Let The Pause, If Any, Be Final The news is beginning to speculate o prospects for another Christmas holiday ombing pause in Vietnam. It is difficult to resist the appeal of any cessation in the killing-and especially the appeal of a cessation which is timed to coincide with the Christian

world's annual observence of the birth of the Prince of Peace. Nevertheless, there are also powerful reasons for opposing any shallow and temporary cease fire such as we have had in the past two years. In 1965, the first year of our full military activity in Vietnam, the Christmas

holiday cease fire was valuable to us, because we had a supply-handling problem at Saigon, and could use the holiday respite to break a logjam in docking and transport of war materials. Last year, we were more reluctant to grant the holiday truce, since we had solved our own supply problems by that time. When we were forced into observance of the holidays by the weight of custom, we remembered how we had employed the truce the year before, and we spread the word, this time, about how the enemy was using the truce to

move his supplies to his front. In neither truce, however, was there any real possibility of any move toward negotiation and peace in Vietnam. The much publicized "peace offensive" President Johnson launched on the spur of a moment from his ranch in Texas in the first holiday truce was purely a propaganda phony. Last year, in the final holiday truce, President Johnson hurriedly resumed the bombing before Hanoi had a chance to reply to his own peace gesture of that season. No one uarantee what Hanoi would have done, in either year, had the American policy really offered any possibility of authentic negotiation. What was clear enough, even from our own side of the picture, was that President Johnson was not ready, in either year, to offer Ha-

noi anything more than a chance to sur-Now, although the sentiment and meaning of the Christmas season will again make it seem worth while if all that happens is that the killing itself halts for a few days, what nobody really wants is another period of false notioning and false hope about peace. Ideally, the next time our bombing nalts it should halt for good, which would be a real testimonial as to the depth of the religious content in our national life, and which, on the pragmatic side, would let the war nobody seems able to win begin to shrink and dwindle inside its own stalemate. If only the national leadership which talks so much about courage had the combined sense and courage to proclaim that we have reached a stalemate which serves our objective of denying success to the opponents of the govern ment we sponsor in Saigon, and that, henceforth, we will be content to hold that stalemate for as long as necessary the insoluble problem could perhaps be solved, after all.

But we would choose to be spared the sanctimony of any lesser holiday compliance with the principles of humanity.

The higher than expected attendance caused financial loss at Expo because it necessitated an unplanned expansion of staff and of both transport and restaurant facilities in the effort to handle the crowds. Aside from that, it had some normal fair troubles. Construction costs proved greater than originally estimated. The management was hit by a transit strike.

But the main explanation of the Expo deficit, which may hit \$250,000,000 was the creditable one. Somehow, the planners and executors of Expo achieved s combination of good taste and interest which made Robert Moses'- affair look like a honky-tonk. We don't like to think this is just the difference between the Canadian and the United States ways of life, or standards of taste, for we cling to the supposition we two neighboring peoples are really not very different from one another. Let's leave i at this: that Canada wins the competition in fairs, by a few hundred miles.

The Permissive Society

If "the permissive society," as the phrase is now used, has a manifesto John Dewey's "The School and Society," published in 1899, is it. And the Teachrs College of Columbia University was its seedhead.

against traditional education before Dewey, notably Horace Mann, who died in 1859, the year Dewey was born. But the turn of the century heard the first piping cries of "progressive educa-tion," so called, and its midwife was Dewey. By the late 1930s, the word 'permissive" had come into American English bearing a special meaning. I was pronounced in a low, proud tone by Dalton and other progressive teachers it was an invocation that banished slavery from education and promised enlightenment, spontaneity, the "identification" of the child with his studies in a new and passionate way. It implied that the three Rs, parrot teaching, learning dates, getting poetry by rote, boning up on Euclid or the battle of Austerlitz had been exposed as the symptoms of an authoritarian system. God said, "Let Dewey be!" and there

From then on happy pupils would bound like kangaroos to schools where "expression" (expressed with astounding and illiterate verbosity) was encouraged; where handicraft gave way t rubbing the soul in "textures," and the study of historical periods was sup planted by trips into the Fenimore Cooper country to bring home to the budding New Yorker the very touch and smell of the life of the Algonquin Indians. To be truthful, I have known such children who really did leave school with a vivid and accurate knowl edge of he way the earliest inhabitans of Manhatan lived and ordered society even if they had never heard of the Bill of Rights, a hanging participle, or the

Of course, it is easy now to mock the later absurdities of progressive education, which came under brutal attack in the early 1950s, so much so that rednecks from Louisiana to Southern Cali fornia egged on by the late Senator Joseph McCarthy, howled for a return to the rod and the little red schoolhouse. But progressive education had already done its duty, or its mischlef, and not in the private schools either. Its reforming course had so changed the elementary schools that many a McCarthy-

Thirty Years' War.

ite, screaming for the blood of the progressives, was unaware that his own strong belief in unit teaching, school projecs, individual attention, and compulsory courses in a life science and civics had come from nowhere but Columbia and nobody but Dewey. The Progressive Education Association ounded as a standard bearer in 1915, had done its work so well that it was dissolved in 1955.

This stress on the origins of permissive learning and teaching is worth making because, outside the United states certainly, so many bewilderd parents, conservatives, and reactionaries, talk as if the permissive society had sprung up spontaneously on a signal out of Milibrook, N. Y., from Doctor y Leary under the influence.

I am not, on the contrary, saying tha t all goes back in an orderly and sinister fashion to John Dewey, or to Marx, or Freud, though much that now passes for individual expression, freedom, and constitutional rights derives from mass misinterpretation of all three. But the actual vehemence and universality of the beatnik, hippy, teeny-boppe acid-head revolution is harder to explain. It cannot be said to be a revolt against authority, for authority has been crumbling in all Western societies, as it has been stiffening in Communist coun-

tries, since the First World War. But it is, I take it, the free-wheeling young we are talking about. Who are hippies? Lamentably little scientific work has been done on their genes and their social history, though a limited New York psychiatric study asserts that as many as 60 per cent are seriously sick, mostly with schizophrenia But we do know that they tend to come from better rather than worse educated families, that their parents are rarely mpoverished but have a high incidence either of divorce or of rigid morality (perhaps a sure sign of Freud's revolutionary discovery that in the uncon-

scious, opposites are the same. We know also that the children of Catholics and religious Jews are very much in the minority among the new rebels. And-a saving statistic — that hippies and their vagabond variations account for less than 10 per cent of the young. Drug addication, however, widely overlaps the "squares." Nor are hippie-

dom, sexual licence, the flower phenomenon, merely indigenous to metropolises that have always tolerated a Bohemian quarter. Of course, they flourish there in most conspicuous anonymity. The provincial strictness of the Old South and the farming Midwest covers up, for the time being, the more outlandish forms of hippiedom. But their children too are off to the cities; and cities across the whole continen have their proportionate quota. The draft card burners know no geographi-

bulating journalist should try to solve, is how it comes about that the rebel young appear in East Berlin and East St. Louis in the same international un form, that they profess the same halfbaked "philosophies" and rustle as thdistinguishable as cockroaches over three of four continents.

The mass media take the time for everything these days. And until a better theory comes along, it will have to do to say why the children of Nigeria have forgotten their native songs and echoed the Beatles; why a sit-down in the London School of Economics is inspired by the same types (and the same ringleaders?) as organised the shensnigans at Berkeley. We can be sure of only one thing: That he who runs no longer has to read.
