Sheinwold on Bridge

DOUBTFUL DOUBLES ACT AS BOOMERANGS By ALFRED SHEINWOLD

When an opponent bids a suit that you suspect he doesn't really hold, you must often double to guide your partner to the right opening lead. Unfortunately, your partner may take that kind of double too seriously later on.

Opening lead—Nine of Clubs. When today's hand was played some years ago in an English tournament, East's final double of four spades was based partly on West's earlier double of two hearts. It may be illegal to judge the case after the Statute of limitations has run out, but it seems clear that West's double of two hearts was questionable and that East's double of four spades was foolhardy.

We can forgive the doubtful bidding because the play was so interesting. West led the nine of clubs, and the youthful John Collins won with the queen in all over the world set up and took notice of John Collins. A star had been born.

Partner opens with 1-NT (16 to 18 points), and the next play passes. You hold: Spades, 5-2; Hearts, K-J-10-8-7; Diamonds, J-4; Clubs, 8-5. What do you say?

Answer: Bid two hearts. You expect partner to pass, since your bid is a weak response. You should make more tricks at hearts than your partner would at notrump, but game is very unlikely at either denomination.

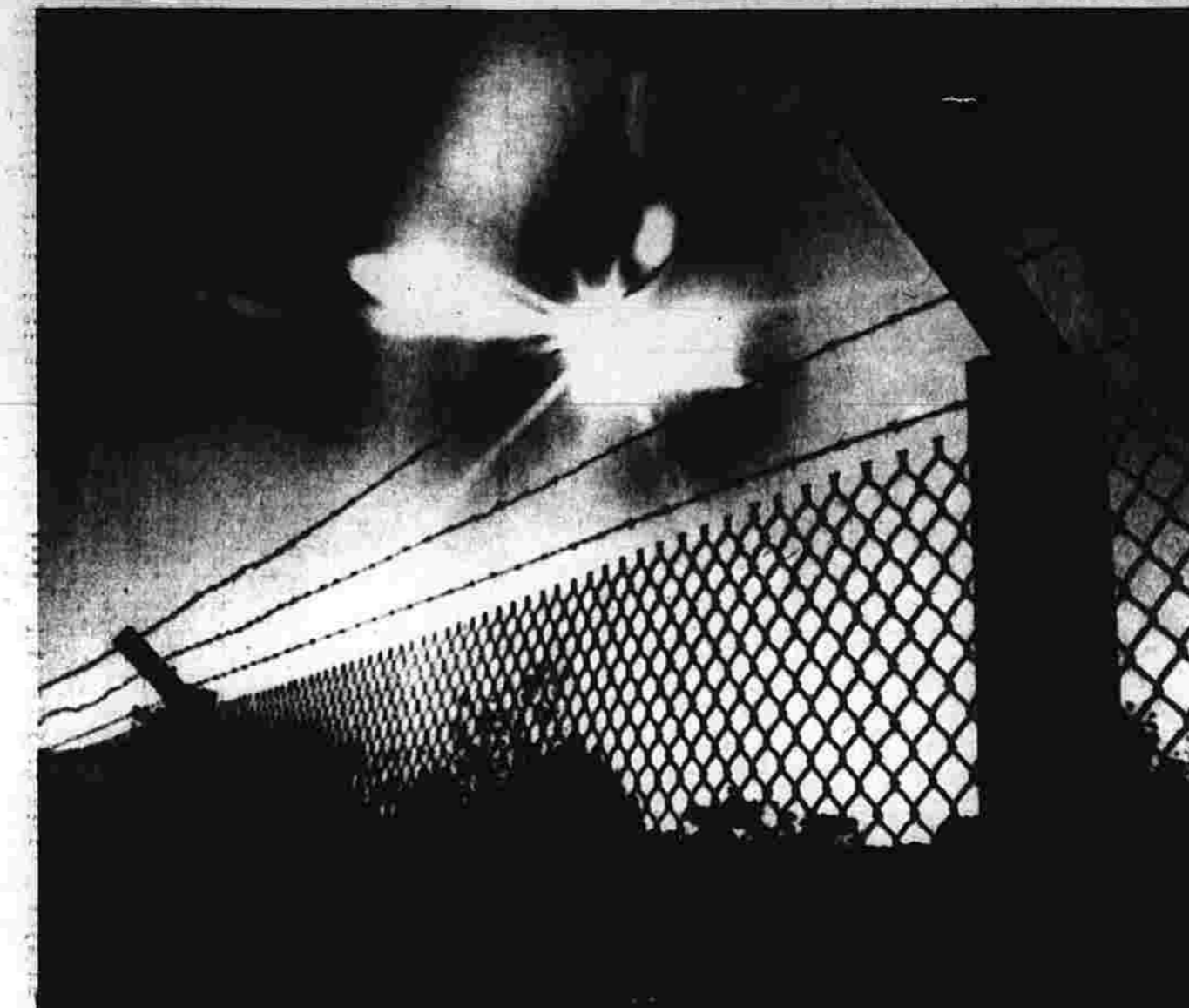
