

HARTFORD (AP) - Connecticut residents worried about the possibility that they might not be able to collect on their insurance policies because of an insurance company bankruptcy were reassured today by the state insurance commission. "If Connecticut people have nsurance with a company licensed by the State of Connecticut, they need have no fears,"

prompted by inquiries from peoamong companies in other states which specialized in insuring high-risk drivers. "We take extra pride that the Connecticut (Insurance) Department's standards for solvency are among the highest in the country," Cotter said. In addition to setting high standards for companies seek ing a license to do business in nnecticut Cotter said his de partment also keeps close watch on the financial position of each company already doing business

It is on Okinawa that the place now known as Suicide Cliff is located. It won ts name when, after three months of fighting which began with the American anding on Easter Sunday, 1945, the ommander of the Japanese troops, and many of his troops with him, leaped to their death rather than go through with the disgrace of surrender.

Okinawa also is the site for the Japanese Memorial to the Unknown Dead. And it is the location of the Cave of the Virgins, where 158 Japanese nurses killed themselves, in 1945, rather than

These facts about Okinawa are more important today than they used to be, because something perhaps ominous but certainly inevitable has begun to happen back on the Japanese mainland. What is happening back on the mainland is a revival of Japanese nationalism. One of the first things this nationalism does when it finds itself alive and breathing again is to break the long 20 year public silence about the war, and then to begin looking for ways to reassert old Japanese traditions and glories and dig-

Book Review

Science is Not Enough By Vennevar Bush.

As most readers are aware.

Bush is an elder statesman in the fields of science and tech-nology. His collection of essays is a caim, measured, sometimes even meditative examination of how contemporary man should make allowances for more than science and materialism. He is like a wise and friendly uncle, and he writes with admirable

simplicity.

His opening essay on science argues that it has its limits, beyond which is faith. He finds it

yond which is faith. He finds it regrettable that "gentleman" and "culture" are suspicious words today. He reminds us that management is an art, not a science. He is not too perturbed over predictions by "the prophets of doom" about the supposed future horrors of automation and cybernetics.

A major contributor himself to the development of the computer, he has a little fun kidding about its limitations. He makes some observations about a war on poverty, and while he approves of a welfare state that protects its citisens. He believes that the preservation of opportunity is more important than the elimination of material need.

Some readers may disagree with his viewpoints and opinions. But Bush is a reasoning and reasonable man, and does not stick to dogma. He is content to stimulate the reader's thoughts about "the reason for living."

Bulgaria Goes All Out To Attract Tourists

SOFIA, Bulgaria (AP) — The European Hedgehog paved the way for Bulgaria's tourist industry more than a decade ago. Since then tourism has bulged into a business that relies on almost everything from boar hunting to nude bathing to attract western visitors. "capitalist" travelers are Turks working in West Germany, who cross Bulgaria only in transit back to their homes. And other "tourists" include East Germans, who arrange a holiday in Bulgaria with the intention of bolting to the West by 'going East across the Turkish border. Dozens are caught by Bulgarian border guards each day and tract western visitors.

This year, Bulgaria went even one step further than its Communist allies in the attempt to push the tourist dollar revenue: it abolished visa requirements for all private travelers. Officially, this action is limited to 1967, the International Tourist Year. But an indefinite extension is likely, since tourism is a vital source of funds for the country's bold industrialization program.
