accused of membership in a leftist antigovernment organiza-tion that allegedly tried to over-throw the military dictatorship. The defendants, 18 to 30 years old, were charged with attempt-ing to overthrow the govern-ment through violence, disobeying military orders, printing and distributing antigovernment eaflets and setting off homemade bombs.
Four of the group, accused of being its leaders, could be sen-tenced to death under a 1947 emergency act aimed at sup-pressing the Communist guerril-ia war. The others could get jail terms of one to nine years. Among the defendants in the mass trial—the third of its kind since the army took over the country April 21—are university students, printers, laborers, two army conscripts and 12 girls. The indictment charged that most of the youths were mem bers of a pro-Communist youth movement that received orders from the outlawed Greek Communist party.
