





The Suspended License Driver

There is apparently nothing in the routine system of Connecticut justice which keeps such characters off the

A Tremendous Might-Have-Been

The dam which has now begun operating its first turbine for the generation of power is called the Aswan Dam, and the body of water it impounds is called Lake Nasser, and of the two immense calendars outside the work section containing the schedule of operations for the dam one is in Egyptian and the other in Russian.

But the whole project also might be called the world's biggest "Might Have Been" for this good thing for the future living of the fellahin of the Nile Valley could have had the stamp of American engineering, financing, and equipment on it, conceivably in a Near East more peaceful and stable than the Near East of this 1967.

What the story of the Near East might have been if, back in 1956, Secretary of State John Foster Dulles hadn't considered it a good, effective idea to punish Nasser for not buying American arms exclusively, and punish him by turning down his application for assistance with this Aswan Dam project, is something no one can say with certainty.

But, in the surface reading of the history of our times, it was the Dulles attempted use of the dollar whip on Nasser which led Nasser to retaliate by nationalizing the Suez Canal, which was what led Britain and France to conspire with Israel to use military means to blast Nasser out of power in the fall

That, even though some elements in the west, like the 1956 United Nations diplomacy of Canada and the United States itself, came to Nasser's rescue, determined rather forcefully which world camp Nasser was going to gravitate toward. And the net result of the Dulles decisions with regard to Egypt and Nasser and Aswan has been to disassociate the United States from what might well have been its natural association and cooperation with what still has to be a revolution in Egypt, while throwing Egyptian foreign policy over to a recklessness which has been ruinous for Egypt and pleasing only-and

not very pleasing even there, considering its ineptness and failure—to Russia Surely, then, this is one of our time's greatest might-have-beens, the might have been of what might have happened if Mr. Dulles had visualized the Aswan Dam as something the United States had a chance to help create for the people of Egypt, not an implement of compulsion upon their particular lead er of the moment.

Let's Not Be Children

The alienation of the Johnson Admin istration from the American people who have undergone a tidal change of opinion against the Vietnam war, was never more sharply expressed than in Secretary Rusk's vehement press conference last week. With the desperation of a man clinging to a sinking dogma, Mr. Rusk set forth his familiar and increasingly unconvincing rationale for the war, and contemptuously flung out at all who disagree with him by crying. "Let's not be children!" The American majority which has

now beyond doubt swung against the Rusk doctrine will not, we suspect, take kindly to being dismissed with a schoolmasterish charge of infantilism. If it is childish to question Mr. Rusk's obsession with a Chinese menace which only he perceives, and to doubt that America's vital security interests demand our fighting an Asian war which the South-Vietnamese themselves will not fight then a great and growing number of Americans are consigned to something less than the mature wisdom which Mr. tuck claims for himself.

Dissenters from his policy, Mr. Rusk said, put the nation in "mortal danger" and risk a "catastrophe for mankind" by placing in question the credibility of American "commitments" under the outheast Asia treaty. The people are entitled to ask what has become of the commitment made to them by President Johnson when he sought election in 1964 on a peace platform directly contrary to the Vietnam policy he has followed since. The "pledged word" cited by Mr. Rusk as justification for endless involvement in an Asian land war conflicts with the pledged word of Mr. Johnson not to send Americans to fight Asians' battles. Which promise is the more im-

But it is, of course, untrue to say that half a million troops and a vast air-naval armada are in Vietnam to carry out a solemn national commitment. There never was a commitment either by President Eisenhower or President Kennedy, to make the civil war in Vietnam our own, and both of their administrations refrained from doing so. President Johnson is exclusively responsible for converting a program of aid and advice into a unilateral war. The Southeast Asia treaty did not remire such escalation. By undertaking inilaterally we violated our most solemn commitments under the United Na-

If Mr. Rusk is right in saying we must wage a war like this in order to sustain world faith in our treaty commitments, then it follows that we have an inescapable obligation to fight other people's wars for them in every quarter of the globe. He is preaching a doctrine of unlimited military intervention under which America sets itself up as judge and jury of every revolution, every border dispute, every national conflict, and undertakes to decide them

with its own power.

The American people are rebeling against this doctrine. They do not find credible any longer Mr. Rusk's claims that we are fighting in Vietnam to protect a vital national interest in blocking the expansion of Chinese Communism It is clearly not China we are fighting, or Communism either, but rather ndigenous nationalism determined to throw off the remnants of colonial rule which offers a far stronger barrier to Chinese expansion than a puppet government supported by permanent American military occupation. And it is permanent American occupation, let there be no doubt about it, which Mr. Rusk

s advocating. If our national interest n Vietnam is as vital as he claims, we could not afford to entrust it to a Saigon government which would not survive two weeks without our support. An honorable alternative to endless war does exist, and more and more

Americans are coming to insist upon it. We have a feeling that if this Administration cannot find the wit or will to work its way out of the Vietnam morass, the American people-or "children" if Mr. Rusk prefers that wordwill elect an administration which can. The American people do not demand precipitate and reckless withdrawal

from Vietnam, though more and more of them, are beginning to tolerate even that idea. This newspaper does not favor such withdrawal. We are convinced however, that a peaceful settlement could be obtained, on the basis of the Geneva agreements, if the United States adopted negotiable objectives and step-ped down the war instead of steadily stepping it up.
Mr. Rusk insists he is ready to nego-

tiate, that only Hanoi is unwilling. What he is ready to negotiate, however, is Hanoi's surrender — the abandonment of the Viet Cong by North Vietnam, thus leaving the field clear for the Saigon re-gime backed by our then unchallenged military power.

It is no mystery that Hanoi refuses

to negotiate on these terms under the midation of aerial bombardmen But there is every reason to believe that Hanoi would negotiate a compromis settlement which game the Viet Cong a place in the country's political future commensurate with the strength, which contemplated the ultimate withdrawal of all foreign troops and settlement of their political differences by the South Vietnamese people themselves—if these ever became America's objective.—ST.
