SAIGON (AP) - Viet Cong mortarmen carried the attack on the Vietnamese district headquarters at Loc Ninh into the fourth day today but left the National Day parade in Saigon alone.

The 200-round barrage fired at one of the American battalions defending Loc Ninh wounded only one man. A total of 365 Communists have been reported killed in attempts this week to overrun the town 72 miles north of Saigon, apparently for a propaganda victory to take me bloom off the inauguration Allied casualties at Loc Ninh

Vice President Hubert H. Humphrey meanwhile inspected the demilitarized zone from a C118 transport that lumbered over the U.S. Marines' warscarred battlefront at an altitude of 1,500 feet. Hours before Humphrey's plane droned over the DMZ, Marine fighter-bombers attacked a suspected surface-to-air missile site just north of the zone, but Humphrey's plane was 1,500 feet below effective SAM range.

Humphrey also visited U.S. units at Da Nang and Chu Lai. The U.S. Command disclosed that 30 to 40 Viet Cong attacked an Army helicopter compound at Chu Lai Tuesday night to plant explosive charges, but the command said the attack apparently had no connection with the vice president's visit. 

WASHINGTON (AP) - Walter Reuther appears to be liqui-dating major financial interests in the AFL-CIO in preparation for pulling his 1.5 million-member United Auto Workers out of the labor federation, informed sources say. The AFL-CIO's Industrial Un-

on Department, Reuther's last remaining power base within the federation, is rapidly and deliberately spending itself out of money, it was reported.

Jack Conway, executive direc-tor of the Industrial Union De-partment, denied any such sig-nificance could be attached to the money problem, but con-firmed that more than \$1 mil-Hon has been spent out of cash eserves in the past 10 months. This was more than half the department's total cash.

"It's nothing serious," said Conway, adding that much of the money had been spent supporting organizing drives among teachers, farm workers Southern textile workers

and in helping other unions.





per's Bazaar.

Hollywood, however, was a bitter disapointment. Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer brought him to America in 1925 to work on a film called "Paris." They built an exact replica of Erte's studio in Monte Carlo for him to work in, then left him to cool his heels for a year. "I was given a fabulous salary

but no work to do," he explains 'However, I wasn't allowed to go out of town even for the weekend, for fear my services might be needed. In the end l gave up in disgust and went back to Paris." All that Hollywood did for Er-te was to add the title "Prince"

in front of his name. "I guess they thought I would sound more glamorous if I were Prince de Tirtoff," he says, laughingly. "In those days princes were a dime a dozen."

With the stock market crash of 1929, the demand for Erte's extravagant costume designs tapered off. As the breadlines lengthened, the Ziegfeld Follies folded. So did George White's Scandals. Erte turned his talents to designing for opera.



Certainly our modern schools did not fail to present these facts, too. Disease? This is also well known fact of life i backward countries and has always been a companion of war. What young man, or relatives of young men facing military service in Vietnam, does not know these facts? I would say only those who have an emotional reason for not facing them would may these are

Are we to have our "blood run cold" because of corruption of Vietnamese leaders? Because some citizens are not permitted to vote? (I intentionally wrote Vietnamese and I mean thereby South and North Vietnamese Well, remember they have not had the advantage of living 190 years under a constitution that ieclares all men are created equal nor under a governmen ounded on the Judaic-Christian moral concepts. Americans have, and yet until a very very few years ago some of our citizens could not vote because they did not meet local qualifications that voters be property owners. And this past summer, two well known legislators, a Connecticu senator and a New York conconduct, and all too often other instances of, at the least, unethical conduct on the part of government and law enforcemen personnel are uncovered. Certainly our American lapses of fairness and government morality have conditioned us, so that our blood can not run cold because of Vietnamese conditions. I am more disturbed because these facts are being used as a lever to upset Americans
about the "Vietnam situation".

We think of ourselves as the world's best example of a working democracy, vet our flaws and imperfections are legion. If we have been at it 200 years and o expect instant democracy from a peo-

The most fruitful nourishment of the young saplingthat has now been planted in such strange soil is going to demand extraordinary effort from both the South Vietnamese and ourselves. But it must be rated worth extraordinary effort because it is one of the few positive things we have going for us.

#### How To Breed Hawks?

Walt W. Rostow, the academic gentleman who, in his present capacity of special assistant to President Johnson, is considered the most powerful and influential hawk on the Washington scene, may once have been denied security clearance, back during the Elsenhower administration.
