There still seems not the slightest chance that any due process of law will consent to try to judge, while the undeclared war in Vietnam Itself is still gong on, whether any Americans who hink the war is illegal and criminal have the right to claim the so-called Nuremberg defense for their refusal to participate in it. toubled itself, the other day, when Justice Potter Stewart, a conservative member of the United States Supreme Court, joined Justice William Douglas, iberal, in the contention that three tences for refusal to serve in Vietnam should be entitled to have their claims The background is that the victorious illies at Nuremberg set up new laws defining war crimes and then proceeded to convict and execute or imprison numbers of Nazi "war criminals." It was laid down at Nuremberg that the individual had a responsibility not to obey his national leadership if he became convinced it was preparing for

war or making war in criminal fashion. So numerous young Americans protesting against the war in Vietnam have advanced the claim that their refusal to serve there represents their refusal to break the law established at Nurem-

sistently refused even to entertain such a claim. On previous appeals to the Supreme Court, only Justice Douglas took the position that the point ought to be faced and settled. Now Justice Potter has joined him in that position. Neither Justice Douglas nor Justice Potter argues what the eventual verdict should valid questioning to deserve an honest

Higher Education In Connecticut The boom in college education, which has been the point of much discussion in recent years, has definitely arrived in Connecticut. Full-time undergraduate nrollment in all colleges jumped from 35,000 in 1963 to 51,000 in 1966. It is estimated that students will number more than 100,000 by 1975.

It is likely that Connecticut will do its utmost to accommodate nearly all of those who are qualified. Czars Gave Charm to Moscow

set is a thrilling site stop a bluff over-coking Moscow. The charm of Moscow comes from its remnants of the Czarist era, not only the cathedrals and other public buildings but the private houses look as if Anna Karenina might step out in tippet and muff, all with an ocratic restraint in decoration.

In a museum inside the Kremlin are lisplayed the most elaborate relics of the Czars, carriages and clothes and tableware and picture frames, with diamonds and pearls used as casually as confetti, perhaps the most extravagant display in history. One can see that a country where a few people had so much, and all the rest had nothing, was ripe for revolution. And the chance for propaganda is not passed up; for instance, the guide, when showing the jeweled caparisons for the royal horses, tells you that in one year 100,000 rubles were spent on the royal stables and only 40,000 for education.

It interested us all that when the Russians spoke of Sunday, they referred to "our day of rest." to forestall any notion that Sunday might have a reli-gious significance. Yet there are signs of active religion. Not in the major cathedrals of Moscow, those around the Kremlin. St. Basil's is a museum, a strange place because there is no main church, only a series of small chapels which lead into one another with such superb illogic that I feared being lost forever. To describe its wall decoration there is only one word, "psychedelic." The walls of the small rooms seem to claw at you with the oversized paint-

and giant flowers reminiscent of Pennsylvania Dutch art.

Our sightseeing trip took us to a con-

vent, and we entered a gate into a wall-enclosed area full of small buildings in a romantic style, trees, winding walks, and gravestones, with a beautiful atmosphere of peace and tranquility. It was Sunday. Some elderly women were walking along the paths, and suddenly there was the sound of church bells very near. The women crossed themselves. Going farther into the convent area, I heard singing, and realized that in one of the buildings a church service was being held. Entering the vestibule, I smelled the fragrance of wax candles, and I saw that the congregation was so large it had spilled into this outer foyer. I could not linger, for the bus was waiting, and I could never have found my way around Moscow alone. But some Americans who had attended a church service that day told me that it also was crowded, and not only with old women, but they had seen men and

young people. Moscow has 52 churches, the guide said, a tiny sum for a population of 6,500,000. In Samarkand I had seen not only a mosque that is still operating but a Moslem theological seminary that still has students, though none were in evidence on my visit. They were all out picking cotton, said my guide. One of the interesting sights of that part of Russia was a long line of buses, 90 of them. and students with blankets under their arms who were going to the cooperative
