California Surprises Everybody On balance, even considering the personal charm Shirley Temple Black might have brought to the House at Washington, the news from California's 11th Congressional District can be considered healthy.

For one thing, California voters demonstrated that they are not, after all, irrevocably bound into a pattern of electing every Hollywood figure who runs for high office. There is absolutely no reason to bar the acting profession from full eligibility for a transfer of its talents to the political field. But there is no reason, either, to concede it automatic success in that field when it brings with it nothing demonstrably more solid than its acting ability.

When, as a nominee Shirley Temple Black cast about for something more than her own childhood talent to contribute to the campaign, she reached for a position on Vietnam which, however sincere it may have been with her, sounded cruelly glib and contrived from her pretty lips. It was a natural part of this hawk-like position that her campaign should include the distribution of literature reflecting on the patriotism of opponents less hawk-like than she. Toward the end of the campaign she began to seem to have second thoughts in such matters. Perhaps,-we hope so at any rate-this was what she had in said "this was my first race and now know how the game is played."

There was a fatal difference between the way Shirley Temple used to win victories at the Khyber Pass or in the Civil War and her formula for success in

As for Paul N. McCloskey, the Korean war veteran who scored such a lecisive victory over Mrs. Black for the tepublican nomination, his position on Vietnam — one of advocating that we stand ready for negotiation which could lead to a gradual disengagement of our forces from Vietnam - is probably a position shaped much closer to an American consensus today than the referendum question for "immediate" withdrawal which was voted against, two to one, in San Francisco on Nov. 7.
