern in their second year in our schools, has left division behind it, both camps of Manchester thought and policy had almost one common thought this summer when there were flares of trouble in the North End of Hartford. Both Manchester camps wondered, from their different points of view, whether or not there had been any relationship between Project Concern and this summer's events in Hartford. Both schools of Manchester opinion wondered whether the busting of any relationship between the two would be in some way a good thing.

The down-grade judgment of those who had opposed bulging more probably was that the evidence now seemed to be, did it not, that things like busting did no good, and that North Hartford's conduct this summer proved it.

But neither camp could be sure. Neither could escape wondering. There is, of course, no absolute proof one way or another in such matters of sociological chemistry.

But it seems to us that, with our American words threatening to fall in on us all, it is somehow better to think of reasons for debating possibilities of doing something, and somehow better to try to do some small concrete thing, too, if a community can so decide, than it is to think of all the readily available reasons for ignoring what may indeed be a somewhat neglected opportunity of responsibility for one's community.

We honor those in Bolton who have precipitated public discussion of the possibility there is something Bolton could and should do. We hope Bolton's debate of this possibility can proceed with results as positive as those in Manchester. For, although there were bitterness and wounds in the Manchester process, not all ever healed, and some festering still, the overall result was that Manchester, soul-searching as never before, did find some absolute proof and did stand and act, in its own modest and troubled way, to provide some small share of an answer to the greatest waste problem this nation has ever had to face.

Who Isn't Fractured?
 With the Senate speech of Senator Hugh Scott of Pennsylvania, the fracturing of the Republican party on the issue of Vietnam becomes well-nigh complete.
 As Senator Case of New Jersey, himself a rather voluble character on the Vietnam issue observed, when Scott's defense of President Johnson's conduct

of the war followed Senator Thurston Morton's attack on it.
 "First we had a former national committee chairman speaking as a dove, now we have another former national committee chairman speaking as a hawk."
 "I am no hawk," Senator Scott replied. "I just don't want to be a pigeon."
 Neither, for that matter, is Senator Morton any real dove. He rests his position on the admission that he is a hawk who nevertheless has sense enough to see that the strategy of the hawk has failed.

But from Scott to Morton to Romney to Reagan to Percy to Tower to Kuchel to Aiken to Dirksen the Republican situation has one consistency—its internal division. The Republican party is a house of so many Vietnam views there is some validity to the Democratic charge that Republicans are willing to run toward any view which will win the 1968 election for them.

This is a relatively new development on the political scene—this present proliferation of differing views among the Republicans. But the biggest reason why this gets such a warm welcome from the Democrats is that they themselves have been exhibiting, for many months, a party division even more surprising and serious than that of the Republicans. For the Democrats are afraid they know who their candidate for President will be, and they are going to have to be, and they have therefore, a certain political compulsion to try to keep themselves capable of supporting him with a straight face. From Morse and Gruening to McGovern to Kennedy to Mansfield to Fulbright to Ribicoff to Stennis is a division camp and much the more shocking, from the political point of view.

The truth is the war in Vietnam has succeeded in shattering both political parties.
 This gives them small license to taunt one another, and it gives any of the rest of us a small license to taunt the two of them. For most of us, if we really look inside ourselves, find the war has fractured our own thinking and feeling, too.

Attlee Made History Too

As Winston Churchill symbolized the greatness and courage and glamor of leadership which gave Britain glory and empire, so Clement Attlee was almost a cartoon version of the mild but dogged little man who, through the centuries, did the essential work and most of the dying for the empire builders.

Only when Churchill and Attlee flourished in the same span of historical time, the great game of glory had just about played itself out, and the mild, dogged little fellow had finally made up his mind to swap in some of the glory and some of the empire for a little living of his own.

So it was that, almost the moment Churchill had so gloriously preserved the empire, and not, he himself proclaimed, merely in order to prevent over the world, Attlee was able to use the political process to snatch everything which the glory of the victory away from Churchill, and start sharing and dispensing the freedom, the privilege, the comfort, the dignity that victory had protected. He dispensed it to the colonial peoples abroad and to the colored children at home as if they were suddenly rulers, and such, to their imperfect talents, they suddenly were.

One has to give Churchill his credit. He would have led the British people to his victory even had he known, for sure, they were to turn from him to Attlee and Attlee's untraditional purpose the moment the victory had been won.

And one has to give Attlee his credit. Where Churchill served his King, Attlee served the ordinary Britisher, and the sometimes insignificant little fellow who had previously, existed merely to serve and cheer the Churchill of history, but without whose snake against a rock and when the lad stooped to pick up a stone the reptile bit him on the palm of his right hand.

SAIGON—Top U.S. officials here are moving hard toward a basic policy position on negotiations to end the war that flatly contradicts the official line in Washington.

But

A major part of the negotiations mania in Washington is the hope that somehow the National Liberation Front of South Vietnam can be broken up and divided and that "southern elements" in the front, alleged to be jealous of Northern influence, will make a bid for negotiations with Saigon.

Connecticut Yankee

Again, although we are something of a slowpoke ourselves for the first 60 miles or so of any journey, we never found ourselves really passionate about the rights of some gentle and timid elderly individuals to travel as slowly as they please until we first began to notice the actual signs on the road.

Before that hearing last winter there was only one emotion we ever had regarding motor cycle riders. That was to wish them off the highways forever.
